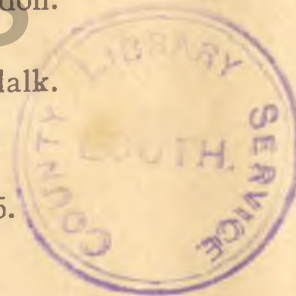

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT.

To the Grand Jury of the County of Louth, assembled at Spring Assizes, 1896.

MR. LEE-NORMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

At last Presentment Sessions three new roads were passed, the cost of which will amount to £2,700, corresponding to a tax of fifteen pence in the pound on Upper Dundalk Barony, and sixpence in the pound on Louth Barony, to be paid in six half-yearly instalments. Judging by the area of land without a road through it, and by the number of houses which are situated at a distance of a mile or so from the nearest County road in any direction, there can be no doubt that the people who live along the proposed new road through Killaconnor (No. 1, Upper Dundalk) are much worse off for roads than any similar number of Cess-payers in any part of the County. The other two roads, although not so much required, were passed unanimously at Sessions.

The following Presentments are, I think, unnecessary, and ought to be rejected—No. 5, Upper Dundalk, for 1s; No. 4, Lower Dundalk, for £17 17s 0d; and No. 14, Lower Dundalk, for £3.

In November last, one of my Assistants resigned. In his place, I appointed Mr. J. H. Steede, who has passed the necessary examination by the Board of Works, and I now ask you to confirm this appointment.

A Bill now before Parliament, if passed, will improve the position of County Surveyors and their Assistants; and the Chief Secretary has promised the support of the Government to this measure, provided it is approved by the Grand Juries of Ireland. I should be much obliged if this Grand Jury would pass a resolution in favor of the Bill, a copy of which I annex.

ORDER AND BY-LAWS FOR USE OF LOCOMOTIVES.

SPRING ASSIZES, 1882.

RESOLVED—That we approve of the following By-Laws for the regulation of the use of Locomotives upon the highways of the County, and Order that same be in force from this date, pursuant to the Public Health (Ireland) Amendment Act, 1879.

WHEREAS, by the 6th section of the above-mentioned Act, the Grand Jury of the County of Louth are empowered to make By-Laws as to the hours during which Locomotives are not to pass over any roads or highways situate within the said County of Louth, and being under the control of the said Grand Jury, being the roads within said County, exclusive of the Urban Sanitary Districts of the Borough of Dundalk; and for regulating the use of Locomotives upon any such highways, or preventing such use upon every bridge within the limits of said County, where the said Grand Jury is satisfied that such use would be attended with danger to the public, the Grand Jury hereby make the following By-Laws:—

1.—No Locomotive propelled by steam, or by other than animal power, shall be drawn, conducted, or allowed to pass through or over any road or highway, within the said County (exclusive of the Urban Sanitary District of the Borough of Dundalk), between the hours of 10 o'clock in the afternoon and 6 o'clock in the forenoon of any day, provided that this prohibition shall not apply to Locomotives known as Steam Road Rollers when in use for the purpose of making or repairing roads.

2.—Every Locomotive traversing any highway within the said County of Louth, but exclusive of the Urban Sanitary District of the Borough of Dundalk, shall have conspicuously affixed thereto two efficient red lights, one on each side in front of the same, so as to be visible from front and rear, and such lights shall be kept so as to show an efficient light during the period between sunset and sunrise, as also during all other periods when darkness may exist from fog or any other cause.

3.—The weight of every Locomotive (and name and address of the owner thereof) shall be painted in legible characters on some conspicuous part thereof.

4.—Every Locomotive while in motion shall be preceded by a person who, during all periods when lights are required to be affixed thereto, shall carry and display an efficient red light, at least 60 yards in advance of the Locomotive, and during all other periods shall at like distance carry and display a red flag.

5.—Where more than two waggons or vehicles of any kind are drawn by a Locomotive, then to the hindmost of them an efficient red light shall be conspicuously affixed and displayed during all such times as lights are required to be shown in front of the Locomotive.

6.—No Locomotive shall be driven upon or pass over the Obelisk Girder Bridge across the River Boyne.

These By-Laws confirmed by the Local Government Board for Ireland, this 4th day of May, 1882.

County of Louth.—Barony of.....No.....Assizes.—Specification and Instructions to Repair and keep in Repair until.....Assizes,.... with BROKEN STONE or PREPARED GRAVEL,.....Perches of the road from.....to.....between.....and.....

The Repairs shall be commenced immediately after the ensuing Assizes, and shall be proceeded with, without intermission, until the road shall have been put into the specified order.

The road shall have a clear carriage-way as wide as the existing fences or grips will permit, but in no place to be less than.....feet wide with gravel or broken stones: where less the road shall be brought to this width by widening and metalling, unless where fences, trenches, or footpaths interfere greater existing widths in the working surfaces shall be maintained.

The footpaths and paved water tables, except in towns placed under Commissioners appointed under the 'Towns' Improvement (Ireland) Act, shall be kept clean, gravelled, and maintained in their present state, or as they shall be hereafter reconstructed.

The road shall be kept in repair from water-table to water-table, with broken stones or prepared gravel, and shall be brought to a regular convex curvilinear slope from the centre to the sides on the cross sections, comparatively flat at the crown, but steeper on the shoulders; all inequalities shall be reduced by applying new material to the lower parts. The sides and water tables shall be neatly defined by continuous lines, parallel to the centre of the road, free from sudden bends.

Along declivities particular attention will be required in keeping the cross section more convex than elsewhere to pass off the water quickly to the tables. Outlets, pipes, or French drains shall be made to carry off the water where it would otherwise lodge on the water-tables, into the adjacent grips, fields, or water-courses. Inlets shall be made into all cross-drains, pipes, or gulleys; all grips on the field side of the fences and water-drains, if any, shall be kept open to allow a free passage for the water, and keep its surface under the water-tables. The water-tables, shoulders, and sides of the road shall be kept free from nuisance and obstructions. The road shall be kept free from dust and mud by sweeping and scraping; the sweepings, and scrapings, when sufficiently dry, shall be carted off, unless required to fill grips along the road, or to complete the fences and side formation between the water-tables and fences. A sufficient quantity shall always be used for blending with newly spread stones or prepared gravel, especially in dry seasons. These materials shall be applied generally, in wet weather, when the low or concave parts are most visible. They shall be kept in close contact with each other, and when spread, sufficiently blended with sand or road scrapings. In Towns' and villages, the scrapings or sweepings and dust heaps from the road, shall be removed and carted away by the Contractor, but not the cleansing, sweeping, and scavenging in Towns under the Towns' Improvement Act, which must be done by the Town Commissioners.

