COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT.

MR. CHAIRMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

The special works on the Schedule are all of a useful character. Since last Assizes about fifty occupiers have, at my request, taken down barbed wire which had been erected along County road fences. In about the same number of cases, however, fresh barbed wire has been set up (even within the last few weeks) on other road fences, the occupiers being ignorant of the law on this subject. Only four occupiers have refused to take down barbed wire, and on the 9th instant I gave your Solicitor the necessary instructions in one of these, as a test case.

The new Pier at Carlingford is gradually getting into a more dangerous condition. If something is not done in the way of repair, the Pier, which cost fifteen thousand pounds, will probably be ruined in two years or so, at the present rate of movement. At Lower Dundalk Special Sessions I applied for £500, which would, I think, be sufficient to leave the Pier in a comparatively safe condition; but the application was rejected. The Grand Jury have now the power to present for the repair of the Pier, under the Act 16 & 17 Victoria, chap. 136, sec. 8. Also, under the same Act, secs. 11 and 12, the Commissioners of Public Works may repair the Pier, and order the cost to be levied off the Barony as a Compulsory Presentment.

In the case of No. 125, a contract for 226 perches of new foot-path between Dundalk Workhouse and Killally, I beg to recommend that the contractor, Patrick Brennan, be prosecuted at Quarter Sessions to break the contract and recover a penalty.

*The Repairs shall be commenced immediately after the ensuing
Assizes, and shall be proceeded with, without intermission, until the
road shall have been put into the specified order.*

The road shall have a clear carriage-way as wide as the existing
fences or grips will permit, but in no place to be less than.....feet
wide with gravel or broken stones: where less the road shall be
brought to this width by widening and metalling, unless where fences,
trenches, or footpaths interfere greater existing widths in the working
surfaces shall be maintained.

The footpaths and paved water tables, except in towns placed
under Commissioners appointed under the Towns' Improvement
(Ireland) Act, shall be kept clean, gravelled, and maintained in their
present state, or as they shall be hereafter reconstructed.

The road shall be kept in repair from water-table to water-table,
with broken stones or prepared gravel, and shall be brought to a reg-
ular convex curvilinear slope from the centre to the sides on the
cross sections, comparatively flat at the crown, but steeper on the
shoulders; all inequalities shall be reduced by applying new material
to the lower parts. The sides and water-tables shall be neatly defined
by continuous lines, parallel to the centre of the road, free from
sudden bends.

Along declivities particular attention will be required in keeping
the cross section more convex than elsewhere to pass off the water
quickly to the tables. Outlets, pipes, or French drains shall be made
to carry off the water where it would otherwise lodge on the water-
tables, into the adjacent grips, fields, or water-courses. Inlets shall
be made into all cross-drains, pipes, or gulleys; all grips on the field
side of the fences and water-drains, if any, shall be kept open to allow
a free passage for the water, and keep its surface under the water-
tables. The water-tables, shoulders, and sides of the road shall be
kept free from nuisance and obstructions. The road shall be kept free
from dust and mud by sweeping and scraping; the sweepings, and
scrapings, when sufficiently dry, shall be carted off, unless required to
fill grips along the road, or to complete the fences and side formation
between the water-tables and fences. A sufficient quantity shall
always be used for blending with newly spread stones or prepared
gravel, especially in dry seasons. These materials shall be applied
generally, in wet weather, when the low or concave parts are most
visible. They shall be kept in close contact with each other, and
when spread, sufficiently blended with sand or road scrapings. In
Towns' and villages, the scrapings or sweepings and dust heaps from
the road, shall be removed and carted away by the Contractor, but not
the cleansing, sweeping, and scavenging in Towns under the Towns'
Improvement Act, which must be done by the Town Commissioners.

All detached stones appearing on the road, or between the fences,
and all stones appearing on the surface exceeding two-and-a-half inches
in diameter, shall be picked up, collected, taken aside, made into heaps
broken, and used for darning the surface.

.....cubic yards, at least, of broken stone or properly prepared
gravel, shall be spread skilfully on the road per perch, on the average
in each year, exclusive of fine gravel used in footpaths. The stones
shall be broken so as to pass through an inch and three-quarter ring,
to be laid down as the Surveyor or his Assistant shall direct. The
distribution of the metalling shall be proportionate to the wants of the
road as the Assistant shall direct. When "sea beach" or gravel is the
material used, it shall be screened from any extra sand, and the larger
pebbles preserved and broken to pass through an inch and three-
quarter ring. No round pebble to be larger than $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch ring. Any
larger quantity of broken stones or prepared gravel which shall be
found necessary for the proper repairs and maintenance of the road
shall be put out and skilfully spread by the Contractor free of extra
expense to the County or Barony. In towns and on streets the Con-
tractor shall arrange with the Surveyor's Assistant to deliver and
spread the specified least quantity from carts or depots, at such times
and in such quantities as such Assistant shall direct. The most
durable materials to be had in the neighbourhood shall be used—the
hardest and toughest are best. No soft or brittle stone, shale, or
pencil, shall be used in any place for repairs.

