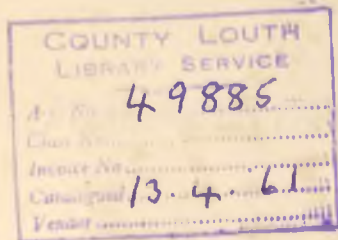

MR. CHAIRMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

The application, No. 14 on the Schedule for Ardee Barony, is for a very useful Hill-cutting, to cost £140. No. 1 Upper Dundalk, £167, provides for lowering and fencing a very dangerous part of the Dundalk Crossmaglen road at Sheelagh Bog. No. 1, Lower Dundalk, is a new line of road (to cost £242) through a District already fairly well provided with roads. No. 1, Ferrard (now exhibited) is a new line of road over Mullaghash Hill. This would be a very useful line of road, but the gradients are very long and very steep.

As directed by the Grand Jury at last Summer Assizes, the following Contractors were prosecuted at Quarter Sessions:—
No. 146—Charles O'Hanlon, New road, Lower Dundalk Barony.
No. 270—Patrick Meade, 918 perches road, Ardee.
No. 275—Patrick Meade, 500 perches road, Ardee.
In the two last cases decrees were obtained, but the new road, No. 146, was practically completed before Quarter Sessions, and proceedings were stopped.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT, SPRING ASSIZES, 1898.

For the last five years large quantities of broken stones have been laid down on the road from Dundalk to Blackrock, and the greater part of the road has been almost re-made. The stones are well blinded with mud, and there is no neglect on the part of the Contractor, but still a great many complaints are made about the rough state of the surface. Next year the road will be in a fairly safe condition, and the quantity of stones may be reduced; but in Winter, when the stones must be spread, there is almost no traffic, consequently the patches of stones remain rough for a long time before they bind in. To spread the stones in Summer, when the traffic is very heavy, would create a worse state of things. Steam rolling would be an effective remedy, but for this there are no funds available.

ORDER AND BY-LAWS FOR USE OF LOCOMOTIVES.

SPRING ASSIZES, 1882.

RESOLVED—That we approve of the following By-Laws for the regulation of the use of Locomotives upon the highways of the County, and Order that same be in force from this date, pursuant to the Public Health (Ireland) Amendment Act, 1879.

WHEREAS, by the 6th section of the above-mentioned Act, the Grand Jury of the County of Louth are empowered to make By-Laws as to the hours during which Locomotives are not to pass over any roads or highways situate within the said County of Louth, and being under the control of the said Grand Jury, being the roads within said County, exclusive of the Urban Sanitary Districts of the Borough of Dundalk; and for regulating the use of Locomotives upon any such highways, or preventing such use upon every bridge within the limits of said County, where the said Grand Jury is satisfied that such use would be attended with danger to the public, the Grand Jury hereby make the following By-Laws:—

1.—No Locomotive propelled by steam, or by other than animal power, shall be drawn, conducted, or allowed to pass through or over any road or highway, within the said County (exclusive of the Urban Sanitary District of the Borough of Dundalk), between the hours of 10 o'clock in the afternoon and 6 o'clock in the forenoon of any day, provided that this prohibition shall not apply to Locomotives known as Steam Road Rollers when in use for the purpose of making or repairing roads.

2.—Every Locomotive traversing any highway within the said County of Louth, but exclusive of the Urban Sanitary District of the Borough of Dundalk, shall have conspicuously affixed thereto two efficient red lights, one on each side in front of the same, so as to be visible from front and rear, and such lights shall be kept so as to show an efficient light during the period between sunset and sunrise, as also during all other periods when darkness may exist from fog or any other cause.

3.—The weight of every Locomotive (and name and address of the owner thereof) shall be painted in legible characters on some conspicuous part thereof.

4.—Every Locomotive while in motion shall be preceded by a person who, during all periods when lights are required to be affixed thereto, shall carry and display an efficient red light, at least 60 yards in advance of the Locomotive, and during all other periods shall at like distance carry and display a red flag.

5.—Where more than two waggons or vehicles of any kind are drawn by a Locomotive, then to the hindmost of them an efficient red light shall be conspicuously affixed and displayed during all such times as lights are required to be shown in front of the Locomotive.