All detached stones appearing on the road, or between the fences, and all stones appearing on the surface exceeding two-and-a-half inches in diameter, shall be picked up, collected, taken aside, made into heaps broken, and used for darning the surface.

.....cubic yards, at least, of broken stone or properly prepared gravel, shall be spread skilfully on the road per perch, on the average in each year, exclusive of fine gravel used in footpaths. The stones shall be broken so as to pass through an inch and three-quarter ring, to be laid down as the Surveyor or his Assistant shall direct. The distribution of the metalling shall be proportionate to the wants of the road as the Assistant shall direct. When "sea beach" or gravel is the material used, it shall be screened from any extra sand, and the larger pebbles preserved and broken to pass through an inch and three-quarter ring. No round pebble to be larger than $1\frac{1}{4}$ inch ring. Any larger quantity of broken stones or prepared gravel which shall be found necessary for the proper repairs and maintenance of the road shall be put out and skilfully spread by the Contractor free of extra expense to the County or Barony. In towns and on streets the Contractor shall arrange with the Surveyor's Assistant to deliver and spread the specified least quantity from carts or depots, at such times and in such quantities as such Assistant shall direct. The most durable materials to be had in the neighbourhood shall be used—the hardest and toughest are best. No soft or brittle stone, shale, or pencil, shall be used in any place for repairs.

After the road shall have been scraped, the weak portions shall be darned with a sufficient quantity of broken stones, and a preparation shall be made by picking the crust, so that the new materials shall combine smoothly with the road and form a regular and smooth surface. In darning, the stones shall be laid close and in contact with each other. The surface shall be kept free from ruts and longitudinal furrows by timely and skilful repairs.

The Contractor shall put out along the sides of the road, or place in depots, the whole quantity of materials specified, from time to time before the first day of OCTOBER in each year, for measurement by the Surveyor's Assistant, unless when otherwise directed to be spread from carts for special repairs. A deduction of a yard and a-half will be made from the measured quantity for each yard deficient after the first of OCTOBER. No allowance will be made for stones spread out of any oblongs before measurement.

The stones shall be arranged along the County roads in narrow oblongs, placed on level beds, not exceeding two feet in width close up to fences or grips outside the water-tables, of equal size, and containing about a cubic yard each, and so as not to endanger or inconvenience the public.

The Assistant will measure the smaller heaps, to determine the quantity from, if the Contractor neglect making them of the same size. The full quantity shall be spread before the first day of the SPRING ASSIZES in each year. The value of two cubic yards shall be deducted from the amount of the contract for each cubic yard remaining unspread afterwards. Any extra metalling required between SPRING and SUMMER ASSIZES, in the last year of a contract for surface repairs

shall be supplied and spread free of charge by the Contractor. Any materials required between the spreading of one year's quantity and the measurement of the next year's shall be put out free of charge by the Contractor, by darnings from carts.

All existing gulleys, inlets, outlets, with the tail drains from them, drains, water courses, and grips, on the field side, to be kept in repair and free for the water to pass through. When springs rise through the surface, French drains should be made to drain off the water to the next drain or trench. In case of a sudden damage occurring along the line, the Contractor is at once to give the Surveyor notice to that effect, describing the nature of the damage, and the Contractor shall build temporary fences and take such other precautions as the County Surveyor may judge to be necessary for the safety of the public. The fences along the line and slopes of cuttings and embankments to be kept in repair. The battlements and parapets of bridges on the road, with the wing walls, pavements, abutments, &c., to be protected and kept in their present repair, or as they may be hereafter repaired. The Contractor to cut down and remove all weeds growing along the road on and between the fences before seed time. Sea slopes and pitch pavement along coast roads to be kept in repair; snow drifts shall be removed immediately after a fall of snow.

The Contractor shall keep the road constantly free from all nuisances, and shall not permit any injury to or encroachment on the road, and shall summon and prosecute all offending parties. In case of injury to the road by trees or hedges, the Contractor is to require the owner of the land to prune and lop them—the parties to be summoned before the Justices at Petty Sessions, in case of non-compliance within Ten days. The Contractor will be held accountable for any loss or injury to property or persons from putting out materials of any kind on or alongside the road, digging of holes along the road; or neglecting any necessary precaution to prevent injury to the public during the continuance of his contract.

The Contractor shall deliver up the road at the expiration of his contract, in good repair as above defined, and at any time during the existence of his contract shall attend to and carry into effect, any further instructions the Surveyor may find it necessary to give for the due repair and preservation of the road. Any quantity of broken stones or gravel remaining unspread and found at the termination of the contract along the road shall become the property of the County.

HALF-YEARLY REPORT OF COUNTY ANALYST.

MR. FOREMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I beg to report that I have made the following analyses during the half-year ended on the 31st December, 1895.

For the Sergeants of the Royal Irish Constabulary, acting as Inspectors of Food, the following articles were analysed :—

September 7th—A specimen of whiskey was analysed for Sergeant J. M'Cabe, Tallanstown ; it was not adulterated.

September 18th—On this date there were analysed for Sergeant H. Crossan, Dunleer, specimens each of whiskey, brandy, sherry, coffee, pepper and sugar ; they were all of pure quality.

September 24th—A specimen of whiskey, analysed for Sergeant J. Briarly, Castlebellingham ; it was not adulterated.

October 28th—Two specimens of whiskey, analysed for Sergeant B. M'Vicar, were of good quality.

December 12th—On this date a specimen of whiskey was analysed for Sergeant M'Cabe, Tallanstown ; it was not adulterated.