After the road shall have been scraped, the weak portions shall
be darned with a sufficient quantity of broken stones, and a pre-
paration shall be made by picking the crust, so that the new materials
shall combine smoothly with the road and form a regular and smooth
surface. In darning, the stones shall be laid close and in contact
with each other. The surface shall be kept free from ruts and long-
itudinal furrows by timely and skilful repairs.

The Contractor shall put out along the sides of the road, or place
in depots, the whole quantity of materials specified, from time to time
before the first day of OCTOBER in each year, for measurement by the
Surveyor's Assistant, unless when otherwise directed to be spread from
carts for special repairs. A deduction of a yard and a-half will be
made from the measured quantity for each yard deficient after the
first of OCTOBER. No allowance will be made for stones spread out
of any oblongs before measurement.

The stones shall be arranged along the County roads in narrow
oblongs, placed on level beds, not exceeding two feet in width close
up to fences or grips outside the water-tables, of equal size, and
containing about a cubic yard each, and so as not to endanger or
inconvenience the public.

The Assistant will measure the smaller heaps, to determine the
quantity from, if the Contractor neglect making them of the same size.
The full quantity shall be spread before the first day of the SPRING
ASSIZES in each year. The value of two cubic yards shall be deducted
from the amount of the contract for each cubic yard remaining un-
spread afterwards. Any extra metalling required between SPRING
and SUMMER ASSIZES, in the last year of a contract for surface repairs

shall be supplied and spread free of charge by the Contractor. Any materials required between the spreading of one year's quantity and the measurement of the next year's shall be put out free of charge by the Contractor, by darnings from carts.

All existing gulleys, inlets, outlets, with the tail drains from them, drains, water courses, and grips, on the field side, to be kept in repair and free for the water to pass through. When springs rise through the surface, French drains should be made to drain off the water to the next drain or trench. In case of a sudden damage occurring along the line, the Contractor is at once to give the Surveyor notice to that effect, describing the nature of the damage, and the Contractor shall build temporary fences and take such other precautions as the County Surveyor may judge to be necessary for the safety of the public. The fences along the line and slopes of cuttings and embankments to be kept in repair. The battlements and parapets of bridges on the road, with the wing walls, pavements, abutments, &c., to be protected and kept in their present repair, or as they may be hereafter repaired. The Contractor to cut down and remove all weeds growing along the road on and between the fences before seed time. Sea slopes and pitch pavement along coast roads to be kept in repair; snow drifts shall be removed immediately after a fall of snow.

The Contractor shall keep the road constantly free from all nuisances, and shall not permit any injury to or encroachment on the road, and shall summon and prosecute all offending parties. In case of injury to the road by trees or hedges, the Contractor is to require the owner of the land to prune and lop them—the parties to be summoned before the Justices at Petty Sessions, in case of non-compliance within Ten days. The Contractor will be held accountable for any loss or injury to property or persons from putting out materials of any kind on or alongside the road, digging of holes along the road; or neglecting any necessary precaution to prevent injury to the public during the continuance of his contract.

The Contractor shall deliver up the road at the expiration of his contract, in good repair as above defined, and at any time during the existence of his contract shall attend to and carry into effect, any further instructions the Surveyor may find it necessary to give for the due repair and preservation of the road. Any quantity of broken stones or gravel remaining unspread and found at the termination of the contract along the road shall become the property of the County.

HALF-YEARLY REPORT OF COUNTY ANALYST.

To the Grand Jury of the County of Louth.

MR. FOREMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I beg leave to report that I have made the following analyses during the half-year ended on the 31st December, 1894.

There were analysed for Dundalk Board of Guardians, 4 specimens of water, and ten of tea. The object of the analyses of the tea was to determine which was best for use in the Workhouse.

For Ardee Board of Guardians a specimen of tea was analysed.

A specimen of water was analysed for Dr. J. J. Davis, Medical Officer, Collon; it was more like sewage than water. A water analysed for Dr. J. Jones, Medical Officer of Health: it was fairly good. A water analysed for Dr. Flood, Medical Officer of Health, Dundalk, was of tolerably good composition. Three samples of water from Castlebellingham, sent by Sir Henry Bellingham, Bart., were analysed.

For Drogheda Union, there were analysed 108 samples of new and buttermilk, 2 of butter, and 8 of water. Only one of the milk specimens was adulterated, but some of them fell below the standard of average quality milk, and I understand the contractors were fined by the Guardians in those cases. On the whole the milk supplied to this Union is very good.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT.