6.—No Locomotive shall be driven upon or pass over the Obelisk Girder Bridge across the River Boyne.

These By-Laws confirmed by the Local Government Board for Ireland this 4th day of May, 1882.

Blank copy of COUNTY SURVEYOR'S SPECIFICATION for repairs of roads, ordered to be printed in the Grand Warrant.

County of Louth.—Barony of.....No.....Assizes.—Specification and Instructions to Repair and keep in Repair until.....Assizes..... with BROKEN STONE or PREPARED GRAVEL.....Perches of the road from.....to.....between.....and.....

The Repairs shall be commenced immediately after the ensuing Assizes, and shall be proceeded with, without intermission, until the road shall have been put into the specified order.

The road shall have a clear carriage-way as wide as the existing fences or grips will permit, but in no place to be less than.....feet wide with gravel or broken stones: where less the road shall be brought to this width by widening and metalling, unless where fences, trenches, or footpaths interfere greater existing widths in the working surfaces shall be maintained.

The footpaths and paved water tables, except in towns placed under Commissioners appointed under the Towns' Improvement (Ireland) Act, shall be kept clean, gravelled, and maintained in their present state, or as they shall be hereafter reconstructed.

The road shall be kept in repair from water-table to water-table, with broken stones or prepared gravel, and shall be brought to a regular convex curvilinear slope from the centre to the sides on the cross sections, comparatively flat at the crown, but steeper on the shoulders; all inequalities shall be reduced by applying new material to the lower parts. The sides and water tables shall be neatly defined by continuous lines, parallel to the centre of the road, free from sudden bends.

Along declivities particular attention will be required in keeping the cross section more convex than elsewhere to pass off the water quickly to the tables. Outlets, pipes, or French drains shall be made to carry off the water where it would otherwise lodge on the water-tables, into the adjacent grips, fields, or water-courses. Inlets shall be made into all cross-drains, pipes, or gulleys; all grips on the field side of the fences and water-drains, if any, shall be kept open to allow a free passage for the water, and keep its surface under the water-tables. The water-tables, shoulders, and sides of the road shall be kept free from nuisance and obstructions. The road shall be kept free from dust and mud by sweeping and scraping; the sweepings, and scrapings, when sufficiently dry, shall be carted off, unless required to fill grips along the road, or to complete the fences and side formation between the water-tables and fences. A sufficient quantity shall always be used for blending with newly spread stones or prepared gravel, especially in dry seasons. These materials shall be applied generally, in wet weather, when the low or concave parts are most visible. They shall be kept in close contact with each other, and when spread, sufficiently blended with sand or road scrapings. In Towns and villages, the scrapings or sweepings and dust heaps from the road, shall be removed and carted away by the Contractor, but not the cleansing, sweeping, and scavenging in Towns under the Towns' Improvement Act, which must be done by the Town Commissioners.

All detached stones appearing on the road, or between the fences, and all stones appearing on the surface exceeding two-and-a-half inches in diameter, shall be picked up, collected, taken aside, made into heaps broken, and used for darning the surface.

.....cubic yards, at least, of broken stone or properly prepared gravel, shall be spread skilfully on the road per perch, on the average in each year, exclusive of fine gravel used in footpaths. The stones shall be broken so as to pass through an inch and three-quarter ring, to be laid down as the Surveyor or his Assistant shall direct. The distribution of the metalling shall be proportionate to the wants of the road as the Assistant shall direct. When "sea beach" or gravel is the material used, it shall be screened from any extra sand, and the larger pebbles preserved and broken to pass through an inch and three-quarter ring. No round pebble to be larger than $1\frac{1}{4}$ inch ring. Any larger quantity of broken stones or prepared gravel which shall be found necessary for the proper repairs and maintenance of the road shall be put out and skilfully spread by the Contractor free of extra expense to the County or Barony. In towns and on streets the Contractor shall arrange with the Surveyor's Assistant to deliver and spread the specified least quantity from carts or depots, at such times and in such quantities as such Assistant shall direct. The most durable materials to be had in the neighbourhood shall be used—the hardest and toughest are best. No soft or brittle stone, shale, or pencil, shall be used in any place for repairs.