For the Guardians of Drogheda Union the following articles were analysed :—68 specimens of milk—they were all of average or rich quality ; 25 specimens of buttermilk—2 were adulterated with 14 and 15 per cent. of added water respectively, exclusive of 25 per cent. allowed for churning purposes ; 9 specimens of butter—none of them were adulterated with foreign fats, but 1 specimen was scarcely fit for use in the Workhouse.

For the Guardians of Dundalk Union the following were analysed :—

September 14th—12 specimens of tea were analysed on this date to determine which was best for use in the Workhouse.

October 17th—2 specimens of tea were analysed and found to be different in composition, that supplied not being equal to that contracted for.

November 12th—On this date 2 specimens of tea were analysed, and found to be equal in every respect.

August 6th—A specimen of lime, analysed for H. T. Bigger, Esq., Secretary Irish Salmon and Inland Fisheries, Dundalk.

November 12th—A specimen of milk was analysed for the Governor of H.M. Prison, Dundalk, and found to be above the average quality of pure milk.

Dear Sir,—At a largely attended meeting of Ratepayers of the Barony of Ardee, held in the Court-house, Castlebellingham, on the 9th April, 1896. King, Esq., J.P.; Colonel J. Thornhill, J. J. Russell, Esq., Right Hon. Lord Rathdonnell, J. Hoey, Esq., James Hoey, Esq., P.L.G.; P. D. Carragher, Esq., P.L.G.; P. Rourke, Esq., P.L.G.; J. C. Harmon, Esq., .P.L.G.

The estimated cost is £4500, and we are to request you to place this application upon your Schedule of Presentments for the Ardee Sessions on the 4th May next, so as to enable us to apply to the Board of Works for a Loan to carry out the proposed improvements.

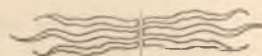

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT.

To the Grand Jury of the County of Louth, assembled at Summer Assizes, 1896.

MR. CHAIRMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

On the Schedule there are two applications for new roads—No. 1, Ardee Barony, £700; and No. 1, Ferrard Barony, £800—both useful works.

No. 12, Ferrard Barony, is an application to repair a short length of defending wall, at the worst part, on the road along the River Boyne, from Drogheda to Baltray. The defending walls along this road (for a length of 240 perches) are exposed at high water to heavy wash from steamers passing up and down the navigable channel of the River Boyne. The walls are badly built of loose stones, and are more or less injured at every high tide, and to a greater extent every year, as the river is encroaching on the road. In a few years the road will be cut through and dangerous, and must be closed, unless the whole 240 perches of defending walls are properly re-built in concrete or with dressed stones laid to a safe slope. This would be very expensive; and the Ferrard Special Sessions think that the cost ought to be borne by the Drogheda Harbour Commission, as the damage is caused by steamers. On the other hand, when portions of the walls are washed down, and stones are carried along the fore-shore towards the channel, the Harbour Commission write to complain, and to threaten action at law.

The application No. 11, Upper Dundalk, ought, I think, to be rejected for inutility.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT, SUMMER ASSIZES, 1896.

The contractor for No. 224, new road at Charleville, has not done any work for several months; and he has left some fences in bad order, to the loss and inconvenience of occupiers. It would be well to order a prosecution on the bond at the earliest possible date.

"The Drogheda Extension Bill," now before Parliament, provides for the transfer of about 500 acres of land, including 1100 perches of roads, from the County of Louth to the County of the Town of Drogheda—the transfer to take place when the Bill becomes law, probably in August next. It is, I think, essential that the transfer should not take place until Summer Assizes, 1897, when the Valuation Books will be revised. The Bill does not provide for the existing maintenance contracts on the roads to be transferred. These contracts (which may continue binding on the Louth Grand Jury) amount to about £115 per annum, and some of them have still four years unexpired. The transferred area will remain liable to a small amount of County at Large Cess, too small an amount to pay for the trouble of collection.

ORDER AND BY-LAWS FOR USE OF LOCOMOTIVES.

SPRING ASSIZES, 1882.

RESOLVED—That we approve of the following By-Laws for the regulation of the use of Locomotives upon the highways of the County, and Order that same be in force from this date, pursuant to the Public Health (Ireland) Amendment Act, 1879.

WHEREAS, by the 6th section of the above-mentioned Act, the Grand Jury of the County of Louth are empowered to make By-Laws as to the hours during which Locomotives are not to pass over any roads or highways situate within the said County of Louth, and being under the control of the said Grand Jury, being the roads within said County, exclusive of the Urban Sanitary Districts of the Borough of Dundalk; and for regulating the use of Locomotives upon any such highways, or preventing such use upon every bridge within the limits of said County, where the said Grand Jury is satisfied that such use would be attended with danger to the public, the Grand Jury hereby make the following By-Laws:—

1.—No Locomotive propelled by steam, or by other than animal power, shall be drawn, conducted, or allowed to pass through or over any road or highway, within the said County (exclusive of the Urban Sanitary District of the Borough of Dundalk), between the hours of 10 o'clock in the afternoon and 6 o'clock in the forenoon of any day, provided that this prohibition shall not apply to Locomotives known as Steam Road Rollers when in use for the purpose of making or repairing roads.

2.—Every Locomotive traversing any highway within the said County of Louth, but exclusive of the Urban Sanitary District of the Borough of Dundalk, shall have conspicuously affixed thereto two efficient red lights, one on each side in front of the same, so as to be visible from front and rear, and such lights shall be kept so as to show an efficient light during the period between sunset and sunrise, as also during all other periods when darkness may exist from fog or any other cause.

3.—The weight of every Locomotive (and name and address of the owner thereof) shall be painted in legible characters on some conspicuous part thereof

4.—Every Locomotive while in motion shall be preceded by a person who, during all periods when lights are required to be affixed thereto, shall carry and display an efficient red light, at least 60 yards in advance of the Locomotive, and during all other periods shall at like distance carry and display a red flag.

5.—Where more than two waggons or vehicles of any kind are drawn by a Locomotive, then to the hindmost of them an efficient red light shall be conspicuously affixed and displayed during all such times as lights are required to be shown in front of the Locomotive.

6.—No Locomotive shall be driven upon or pass over the Obelisk Girder Bridge across the River Boyne.

These By-Laws confirmed by the Local Government Board for Ireland, this 4th day of May, 1882.