To the Grand Jury of the County of Louth assembled at Summer Assizes, 1894.

MR. CHAIRMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

All the new works on the Schedule are of a useful character except No. 4, Upper Dundalk, which will not, I think, be of use to the public. In addition, the application ought to have been for a new road, with due notice, not an ordinary application for repairs.

In several cases I have instructed your Solicitor to take proceedings against occupiers who have set up barbed wire fences along County roads. I have selected the earliest and worst cases, one at a time. In all such cases the barbed wire has been taken down, and several other neighbouring occupiers have followed suit.

At last Spring Assizes the Grand Jury received a memorial on the subject of a County work near Carlingford. I took Counsel's opinion as to what I ought to do concerning the memorial, and acting on this opinion my Solicitor wrote to each of the eight memorialists demanding an apology with the option of an Action for Libel. The following apology was signed, and I am advised by Counsel that it must be embodied in my Report:--

We regret having presented to the Grand Jury of the County of Louth, at last Spring Assizes, the

memorial relating to the lowering of the Hill at Catherine's Grove, Carlingford. Since we signed the memorial we have ascertained that the statements made in it were inaccurate, and we retract same.

I never attend Adjourned Sessions where County Contracts are made, and I now ask this Grand Jury to make an order that my Assistants also shall not attend Adjourned Sessions. If such an order is not made there will be room for suspicion, and it may be expected that from time to time Memorials, such as the Carlingford Memorial above mentioned, will be laid before the Grand Jury.

Blank copy of COUNTY SURVEYOR'S SPECIFICATION for repairs of roads, ordered to be printed in the Grand Warrant.

County of Louth.—Barony of.....No.....Assizes.—Specification and Instructions to Repair and keep in Repair until.....Assizes,.... with BROKEN STONE OR PREPARED GRAVEL,.....Perches of the road from.....to.....between.....and.....

The Repairs shall be commenced immediately after the ensuing Assizes, and shall be proceeded with, without intermission, until the road shall have been put into the specified order.

The road shall have a clear carriage-way as wide as the existing fences or grips will permit, but in no place to be less than.....feet wide with gravel or broken stones: where less the road shall be brought to this width by widening and metalling, unless where fences, trenches, or footpaths interfere greater existing widths in the working surfaces shall be maintained.

The footpaths and paved water tables, except in towns placed under Commissioners appointed under the Towns' Improvement (Ireland) Act, shall be kept clean, gravelled, and maintained in their present state, or as they shall be hereafter reconstructed.

The road shall be kept in repair from water-table to water-table, with broken stones or prepared gravel, and shall be brought to a regular convex curvilinear slope from the centre to the sides on the cross sections, comparatively flat at the crown, but steeper on the shoulders; all inequalities shall be reduced by applying new material to the lower parts. The sides and water-tables shall be neatly defined by continuous lines, parallel to the centre of the road, free from sudden bends.

Along declivities particular attention will be required in keeping the cross section more convex than elsewhere to pass off the water quickly to the tables. Outlets, pipes, or French drains shall be made to carry off the water where it would otherwise lodge on the water-tables, into the adjacent grips, fields, or water-courses. Inlets shall be made into all cross-drains, pipes, or gullets; all grips on the field side of the fences and water-drains, if any, shall be kept open to allow a free passage for the water, and keep its surface under the water-tables. The water-tables, shoulders, and sides of the road shall be kept free from nuisance and obstructions. The road shall be kept free from dust and mud by sweeping and scraping; the sweepings, and scrapings, when sufficiently dry, shall be carted off, unless required to fill grips along the road, or to complete the fences and side formation between the water-tables and fences. A sufficient quantity shall always be used for blending with newly spread stones or prepared gravel, especially in dry seasons. These materials shall be applied generally, in wet weather, when the low or concave parts are most visible. They shall be kept in close contact with each other, and when spread, sufficiently blended with sand or road scrapings. In Towns' and villages, the scrapings or sweepings and dust heaps from the road, shall be removed and carted away by the Contractor, but not the cleansing, sweeping, and scavenging in Towns under the Towns' Improvement Act, which must be done by the Town Commissioners.

All detached stones appearing on the road, or between the fences, and all stones appearing on the surface exceeding two-and-a-half inches in diameter, shall be picked up, collected, taken aside, made into heaps broken, and used for darning the surface.

