### **Admin/Biographical History:**

In an article entitled 'Irish Astrologers' in the Dublin Quarterly Journal of Medical Science (Vol IV Aug-Dec 1847), Isaac Butler (1689-1755) was described as 'surgeon, astronomer, almanac maker and botanist'. He was also interested in archaeology. He succeeded John Whalley in his business as almanac maker. Between 1740 and 1750, Dr John Rutty and the Medico-Philosophical and the Physico-Historical Societies employed Butler to research rare plants and gather botanical specimens. Dr Rutty was working on publications of natural history. Butler's remit was County Dublin and this was then extended out to Meath, Westmeath, Louth, and Longford. He later carried out similar work in Cork, Tipperary, Wexford, and Wicklow. Butler was also selected by the Dean and Chapter to write a history of the Cathedral of St Patrick. His name frequently occurs in the minutes of the Physico-Historical Society, which are preserved among the MSS of the Royal Irish Academy.

Dr John Rutty (1697-1775), a physician and naturalist, was the author of many texts including 'A methodical synopsis of the Mineral Waters of Ireland' (1757) and 'A Natural History of the County of Dublin' (1772).

John Ribton Garstin (1836-1917) who compiled the notes in this collection was an archaeologist and antiquarian expert. He was a member of the Royal Irish Academy, the Royal Dublin Society, the Royal Society of Antiquaries of Ireland, and vice-president of the County Louth Archaeological Society.

**Archival history:** The extracts were made by Mr J Deane, assistant librarian in Armagh Library, where the original MS is preserved, for the County Louth Archaeological Society who published a copy in their Journal of Dec 1922 (Vol. 5, No. 2, pp. 93-108). The notes were produced by John Ribton Garstin (1836-1917). County Louth Archaeological & Historical Society deposited the collection in Louth County Archives Service in 2001.

**Scope and Content:** Manuscript extracts from Isaac Butler's Journal, 1744, being the portion relating to County Louth and notes on the journal made by John Ribton Garstin (1836-1917). Also includes two letters from Patrick Traynor, bookseller, Dublin, and J Deane, assistant librarian, Armagh.

**Subject index:** Abbeys; Butler, Isaac (1689-1755); Deane, J, assistant librarian (Armagh Library); Dolan, Joseph, vice-president of the County Louth Archaeological Society; Fore (County Westmeath); Garstin, John Ribton (1836-1917); Louth; Ruddy, Dr John (1697-1775); Traynor, Patrick, bookseller, Dublin.

Handwritten letter from Patrick Traynor, new & old bookseller, 29 & 30 Essex Quay, Dublin to Major General Stubbs, Dromeskin (Dromiskin), Co Louth regarding his unsuccessful search to find information on Isaac Butler or his work. He surmises that his work was probably only written in 'manuscript' and for the series of works published by the Dublin Physico-Historical Society. He suggests that the Royal Irish Academy or the library of the Royal Dublin Society may know something about the MS.

Document briefly describing Isaac Butler's journal of his journey from Dublin to Lough Derg through Meath, Cavan and Fermanagh, made approximately 1745. It briefly compares this journal to his previous journal of 1744 held in Armagh Library.

Manuscript extracts from Isaac Butler's Journal, 1744, being the portion relating to County Louth, transcribed from the original MS preserved in Armagh Library by Mr J Deane, assistant librarian. The Journal of Isaac Butler is an account of the tour made in 1744 through North Dublin, Meath, Louth, and other counties. The account describes the country and records inscriptions in churches visited. A copy of these extracts was published in the Journal of the County Louth Archaeological Society, Vol. 5, No. 2 (Dec., 1922), pp. 93-108.

The extracts include notes on Julianstown (p12), St Peter's Drogheda (p13-16), Millmount Drogheda (p16-17), 'Dullagh' (Tullyallen), Mellifont, Cullein Moore (Collon) (all p25), Melicks Town (Millockstown), Ardee, Derrycama (all p26), Ardpatrick, Louth, (all p27), Knock Town (Knockbridge, p28), Dundalk (p29), Faughor (Faughart), Carlingford (all p30-32), Grange, Templetown, Ballugg Castle, Rock Marsh (Rockmarshall) (all p32-33), Ballymascanlan, Dundalk (all p33), Drumisky or kin (Dromiskin), Ballyheney (Heynestown), Lurgan Race (Lurganrace), Garlands Town or Castlebellingham, Milltown (all p34), Kilsaran (p35-36), Greenmount (p36), Dunleere (Dunleer), Aghclare, Bokaragh (Moylary) (all p37-38), Termonfeckin, Beaully (all p39), and Chord Cemetery Drogheda (p40).

Another journey from Dublin to Lough Derg through Meath, Cavan and Fermanagh, made approximately a year later, is recorded in another MS which was published in the Journal of the Royal Society of Antiquaries for 1892. This Journal notes the inaccuracies of some of Butler's translation of burial inscriptions. Butler's descriptions on his journeys were meant to provide material for a book by Dr John Ruddy (1697-1775), whom Butler was employed to assist.