The Repairs shall be commenced immediately after the ensuing Assizes, and shall be proceeded with, without intermission, until the road shall have been put into the specified order.

The road shall have a clear carriage-way as wide as the existing fences or grips will permit, but in no place to be less than.....feet wide with gravel or broken stones: where less the road shall be brought to this width by widening and metalling, unless where fences, trenches, or footpaths interfere greater existing widths in the working surfaces shall be maintained.

The footpaths and paved water-tables, except in towns placed under Commissioners appointed under the Towns' Improvement (Ireland) Act, shall be kept clean, gravelled, and maintained in their present state, or as they shall be hereafter reconstructed.

The road shall be kept in repair from water-table to water-table, with broken stones or prepared gravel, and shall be brought to a regular convex curvilinear slope from the centre to the sides on the cross sections, comparatively flat at the crown, but steeper on the shoulders; all inequalities shall be reduced by applying new material to the lower parts. The sides and water-tables shall be neatly defined by continuous lines, parallel to the centre of the road, free from sudden bends.

Along declivities particular attention will be required in keeping the cross section more convex than elsewhere to pass off the water quickly to the tables. Outlets, pipes, or French drains shall be made to carry off the water where it would otherwise lodge on the water-tables, into the adjacent grips, fields, or water-courses. Inlets shall be made into all cross-drains, pipes, or gulleys; all grips on the field side of the fences and water-drains, if any, shall be kept open to allow a free passage for the water, and keep its surface under the water-tables. The water-tables, shoulders, and sides of the road shall be kept free from nuisance and obstructions. The road shall be kept free from dust and mud by sweeping and scraping; the sweepings, and scrapings, when sufficiently dry, shall be carted off, unless required to fill grips along the road, or to complete the fences and side formation between the water-tables and fences. A sufficient quantity shall always be used for blending with newly spread stones or prepared gravel, especially in dry seasons. These materials shall be applied generally, in wet weather, when the low or concave parts are most visible. They shall be kept in close contact with each other, and when spread, sufficiently blended with sand or road scrapings. In Towns' and villages, the scrapings or sweepings and dust heaps from the road, shall be removed and carted away by the Contractor, but not the cleansing, sweeping, and scavenging in Towns under the Towns' Improvement Act, which must be done by the Town Commissioners.

All detached stones appearing on the road, or between the fences, and all stones appearing on the surface exceeding two-and-a-half inches in diameter, shall be picked up, collected, taken aside, made into heaps broken, and used for darning the surface.

.....cubic yards, at least, of broken stone or properly prepared gravel, shall be spread skilfully on the road per perch, on the average in each year, exclusive of fine gravel used in footpaths. The stones shall be broken so as to pass through an inch and three-quarter ring. To be laid down as the Surveyor or his Assistant shall direct. The distribution of the metalling shall be proportionate to the wants of the road as the Assistant shall direct. When "sea beach" or gravel is the material used, it shall be screened from any extra sand, and the larger pebbles preserved and broken to pass through an inch and three-quarter ring. No round pebble to be larger than $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch ring. Any larger quantity of broken stones or prepared gravel which shall be found necessary for the proper repairs and maintenance of the road shall be put out and skilfully spread by the Contractor free of extra expense to the County or Barony. In towns and on streets the Contractor shall arrange with the Surveyor's Assistant to deliver and spread the specified least quantity from carts or depots, at such times and in such quantities as such Assistant shall direct. The most durable materials to be had in the neighbourhood shall be used—the hardest and toughest are best. No soft or brittle stone, shale, or pencil, shall be used in any place for repairs.

After the road shall have been scraped, the weak portions shall be darned with a sufficient quantity of broken stones, and a preparation shall be made by picking the crust, so that the new materials shall combine smoothly with the road and form a regular and smooth surface. In darning, the stones shall be laid close and in contact with each other. The surface shall be kept free from ruts and longitudinal furrows by timely and skilful repairs.

The Contractor shall put out along the sides of the road, or place in depots, the whole quantity of materials specified, from time to time before the first day of OCTOBER in each year, for measurement by the Surveyor's Assistant, unless when otherwise directed to be spread from carts for special repairs. A deduction of a yard and a-half will be made from the measured quantity for each yard deficient after the first of OCTOBER. No allowance will be made for stones spread out of any oblongs before measurement.

The stones shall be arranged along the County roads in narrow oblongs, placed on level beds, not exceeding two feet in width close up to fences or grips outside the water-tables, of equal size, and containing about a cubic yard each, and so as not to endanger or inconvenience the public.

The Assistant will measure the smaller heaps, to determine the quantity from, if the Contractor neglect making them of the same size. The full quantity shall be spread before the first day of the SPRING ASSIZES in each year. The value of two cubic yards shall be deducted from the amount of the contract for each cubic yard remaining unspread afterwards. Any extra metalling required between SPRING and SUMMER ASSIZES, in the last year of a contract for surface repairs

shall be supplied and spread free of charge by the Contractor. Any materials required between the spreading of one year's quantity and the measurement of the next year's shall be put out free of charge by the Contractor, by darnings from carts.

All existing gulleys, inlets, outlets, with the tail drains from them, drains, water courses, and grips, on the field side, to be kept in repair and free for the water to pass through. When springs rise through the surface, French drains should be made to drain off the water to the next drain or trench. In case of a sudden damage occurring along the line, the Contractor is at once to give the Surveyor notice to that effect, describing the nature of the damage, and the Contractor shall build temporary fences and take such other precautions as the County Surveyor may judge to be necessary for the safety of the public. The fences along the line and slopes of cuttings and embankments to be kept in repair. The battlements and parapets of bridges on the road, with the wing walls, pavements, abutments, &c., to be protected and kept in their present repair, or as they may be hereafter repaired. The Contractor to cut down and remove all weeds growing along the road on and between the fences before seed time. Sea slopes and pitch pavement along coast roads to be kept in repair; snow drifts shall be removed immediately after a fall of snow.