.....cubic yards, at least, of broken stone or properly prepared gravel, shall be spread skilfully on the road per perch, on the average in each year, exclusive of fine gravel used in footpaths. The stones shall be broken so as to pass through an inch and three-quarter ring. to be laid down as the Surveyor or his Assistant shall direct. The distribution of the metalling shall be proportionate to the wants of the road as the Assistant shall direct. When "sea beach" or gravel is the material used, it shall be screened from any extra sand, and the larger pebbles preserved and broken to pass through an inch and three-quarter ring. No round pebble to be larger than 1½ inch ring. Any larger quantity of broken stones or prepared gravel which shall be found necessary for the proper repairs and maintenance of the road shall be put out and skilfully spread by the Contractor free of extra expense to the County or Barony. In towns and on streets the Contractor shall arrange with the Surveyor's Assistant to deliver and spread the specified least quantity from carts or depots, at such times and in such quantities as such Assistant shall direct. The most durable materials to be had in the neighbourhood shall be used—the hardest and toughest are best. No soft or brittle stone, shale, or pencil, shall be used in any place for repairs.

After the road shall have been scraped, the weak portions shall be darned with a sufficient quantity of broken stones, and a preparation shall be made by picking the crust, so that the new materials shall combine smoothly with the road and form a regular and smooth surface. In darning, the stones shall be laid close and in contact with each other. The surface shall be kept free from ruts and longitudinal furrows by timely and skilful repairs.

The Contractor shall put out along the sides of the road, or place in depots, the whole quantity of materials specified, from time to time before the first day of OCTOBER in each year, for measurement by the Surveyor's Assistant, unless when otherwise directed to be spread from carts for special repairs. A deduction of a yard and a-half will be made from the measured quantity for each yard deficient after the first of OCTOBER. No allowance will be made for stones spread out of any oblongs before measurement.

The stones shall be arranged along the County roads in narrow oblongs, placed on level beds, not exceeding two feet in width close up to fences or grips outside the water-tables, of equal size, and containing about a cubic yard each, and so as not to endanger or inconvenience the public.

The Assistant will measure the smaller heaps, to determine the quantity from, if the Contractor neglect making them of the same size. The full quantity shall be spread before the first day of the SPRING ASSIZES in each year. The value of two cubic yards shall be deducted from the amount of the contract for each cubic yard remaining unspread afterwards. Any extra metalling required between SPRING and SUMMER ASSIZES, in the last year of a contract for surface repairs

shall be supplied and spread free of charge by the Contractor. Any materials required between the spreading of one year's quantity and the measurement of the next year's shall be put out free of charge by the Contractor, by darnings from carts.

All existing gulleys, inlets, outlets, with the tail drains from them, drains, water courses, and grips, on the field side, to be kept in repair and free for the water to pass through. When springs rise through the surface, French drains should be made to drain off the water to the next drain or trench. In case of a sudden damage occurring along the line, the Contractor is at once to give the Surveyor notice to that effect, describing the nature of the damage, and the Contractor shall build temporary fences and take such other precautions as the County Surveyor may judge to be necessary for the safety of the public. The fences along the line and slopes of cuttings and embankments to be kept in repair. The battlements and parapets of bridges on the road, with the wing walls, pavements, abutments, &c., to be protected and kept in their present repair, or as they may be hereafter repaired. The Contractor to cut down and remove all weeds growing along the road on and between the fences before seed time. Sea slopes and pitch pavement along coast roads to be kept in repair; snow drifts shall be removed immediately after a fall of snow.

The Contractor shall keep the road constantly free from all nuisances, and shall not permit any injury to or encroachment on the road, and shall summon and prosecute all offending parties. In case of injury to the road by trees or hedges, the Contractor is to require the owner of the land to prune and lop them—the parties to be summoned before the Justices at Petty Sessions, in case of non-compliance within Ten days. The Contractor will be held accountable for any loss or injury to property or persons from putting out materials of any kind on or alongside the road, digging of holes along the road; or neglecting any necessary precaution to prevent injury to the public during the continuance of his contract.

The Contractor shall deliver up the road at the expiration of his contract, in good repair as above defined, and at any time during the existence of his contract shall attend to and carry into effect, any further instructions the Surveyor may find it necessary to give for the due repair and preservation of the road. Any quantity of broken stones or gravel remaining unspread and found at the termination of the contract along the road shall become the property of the County.

Half-yearly Report of Public Analyst.

To the Grand Jury of the County of Louth.

MR. FOREMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I beg leave to report that I have made the following analyses during the period which has elapsed from the 1st January, 1894, until the present.

For Dundalk there were analysed 14 specimens of tea, with the object of determining which was best for use in the Workhouse.

For Drogheda Union, which is partly within the County of Louth, there were analysed the following articles:—

76 specimens of new milk, 32 of buttermilk, one of butter, and 3 of water. The new milk was examined with the view of determining, not merely adulteration, but quality. With few exceptions, the milk was up to average quality. One of the buttermilks was adulterated with 20 per cent. of water. As to the water, one was very impure, and unfit for use; another was almost as bad, and the third was pure.