The Contractor shall keep the road constantly free from all nuisances, and shall not permit any injury to or encroachment on the road, and shall summon and prosecute all offending parties. In case of injury to the road by trees or hedges, the Contractor is to require the owner of the land to prune and lop them—the parties to be summoned before the Justices at Petty Sessions, in case of non-compliance within Ten days. The Contractor will be held accountable for any loss or injury to property or persons from putting out materials of any kind on or alongside the road, digging of holes along the road; or neglecting any necessary precaution to prevent injury to the public during the continuance of his contract.

The Contractor shall deliver up the road at the expiration of his contract, in good repair as above defined, and at any time during the existence of his contract shall attend to and carry into effect, any further instructions the Surveyor may find it necessary to give for the due repair and preservation of the road. Any quantity of broken stones or gravel remaining unspread and found at the termination of the contract along the road shall become the property of the County.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT.

To the Grand Jury of the County of Louth, at Spring Assizes, 1897.

MR. CHAIRMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

The only new work of much importance on the Schedule is No. 1, Upper Dundalk, £1400, for a new road through Killacnorr. No contract has been made for this work on which I have already reported.

Complaints are made, with reason, as to the dangerous state of Carlingford Old Pier, and one Schooner has been badly damaged. I beg to recommend that the sum of £150 be expended in providing new timber, fenders, and new lamps. The Harbour Dues in hand are more than sufficient for this purpose without drawing on the County Cess.

The Drogheda Borough Extension Act, 1896, provides, that at next Summer Assizes an area of nearly 500 acres shall be transferred from the County of Louth to the County of the Town of Drogheda. The Act does not provide for unexpired road contracts, amounting nearly to £100 per annum within the "transferred area." I beg to suggest, that from and after next Summer Assizes, payments should be stopped from contractors in proportion to the number of perches in the transferred area, as in the following list. In the case of Spring contracts, the period from Spring to Summer Assizes to be reckoned as one-sixth of a year's work, :—

COUNTY OF LOUTH.**ORDER AND BY-LAWS FOR USE OF LOCOMOTIVES.**

SPRING ASSIZES, 1892.

RESOLVED—That we approve of the following By-Laws for the regulation of the use of Locomotives upon the highways of the County, and Order that same be in force from this date, pursuant to the Public Health (Ireland) Amendment Act, 1879.

WHEREAS, by the 6th section of the above-mentioned Act, the Grand Jury of the County of Louth are empowered to make By-Laws as to the hours during which Locomotives are not to pass over any roads or highways situate within the said County of Louth, and being under the control of the said Grand Jury, being the roads within said County, exclusive of the Urban Sanitary Districts of the Borough of Dundalk; and for regulating the use of Locomotives upon any such highways, or preventing such use upon every bridge within the limits of said County, where the said Grand Jury is satisfied that such use would be attended with danger to the public, the Grand Jury hereby make the following By-Laws:—

1.—No Locomotive propelled by steam, or by other than animal power, shall be drawn, conducted, or allowed to pass through or over any road or highway, within the said County (exclusive of the Urban Sanitary District of the Borough of Dundalk), between the hours of 10 o'clock in the afternoon and 6 o'clock in the forenoon of any day, provided that this prohibition shall not apply to Locomotives known as Steam Road Rollers when in use for the purpose of making or repairing roads.

2.—Every Locomotive traversing any highway within the said County of Louth, but exclusive of the Urban Sanitary District of the Borough of Dundalk, shall have conspicuously affixed thereto two efficient red lights, one on each side in front of the same, so as to be visible from front and rear, and such lights shall be kept so as to show an efficient light during the period between sunset and sunrise, as also during all other periods when darkness may exist from fog or any other cause.

3.—The weight of every Locomotive (and name and address of the owner thereof) shall be painted in legible characters on some conspicuous part thereof.

4.—Every Locomotive while in motion shall be preceded by a person who, during all periods when lights are required to be affixed thereto, shall carry and display an efficient red light, at least 60 yards in advance of the Locomotive, and during all other periods shall at like distance carry and display a red flag.

5.—Where more than two waggons or vehicles of any kind are drawn by a Locomotive, then to the hindmost of them an efficient red light shall be conspicuously affixed and displayed during all such times as lights are required to be shown in front of the Locomotive.

6.—No Locomotive shall be driven upon or pass over the Obelisk Girder Bridge across the River Boyne.

These By-Laws confirmed by the Local Government Board for Ireland, this 4th day of May, 1892.

County of Louth.—Barony of.....No.....Assizes.—Specification and Instructions to Repair and keep in Repair until.....Assizes..... with BROKEN STONE OR PREPARED GRAVEL.....Perches of the road from.....to.....between.....and.....

The Repairs shall be commenced immediately after the ensuing Assizes, and shall be proceeded with, without intermission, until the road shall have been put into the specified order.

The road shall have a clear carriage-way as wide as the existing fences or grips will permit, but in no place to be less than.....feet wide with gravel or broken stones: where less the road shall be brought to this width by widening and metalling, unless where fences, trenches, or footpaths interfere greater existing widths in the working surfaces shall be maintained.

The footpaths and paved water-tables, except in towns placed under Commissioners appointed under the Towns' Improvement (Ireland) Act, shall be kept clean, gravelled, and maintained in their present state, or as they shall be hereafter reconstructed.

The road shall be kept in repair from water-table to water-table, with broken stones or prepared gravel, and shall be brought to a regular convex curvilinear slope from the centre to the sides on the cross sections, comparatively flat at the crown, but steeper on the shoulders; all inequalities shall be reduced by applying new material to the lower parts. The sides and water-tables shall be neatly defined by continuous lines, parallel to the centre of the road, free from sudden bends.

Along declivities particular attention will be required in keeping the cross section more convex than elsewhere to pass off the water quickly to the tables. Outlets, pipes, or French drains shall be made to carry off the water where it would otherwise lodge on the water-tables, into the adjacent grips, fields, or water-courses. Inlets shall be made into all cross-drains, pipes, or gulleys; all grips on the field side of the fences and water-drains, if any, shall be kept open to allow a free passage for the water, and keep its surface under the water-tables. The water-tables, shoulders, and sides of the road shall be kept free from nuisance and obstructions. The road shall be kept free from dust and mud by sweeping and scraping; the sweepings, and scrapings, when sufficiently dry, shall be carted off, unless required to fill grips along the road, or to complete the fences and side formation between the water-tables and fences. A sufficient quantity shall always be used for blending with newly spread stones or prepared gravel, especially in dry seasons. These materials shall be applied generally, in wet weather, when the low or concave parts are most visible. They shall be kept in close contact with each other, and when spread, sufficiently blended with sand or road scrapings. In Towns' and villages, the scrapings or sweepings and dust heaps from the road, shall be removed and carted away by the Contractor, but not the cleansing, sweeping, and scavenging in Towns under the Towns' Improvement Act, which must be done by the Town Commissioners.

All detached stones appearing on the road, or between the fences, and all stones appearing on the surface exceeding two-and-a-half inches in diameter, shall be picked up, collected, taken aside, made into heaps broken, and used for darning the surface.

.....cubic yards, at least, of broken stone or properly prepared gravel, shall be spread skilfully on the road per perch, on the average in each year, exclusive of fine gravel used in footpaths. The stones shall be broken so as to pass through an inch and three-quarter ring, to be laid down as the Surveyor or his Assistant shall direct. The distribution of the metalling shall be proportionate to the wants of the road as the Assistant shall direct. When "sea beach" or gravel is the material used, it shall be screened from any extra sand, and the larger pebbles preserved and broken to pass through an inch and three-quarter ring. No round pebble to be larger than $1\frac{1}{4}$ inch ring. Any larger quantity of broken stones or prepared gravel which shall be found necessary for the proper repairs and maintenance of the road shall be put out and skilfully spread by the Contractor free of extra expense to the County or Barony. In towns and on streets the Contractor shall arrange with the Surveyor's Assistant to deliver and spread the specified least quantity from carts or depots, at such times and in such quantities as such Assistant shall direct. The most durable materials to be had in the neighbourhood shall be used—the hardest and toughest are best. No soft or brittle stone, shale, or pencil, shall be used in any place for repairs.

After the road shall have been scraped, the weak portions shall be darned with a sufficient quantity of broken stones, and a preparation shall be made by picking the crust, so that the new materials shall combine smoothly with the road and form a regular and smooth surface. In darning, the stones shall be laid close and in contact with each other. The surface shall be kept free from ruts and longitudinal furrows by timely and skilful repairs.

The Contractor shall put out along the sides of the road, or place in depots, the whole quantity of materials specified, from time to time before the first day of OCTOBER in each year, for measurement by the Surveyor's Assistant, unless when otherwise directed to be spread from carts for special repairs. A deduction of a yard and a-half will be made from the measured quantity for each yard deficient after the first of OCTOBER. No allowance will be made for stones spread out of any oblongs before measurement.

The stones shall be arranged along the County roads in narrow oblongs, placed on level beds, not exceeding two feet in width close up to fences or grips outside the water-tables, of equal size, and containing about a cubic yard each, and so as not to endanger or inconvenience the public.

The Assistant will measure the smaller heaps, to determine the quantity from, if the Contractor neglect making them of the same size. The full quantity shall be spread before the first day of the SPRING ASSIZES in each year. The value of two cubic yards shall be deducted from the amount of the contract for each cubic yard remaining unsprayed afterwards. Any extra metalling required between SPRING and SUMMER ASSIZES, in the last year of a contract for surface repairs

shall be supplied and spread free of charge by the Contractor. Any materials required between the spreading of one year's quantity and the measurement of the next year's shall be put out free of charge by the Contractor, by darnings from carts.

All existing gullets, inlets, outlets, with the tail drains from them, drains, water courses, and grips, on the field side, to be kept in repair and free for the water to pass through. When springs rise through the surface, French drains should be made to drain off the water to the next drain or trench. In case of a sudden damage occurring along the line, the Contractor is at once to give the Surveyor notice to that effect, describing the nature of the damage, and the Contractor shall build temporary fences and take such other precautions as the County Surveyor may judge to be necessary for the safety of the public. The fences along the line and slopes of cuttings and embankments to be kept in repair. The battlements and parapets of bridges on the road, with the wing walls, pavements, abutments, &c., to be protected and kept in their present repair, or as they may be hereafter repaired. The Contractor to cut down and remove all weeds growing along the road on and between the fences before seed time. Sea slopes and pitch pavement along coast roads to be kept in repair; snow drifts shall be removed immediately after a fall of snow.

The Contractor shall keep the road constantly free from all nuisances, and shall not permit any injury to or encroachment on the road, and shall summon and prosecute all offending parties. In case of injury to the road by trees or hedges, the Contractor is to require the owner of the land to prune and lop them—the parties to be summoned before the Justices at Petty Sessions, in case of non-compliance within Ten days. The Contractor will be held accountable for any loss or injury to property or persons from putting out materials of any kind on or alongside the road, digging of holes along the road; or neglecting any necessary precaution to prevent injury to the public during the continuance of his contract.

The Contractor shall deliver up the road at the expiration of his contract, in good repair as above defined, and at any time during the existence of his contract shall attend to and carry into effect, any further instructions the Surveyor may find it necessary to give for the due repair and preservation of the road. Any quantity of broken stones or gravel remaining unspread and found at the termination of the contract along the road shall become the property of the County.

HALF-YEARLY REPORT OF COUNTY ANALYST.

To the Grand Jury of the County of Louth.

MR. FOREMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I beg to report that I have made the following analyses during the half-year, ended on the 31st day of December, 1896:

For the Sergeants of the Royal Irish Constabulary, acting as Inspectors of Food, the following articles were analysed:—

June 26th—A specimen of whiskey, analysed for Sergeant T. Groves, Dundalk, was of good quality.

August 29th—For Sergeant J. M'Cabe, Tallanstown, 2 specimens of whiskey were analysed; they were free from adulteration.

September 22nd—For Sergeant Crossan, Dunleer, 2 samples of whiskey were analysed; they were not adulterated.

November 18th—For Sergeant M'Donough, Castlebellingham, 2 specimens of whiskey were analysed; one was adulterated, being 31 degrees under proof.

December 31st—A specimen of whiskey, analysed for Sergeant J. Currin, Westgate, Drogheda, was 26·8 degrees under proof, and therefore an adulterated article; 25 degrees under proof being the lowest strength saleable without declaration of strength.