A specimen of butter analysed for this Union proved to be pure.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT.

To the Grand Jury of the County of Louth, assembled at Spring Assizes, 1895.

MR. FOREMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

The most important New Work on the Schedule is No. 1 in Ardee Barony, £530 for making a new road between Bolies and Charleville. The road will be very crooked, and owing to the position of the houses, some sharp bends cannot be rounded off. Also, the road will (practically) be of no use except to the occupiers whose homes and farms abut on it, and these occupiers are already better provided with roads than the average for the Barony.

Two Contracts, No. 108 for £9 in Upper Dundalk, and No. 407 for £55 in Lower Dundalk, cannot be carried out because, in each case, a few perches of land is required which cannot be purchased by agreement, and the necessary forms to take land compulsorily at a valuation have not been complied with. I beg to recommend that the amounts of these two contracts be re-presented to the credit of the respective Baronies.

The following contracts for Special Works have not been completed in the specified time, and the contractors ought to be prosecuted at next Quarter Sessions to recover a penalty :—

No. 372, Patrick Brennan, footpath, Dundalk Barony ;
No. 410, Patrick Rooney, new road, Lower Dundalk Barony ;
No. 479, John Stafford, protection wall, Ferrard Barony.

In the following cases of continued neglect on contracts for road maintenance, I beg to recommend that the contractors be prosecuted at next Quarter Sessions to break the contracts :—

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT, SPRING ASSIZES, 1895.

On October. 26th last, in the Omeath District of Lower Dundalk Barony, floods of quite an exceptional character damaged about six miles of roads, a two-arch bridge, and several culverts. These roads, bridges, &c., have been repaired at a cost of £130, under the authority of Magistrates' orders, and there stills remains damage to the amount of about £60, not of an urgent character, held over for next Presentment Sessions.

The Easterly gales of December and January last damaged Giles' Quay and Dunany Pier, to a slight extent. Also, the Harbour wall of the New Pier at Clogher Head yielded slightly under wave pressure, leaving a fissure about 100 feet long, and half an inch wide, at the widest place, between the Quay paving and the Harbour wall. Nothing can now be done to repair this injury, which is of no importance, except that it is a symptom of weakness.

County of Louth.—Barony of.....No.....Assizes.—Specification and Instructions to Repair and keep in Repair until.....Assizes,..... with BROKEN STONE OR PREPARED GRAVEL,.....Perches of the road from.....to.....between.....and.....

The Repairs shall be commenced immediately after the ensuing Assizes, and shall be proceeded with, without intermission, until the road shall have been put into the specified order.

The road shall have a clear carriage-way as wide as the existing fences or grips will permit, but in no place to be less than.....feet wide with gravel or broken stones: where less the road shall be brought to this width by widening and metalling, unless where fences, trenches, or footpaths interfere greater existing widths in the working surfaces shall be maintained.

The footpaths and paved water tables, except in towns placed under Commissioners appointed under the Towns' Improvement (Ireland) Act, shall be kept clean, gravelled, and maintained in their present state, or as they shall be hereafter reconstructed.

The road shall be kept in repair from water-table to water-table, with broken stones or prepared gravel, and shall be brought to a regular convex curvilinear slope from the centre to the sides on the cross sections, comparatively flat at the crown, but steeper on the shoulders; all inequalities shall be reduced by applying new material to the lower parts. The sides and water tables shall be neatly defined by continuous lines, parallel to the centre of the road, free from sudden bends.

Along declivities particular attention will be required in keeping the cross section more convex than elsewhere to pass off the water quickly to the tables. Outlets, pipes, or French drains shall be made to carry off the water where it would otherwise lodge on the water-tables, into the adjacent grips, fields, or water-courses. Inlets shall be made into all cross-drains, pipes, or gulleys; all grips on the field side of the fences and water-drains, if any, shall be kept open to allow a free passage for the water, and keep its surface under the water-tables. The water-tables, shoulders, and sides of the road shall be kept free from nuisance and obstructions. The road shall be kept free from dust and mud by sweeping and scraping; the sweepings, and scrapings, when sufficiently dry, shall be carted off, unless required to fill grips along the road, or to complete the fences and side formation between the water-tables and fences. A sufficient quantity shall always be used for blending with newly spread stones or prepared gravel, especially in dry seasons. These materials shall be applied generally, in wet weather, when the low or concave parts are most visible. They shall be kept in close contact with each other, and when spread, sufficiently blended with sand or road scrapings. In Towns' and villages, the scrapings or sweepings and dust heaps from the road, shall be removed and carted away by the Contractor, but not the cleansing, sweeping, and scavenging in Towns under the Towns' Improvement Act, which must be done by the Town Commissioners.

All detached stones appearing on the road, or between the fences, and all stones appearing on the surface exceeding two-and-a-half inches in diameter, shall be picked up, collected, taken aside, made into heaps broken, and used for darning the surface.

.....cubic yards, at least, of broken stone or properly prepared gravel, shall be spread skilfully on the road per perch. on the average in each year, exclusive of fine gravel used in footpaths. The stones shall be broken so as to pass through an inch and three-quarter ring, to be laid down as the Surveyor or his Assistant shall direct. The distribution of the metalling shall be proportionate to the wants of the road as the Assistant shall direct. When "sea beach" or gravel is the material used, it shall be screened from any extra sand, and the larger pebbles preserved and broken to pass through an inch and three-quarter ring. No round pebble to be larger than $1\frac{1}{4}$ inch ring. Any larger quantity of broken stones or prepared gravel which shall be found necessary for the proper repairs and maintenance of the road shall be put out and skilfully spread by the Contractor free of extra expense to the County or Barony. In towns and on streets the Contractor shall arrange with the Surveyor's Assistant to deliver and spread the specified least quantity from carts or depots, at such times and in such quantities as such Assistant shall direct. The most durable materials to be had in the neighbourhood shall be used—the hardest and toughest are best. No soft or brittle stone, shale, or pencil, shall be used in any place for repairs.

After the road shall have been scraped, the weak portions shall be darned with a sufficient quantity of broken stones, and a preparation shall be made by picking the crust, so that the new materials shall combine smoothly with the road and form a regular and smooth surface. In darning, the stones shall be laid close and in contact with each other. The surface shall be kept free from ruts and longitudinal furrows by timely and skilful repairs.

The Contractor shall put out along the sides of the road, or place in depots, the whole quantity of materials specified, from time to time before the first day of OCTOBER in each year, for measurement by the Surveyor's Assistant, unless when otherwise directed to be spread from carts for special repairs. A deduction of a yard and a-half will be made from the measured quantity for each yard deficient after the first of OCTOBER. No allowance will be made for stones spread out of any oblongs before measurement.

The stones shall be arranged along the County roads in narrow oblongs, placed on level beds, not exceeding two feet in width close up to fences or grips outside the water-tables, of equal size, and containing about a cubic yard each, and so as not to endanger or inconvenience the public.

The Assistant will measure the smaller heaps, to determine the quantity from, if the Contractor neglect making them of the same size. The full quantity shall be spread before the first day of the SPRING ASSIZES in each year. The value of two cubic yards shall be deducted from the amount of the contract for each cubic yard remaining unsprung afterwards. Any extra metalling required between SPRING and SUMMER ASSIZES, in the last year of a contract for surface repairs

shall be supplied and spread free of charge by the Contractor. Any materials required between the spreading of one year's quantity and the measurement of the next year's shall be put out free of charge by the Contractor, by darnings from carts.

All existing gulleys, inlets, outlets, with the tail drains from them, drains, water courses, and grips, on the field side, to be kept in repair and free for the water to pass through. When springs rise through the surface, French drains should be made to drain off the water to the next drain or trench. In case of a sudden damage occurring along the line, the Contractor is at once to give the Surveyor notice to that effect, describing the nature of the damage, and the Contractor shall build temporary fences and take such other precautions as the County Surveyor may judge to be necessary for the safety of the public. The fences along the line and slopes of cuttings and embankments to be kept in repair. The battlements and parapets of bridges on the road, with the wing walls, pavements, abutments, &c., to be protected and kept in their present repair, or as they may be hereafter repaired. The Contractor to cut down and remove all weeds growing along the road on and between the fences before seed time. Sea slopes and pitch pavement along coast roads to be kept in repair; snow drifts shall be removed immediately after a fall of snow.

The Contractor shall keep the road constantly free from all nuisances, and shall not permit any injury to or encroachment on the road, and shall summon and prosecute all offending parties. In case of injury to the road by trees or hedges, the Contractor is to require the owner of the land to prune and lop them—the parties to be summoned before the Justices at Petty Sessions, in case of non-compliance within Ten days. The Contractor will be held accountable for any loss or injury to property or persons from putting out materials of any kind on or alongside the road, digging of holes along the road; or neglecting any necessary precaution to prevent injury to the public during the continuance of his contract.

The Contractor shall deliver up the road at the expiration of his contract, in good repair as above defined, and at any time during the existence of his contract shall attend to and carry into effect, any further instructions the Surveyor may find it necessary to give for the due repair and preservation of the road. Any quantity of broken stones or gravel remaining unspread and found at the termination of the contract along the road shall become the property of the County.

HALF-YEARLY REPORT OF COUNTY ANALYST.