July 20th—2 specimens of water, analysed for the Guardians of Ardee Union, had the following compositions:—

HALF-YEARLY REPORT OF COUNTY ANALYST.

September 14th—11 specimens of tea were analysed for the Guardians of the Dundalk Union, to determine which was best for use in the Workhouse.

September 16th—For the Guardians of Dundalk Union, 2 specimens of milk were analysed; one was adulterated with 11·25 per cent. of added water, the second specimen was above the average quality of pure milk.

December 3rd—On this date for the Guardians of Dundalk Union 2 specimens of tea were analysed for comparison with former specimen selected.

For the Guardians of Drogheda Union, 72 specimens of milk and 26 of buttermilk, were analysed; with few exceptions, the milks were of average or rich quality. One of the buttermilk specimens was of a very poor and doubtful quality, but not sufficiently so to warrant a certificate of adulteration.

July 30th—Copper was discovered in the viscera of a cow, examined for W. Chambers, Esq., Veterinary Surgeon, Drogheda.

AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOARD.

ORDER AND BY-LAWS FOR USE OF LOCOMOTIVES.

SPRING ASSIZES, 1882.

RESOLVED—That we approve of the following By-Laws for the regulation of the use of Locomotives upon the highways of the County, and Order that same be in force from this date, pursuant to the Public Health (Ireland) Amendment Act, 1879.

WHEREAS, by the 6th section of the above-mentioned Act, the Grand Jury of the County of Louth are empowered to make By-Laws as to the hours during which Locomotives are not to pass over any roads or highways situate within the said County of Louth, and being under the control of the said Grand Jury, being the roads within said County, exclusive of the Urban Sanitary Districts of the Borough of Dundalk; and for regulating the use of Locomotives upon any such highways, or preventing such use upon every bridge within the limits of said County, where the said Grand Jury is satisfied that such use would be attended with danger to the public, the Grand Jury hereby make the following By-Laws:—

1.—No Locomotive propelled by steam, or by other than animal power, shall be drawn, conducted, or allowed to pass through or over any road or highway, within the said County (exclusive of the Urban Sanitary District of the Borough of Dundalk), between the hours of 10 o'clock in the afternoon and 6 o'clock in the forenoon of any day, provided that this prohibition shall not apply to Locomotives known as Steam Road Rollers when in use for the purpose of making or repairing roads.

2.—Every Locomotive traversing any highway within the said County of Louth, but exclusive of the Urban Sanitary District of the Borough of Dundalk, shall have conspicuously affixed thereto two efficient red lights, one on each side in front of the same, so as to be visible from front and rear, and such lights shall be kept so as to show an efficient light during the period between sunset and sunrise, as also during all other periods when darkness may exist from fog or any other cause.

3.—The weight of every Locomotive (and name and address of the owner thereof) shall be painted in legible characters on some conspicuous part thereof.

4.—Every Locomotive while in motion shall be preceded by a person who, during all periods when lights are required to be affixed thereto, shall carry and display an efficient red light, at least 60 yards in advance of the Locomotive, and during all other periods shall at like distance carry and display a red flag.

5.—Where more than two waggons or vehicles of any kind are drawn by a Locomotive, then to the hindmost of them an efficient red light shall be conspicuously affixed and displayed during all such times as lights are required to be shown in front of the Locomotive.

6.—No Locomotive shall be driven upon or pass over the Obelisk Girder Bridge across the River Boyne.

These By-Laws confirmed by the Local Government Board for Ireland, this 4th day of May, 1882.

Blank copy of COUNTY SURVEYOR'S SPECIFICATION for repairs of roads, ordered to be printed in the Grand Warrant.

County of Louth.—Barony of.....No.....Assizes.—Specification and Instructions to Repair and keep in Repair until.....Assizes,.....with BROKEN STONE OR PREPARED GRAVEL,.....Perches of the road from.....to.....between.....and.....

The Repairs shall be commenced immediately after the ensuing Assizes, and shall be proceeded with, without intermission, until the road shall have been put into the specified order.

The road shall have a clear carriage-way as wide as the existing fences or grips will permit, but in no place to be less than.....feet wide with gravel or broken stones: where less the road shall be brought to this width by widening and metalling, unless where fences, trenches, or footpaths interfere greater existing widths in the working surfaces shall be maintained.

The footpaths and paved water-tables, except in towns placed under Commissioners appointed under the Towns' Improvement (Ireland) Act, shall be kept clean, gravelled, and maintained in their present state, or as they shall be hereafter reconstructed.

The road shall be kept in repair from water-table to water-table, with broken stones or prepared gravel, and shall be brought to a regular convex curvilinear slope from the centre to the sides on the cross sections, comparatively flat at the crown, but steeper on the shoulders; all inequalities shall be reduced by applying new material to the lower parts. The sides and water-tables shall be neatly defined by continuous lines, parallel to the centre of the road, free from sudden bends.

Along declivities particular attention will be required in keeping the cross section more convex than elsewhere to pass off the water quickly to the tables. Outlets, pipes, or French drains shall be made to carry off the water where it would otherwise lodge on the water-tables, into the adjacent grips, fields, or water-courses. Inlets shall be made into all cross-drains, pipes, or gullets; all grips on the field side of the fences and water-drains, if any, shall be kept open to allow a free passage for the water, and keep its surface under the water-tables. The water-tables, shoulders, and sides of the road shall be kept free from nuisance and obstructions. The road shall be kept free from dust and mud by sweeping and scraping; the sweepings, and scrapings, when sufficiently dry, shall be carted off, unless required to fill grips along the road, or to complete the fences and side formation between the water-tables and fences. A sufficient quantity shall always be used for blending with newly spread stones or prepared gravel, especially in dry seasons. These materials shall be applied generally, in wet weather, when the low or concave parts are most visible. They shall be kept in close contact with each other, and when spread, sufficiently blended with sand or road scrapings. In Towns' and villages, the scrapings or sweepings and dust heaps from the road, shall be removed and carted away by the Contractor, but not the cleansing, sweeping, and scavenging in Towns under the Towns' Improvement Act, which must be done by the Town Commissioners.