To the Grand Jury of the County of Louth.

MR. FOREMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I beg leave to submit for your consideration the particulars of the work which I have performed as your Analyst during the half-year ended on the 31st December, 1895.

The following were analysed for Dundalk Union :—2 specimen of water and 10 specimens of tea ; one of the waters was a tolerably but not very good one, whilst the other was largely polluted, and in composition resembled sewage more than it did potable water.

The teas were analysed with the view of determining which was the best for use in the workhouse.

For Drogheda Union there were 99 specimens of milk, 4 of butter, and one of water analysed. The water was pure, as was also the butter. Many of the milk samples fell below the average quality of pure milk. The Guardians of this Union fine the contractors whenever the quality of the milk falls below average quality.

A specimen of oil cake was analysed for Mr. H. C. Tisdall, J.P., Dulargy, Ravensdale. It only contained, amongst other constituents, 4.91 per cent. of oil.

I regret much that I have no more work to report than the above.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT.

To the Grand Jury of the County of Louth, assembled at Summer Assizes, 1895.

MR. FOREMAN AND GENTLEMEN.

At last Spring Assizes Prosecutions were ordered against four defaulting Contractors. In two of these cases the contracts were completed (or very nearly so) before May Quarter Sessions. In the other two cases the contracts were broken, and the contractors were decreed for nominal sums.

Presentments amounting to nearly Three Thousand pounds for the construction of new roads in Upper Dundalk and Louth Baronies are now exhibited. The new roads as shown on the maps, lodged by the applicants, follow existing old lanes, and in some cases might be very much improved by diversions, cutting off corners, and going round steep hills instead of over them. These improvements would necessitate the purchase of small areas of land, for which full provision is made in the Grand Jury Act. Also, if these diversions were made, a small minority of the occupiers would suffer some inconvenience, because instead of having a bad road by their gates, they would have a good road some perches away. Notwithstanding these objections I beg to say that in my opinion it would be a mistake to expend a large sum of public money in the construction of a bad road, when the same sum, or a very slightly greater sum, would be sufficient to make a good road.

The Presentment No. 10, Lower Dundalk, was passed for the maintenance of a new road which ought to be completed at this Assizes. The new road is not now quite finished, and the contractor must complete it and keep it in repair until next Spring Assizes. The Presentment for maintenance ought therefore to be cancelled.

 Assizes, and shall be proceeded with, without intermission, until the
 road shall have been put into the specified order.

The road shall have a clear carriage-way as wide as the existing
 fences or grips will permit, but in no place to be less than.....feet
 wide with gravel or broken stones: where less the road shall be
 brought to this width by widening and metalling, unless where fences,
 trenches; or footpaths interfere greater existing widths in the working
 surfaces shall be maintained.

The footpaths and paved water-tables, except in towns placed
 under Commissioners appointed under the Towns' Improvement
 (Ireland) Act, shall be kept clean, gravelled, and maintained in the
 present state, or as they shall be hereafter reconstructed.

The road shall be kept in repair from water-table to water-table,
 with broken stones or prepared gravel, and shall be brought to a reg-
 ular convex curvilinear slope from the centre to the sides on the
 cross sections, comparatively flat at the crown, but steeper on the
 shoulders; all inequalities shall be reduced by applying new material
 to the lower parts. The sides and water-tables shall be neatly defined
 by continuous lines, parallel to the centre of the road, free from
 sudden bends.

Along declivities particular attention will be required in keeping
 the cross section more convex than elsewhere to pass off the water
 quickly to the tables. Outlets, pipes, or French drains shall be made
 to carry off the water where it would otherwise lodge on the water-
 tables, into the adjacent grips, fields, or water-courses. Inlets shall
 be made into all cross-drains, pipes, or gulleys; all grips on the field
 side of the fences and water-drains, if any, shall be kept open to allow
 a free passage for the water, and keep its surface under the water-
 tables. The water-tables, shoulders, and sides of the road shall be
 kept free from nuisance and obstructions. The road shall be kept free
 from dust and mud by sweeping and scraping; the sweepings, and
 scrapings, when sufficiently dry, shall be carted off, unless required to
 fill grips along the road, or to complete the fences and side formation
 between the water-tables and fences. A sufficient quantity shall
 always be used for blending with newly spread stones or prepared
 gravel, especially in dry seasons. These materials shall be applied
 generally, in wet weather, when the low or concave parts are most
 visible. They shall be kept in close contact with each other, and
 when spread, sufficiently blended with sand or road scrapings. In
 Towns' and villages, the scrapings or sweepings and dust heaps from
 the road, shall be removed and carted away by the Contractor, but not
 the cleansing, sweeping, and scavenging in Towns under the Towns'
 Improvement Act, which must be done by the Town Commissioners.