All detached stones appearing on the road, or between the fences, and all stones appearing on the surface exceeding two-and-a-half inches in diameter, shall be picked up, collected, taken aside, made into heaps broken, and used for darning the surface.

.....cubic yards, at least, of broken stone or properly prepared gravel, shall be spread skilfully on the road per perch, on the average in each year, exclusive of fine gravel used in footpaths. The stones shall be broken so as to pass through an inch and three-quarter ring. to be laid down as the Surveyor or his Assistant shall direct. The distribution of the metalling shall be proportionate to the wants of the road as the Assistant shall direct. When "sea beach" or gravel is the material used, it shall be screened from any extra sand, and the larger pebbles preserved and broken to pass through an inch and three-quarter ring. No round pebble to be larger than $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch ring. Any larger quantity of broken stones or prepared gravel which shall be found necessary for the proper repairs and maintenance of the road shall be put out and skilfully spread by the Contractor free of extra expense to the County or Barony. In towns and on streets the Contractor shall arrange with the Surveyor's Assistant to deliver and spread the specified least quantity from carts or depots, at such times and in such quantities as such Assistant shall direct. The most durable materials to be had in the neighbourhood shall be used—the hardest and toughest are best. No soft or brittle stone, shale, or pencil, shall be used in any place for repairs.

After the road shall have been scraped, the weak portions shall be darned with a sufficient quantity of broken stones, and a preparation shall be made by picking the crust, so that the new materials shall combine smoothly with the road and form a regular and smooth surface. In darning, the stones shall be laid close and in contact with each other. The surface shall be kept free from ruts and longitudinal furrows by timely and skilful repairs.

The Contractor shall put out along the sides of the road, or place in depots, the whole quantity of materials specified, from time to time before the first day of OCTOBER in each year, for measurement by the Surveyor's Assistant, unless when otherwise directed to be spread from carts for special repairs. A deduction of a yard and a-half will be made from the measured quantity for each yard deficient after the first of OCTOBER. No allowance will be made for stones spread out of any oblongs before measurement.

The stones shall be arranged along the County roads in narrow oblongs, placed on level beds, not exceeding two feet in width close up to fences or grips outside the water-tables, of equal size, and containing about a cubic yard each, and so as not to endanger or inconvenience the public.

The Assistant will measure the smaller heaps, to determine the quantity from, if the Contractor neglect making them of the same size. The full quantity shall be spread before the first day of the SPRING ASSIZES in each year. The value of two cubic yards shall be deducted from the amount of the contract for each cubic yard remaining unspread afterwards. Any extra metalling required between SPRING and SUMMER ASSIZES, in the last year of a contract for surface repairs

shall be supplied and spread free of charge by the Contractor. Any materials required between the spreading of one year's quantity and the measurement of the next year's shall be put out free of charge by the Contractor, by darnings from carts.

All existing gulleys, inlets, outlets, with the tail drains from them, drains, water courses, and grips, on the field side, to be kept in repair and free for the water to pass through. When springs rise through the surface, French drains should be made to drain off the water to the next drain or trench. In case of a sudden damage occurring along the line, the Contractor is at once to give the Surveyor notice to that effect, describing the nature of the damage, and the Contractor shall build temporary fences and take such other precautions as the County Surveyor may judge to be necessary for the safety of the public. The fences along the line and slopes of cuttings and embankments to be kept in repair. The battlements and parapets of bridges on the road, with the wing walls, pavements, abutments, &c., to be protected and kept in their present repair, or as they may be hereafter repaired. The Contractor to cut down and remove all weeds growing along the road on and between the fences before seed time. Sea slopes and pitch pavement along coast roads to be kept in repair; snow drifts shall be removed immediately after a fall of snow.

The Contractor shall keep the road constantly free from all nuisances, and shall not permit any injury to or encroachment on the road, and shall summon and prosecute all offending parties. In case of injury to the road by trees or hedges, the Contractor is to require the owner of the land to prune and lop them—the parties to be summoned before the Justices at Petty Sessions, in case of non-compliance within Ten days. The Contractor will be held accountable for any loss or injury to property or persons from putting out materials of any kind on or alongside the road, digging of holes along the road; or neglecting any necessary precaution to prevent injury to the public during the continuance of his contract.

The Contractor shall deliver up the road at the expiration of his contract, in good repair as above defined, and at any time during the existence of his contract shall attend to and carry into effect, any further instructions the Surveyor may find it necessary to give for the due repair and preservation of the road. Any quantity of broken stones or gravel remaining unspread and found at the termination of the contract along the road shall become the property of the County.

HALF-YEARLY REPORT OF COUNTY ANALYST.

To the Grand Jury of the County of Louth.

MR. FOREMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I beg to report that I have made the following analyses during the five months ended on the 31st day of May, 1897 :—

For the Sergeants of the Royal Irish Constabulary, acting as Inspectors of Food, the following articles were analysed :—

Jan. 9th—For Sergeant T. Griffin, Ardee, a specimen of whiskey was analysed ; it was free from adulteration.

Jan. 27th—For Sergeant T. Groves, Dundalk, a specimen of whiskey was analysed ; it was adulterated with 21·93 per cent. of added water, being 40·45 degrees under proof.

March 22nd—For Acting-Sergeant C. Reid, Carlingford, five specimens whiskey and one of milk were analysed ; the specimens of whiskey were pure ; the milk was of poor quality.

March 29th—A specimen of whiskey analysed for Sergeant J. Currin, Westgate, Drogheda, was of good quality.

On same date, for Sergeant T. Griffin, Ardee, three specimens of whiskey were adulterated ; they were free from adulteration.

All the milks were of average or rich quality. One of the specimens of buttermilk was adulterated with 20 per cent. of added water, exclusive of 25 per cent. allowed for churning purposes. Of the specimens of butter, one was composed almost entirely of fats foreign to butter, i.e., margarine ; and one was adulterated with excess of

water, of which it contained 19·33 per cent., 16 per cent. being the maximum that should be permitted. Of the remaining specimens one was totally unfit for food, one was rancid, and three were of inferior quality. The specimens of water had the following compositions :—