All detached stones appearing on the road, or between the fences, and all stones appearing on the surface exceeding two-and-a-half inches in diameter, shall be picked up, collected, taken aside, made into heaps broken, and used for darning the surface.

.....cubic yards, at least, of broken stone or properly prepared gravel, shall be spread skilfully on the road per perch, on the average in each year, exclusive of fine gravel used in footpaths. The stones shall be broken so as to pass through an inch and three-quarter ring. to be laid down as the Surveyor or his Assistant shall direct. The distribution of the metalling shall be proportionate to the wants of the road as the Assistant shall direct. When "sea beach" or gravel is the material used, it shall be screened from any extra sand, and the larger pebbles preserved and broken to pass through an inch and three-quarter ring. No round pebble to be larger than $1\frac{1}{4}$ inch ring. Any larger quantity of broken stones or prepared gravel which shall be found necessary for the proper repairs and maintenance of the road shall be put out, and skilfully spread by the Contractor free of extra expense to the County or Barony. In towns and on streets the Contractor shall arrange with the Surveyor's Assistant to deliver and spread the specified least quantity from carts or depots, at such times and in such quantities as such Assistant shall direct. The most durable materials to be had in the neighbourhood shall be used—the hardest and toughest are best. No soft or brittle stone, shale, or pencil, shall be used in any place for repairs.

After the road shall have been scraped, the weak portions shall be darned with a sufficient quantity of broken stones, and a preparation shall be made by picking the crust, so that the new materials shall combine smoothly with the road and form a regular and smooth surface. In darning, the stones shall be laid close and in contact with each other. The surface shall be kept free from ruts and longitudinal furrows by timely and skilful repairs.

The Contractor shall put out along the sides of the road, or place in depots, the whole quantity of materials specified, from time to time before the first day of OCTOBER in each year, for measurement by the Surveyor's Assistant, unless when otherwise directed to be spread from carts for special repairs. A deduction of a yard and a-half will be made from the measured quantity for each yard deficient after the first of OCTOBER. No allowance will be made for stones spread out of any oblongs before measurement.

The stones shall be arranged along the County roads in narrow oblongs, placed on level beds, not exceeding two feet in width close up to fences or grips outside the water-tables, of equal size, and containing about a cubic yard each, and so as not to endanger or inconvenience the public.

The Assistant will measure the smaller heaps, to determine the quantity from, if the Contractor neglect making them of the same size. The full quantity shall be spread before the first day of the SPRING ASSIZES in each year. The value of two cubic yards shall be deducted from the amount of the contract for each cubic yard remaining unspread afterwards. Any extra metalling required between SPRING and SUMMER ASSIZES, in the last year of a contract for surface repairs

shall be supplied and spread free of charge by the Contractor. Any materials required between the spreading of one year's quantity and the measurement of the next year's shall be put out free of charge by the Contractor, by darnings from carts.

All existing gulleys, inlets, outlets, with the tail drains from them, drains, water courses, and grips, on the field side, to be kept in repair and free for the water to pass through. When springs rise through the surface, French drains should be made to drain off the water to the next drain or trench. In case of a sudden damage occurring along the line, the Contractor is at once to give the Surveyor notice to that effect, describing the nature of the damage, and the Contractor shall build temporary fences and take such other precautions as the County Surveyor may judge to be necessary for the safety of the public. The fences along the line and slopes of cuttings and embankments to be kept in repair. The battlements and parapets of bridges on the road, with the wing walls, pavements, abutments, &c., to be protected and kept in their present repair, or as they may be hereafter repaired. The Contractor to cut down and remove all weeds growing along the road on and between the fences before seed time. Sea slopes and pitch pavement along coast roads to be kept in repair; snow drifts shall be removed immediately after a fall of snow.

The Contractor shall keep the road constantly free from all nuisances, and shall not permit any injury to or encroachment on the road, and shall summon and prosecute all offending parties. In case of injury to the road by trees or hedges, the Contractor is to require the owner of the land to prune and lop them—the parties to be summoned before the Justices at Petty Sessions, in case of non-compliance within Ten days. The Contractor will be held accountable for any loss or injury to property or persons from putting out materials of any kind on or alongside the road, digging of holes along the road; or neglecting any necessary precaution to prevent injury to the public during the continuance of his contract.

The Contractor shall deliver up the road at the expiration of his contract, in good repair as above defined, and at any time during the existence of his contract shall attend to and carry into effect, any further instructions the Surveyor may find it necessary to give for the due repair and preservation of the road. Any quantity of broken stones or gravel remaining unspread and found at the termination of the contract along the road shall become the property of the County.

A specimen of decorticated cotton seed cake was analysed for Mr. W. Doran, Harristown, Ardee.