After the road shall have been scraped, the weak portions shall be darned with a sufficient quantity of broken stones, and a preparation shall be made by picking the crust, so that the new materials shall combine smoothly with the road and form a regular and smooth surface. In darning, the stones shall be laid close and in contact with each other. The surface shall be kept free from ruts and longitudinal furrows by timely and skilful repairs.

The Contractor shall put out along the sides of the road, or place in depots, the whole quantity of materials specified, from time to time before the first day of OCTOBER in each year, for measurement by the Surveyor's Assistant, unless when otherwise directed to be spread from carts for special repairs. A deduction of a yard and a-half will be made from the measured quantity for each yard deficient after the first of OCTOBER. No allowance will be made for stones spread out of any oblongs before measurement.

The stones shall be arranged along the County roads in narrow oblongs, placed on level beds, not exceeding two feet in width close up to fences or grips outside the water-tables, of equal size, and containing about a cubic yard each, and so as not to endanger or inconvenience the public.

The Assistant will measure the smaller heaps, to determine the quantity from, if the Contractor neglect making them of the same size. The full quantity shall be spread before the first day of the SPRING ASSIZES in each year. The value of two cubic yards shall be deducted from the amount of the contract for each cubic yard remaining unspread afterwards. Any extra metalling required between SPRING and SUMMER ASSIZES, in the last year of a contract for surface repairs

shall be supplied and spread free of charge by the Contractor. Any materials required between the spreading of one year's quantity and the measurement of the next year's shall be put out free of charge by the Contractor, by darnings from carts.

All existing gulleys, inlets, outlets, with the tail drains from them, drains, water courses, and grips, on the field side, to be kept in repair and free for the water to pass through. When springs rise through the surface, French drains should be made to drain off the water to the next drain or trench. In case of a sudden damage occurring along the line, the Contractor is at once to give the Surveyor notice to that effect, describing the nature of the damage, and the Contractor shall build temporary fences and take such other precautions as the County Surveyor may judge to be necessary for the safety of the public. The fences along the line and slopes of cuttings and embankments to be kept in repair. The battlements and parapets of bridges on the road, with the wing walls, pavements, abutments, &c., to be protected and kept in their present repair, or as they may be hereafter repaired. The Contractor to cut down and remove all weeds growing along the road on and between the fences before seed time. Sea slopes and pitch pavement along coast roads to be kept in repair; snow drifts shall be removed immediately after a fall of snow.

The Contractor shall keep the road constantly free from all nuisances, and shall not permit any injury to or encroachment on the road, and shall summon and prosecute all offending parties. In case of injury to the road by trees or hedges, the Contractor is to require the owner of the land to prune and lop them—the parties to be summoned before the Justices at Petty Sessions, in case of non-compliance within Ten days. The Contractor will be held accountable for any loss or injury to property or persons from putting out materials of any kind on or alongside the road, digging of holes along the road; or neglecting any necessary precaution to prevent injury to the public during the continuance of his contract.

The Contractor shall deliver up the road at the expiration of his contract, in good repair as above defined, and at any time during the existence of his contract shall attend to and carry into effect, any further instructions the Surveyor may find it necessary to give for the due repair and preservation of the road. Any quantity of broken stones or gravel remaining unspread and found at the termination of the contract along the road shall become the property of the County.

HALF-YEARLY REPORT OF COUNTY ANALYSTS.

To the Grand Jury of the County of Louth.

MR. FOREMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

We beg to report that we have made the following analyses during the period which elapsed between the 1st day of June, and the 31st day of December, 1897.

For the Sergeants of the Royal Irish Constabulary, acting as Inspectors of Food, the following articles were analysed:—

June 29th—For Sergeant J. Currin, Westgate, 2 specimens of butter and 2 of whiskey were analysed. They were free from adulteration.

August 27th—Two specimens of whiskey, analysed for Sergeant T. Groves, Dundalk, were of good quality.

September 30th—For Sergeant J. Currin, Westgate, 2 specimens of whiskey and 1 of butter were analysed. They were not adulterated.

November 16th—For Sergeant W. G. M'Donough, Castlebellingham, 3 specimens of whiskey were analysed. One was 35 degrees under proof, and was therefore adulterated with 13.33 per cent. of added water.

September 20th—For the Guardians of Dundalk Union, 15 specimens of tea were analysed, to determine which were best for use in the Workhouse.

September 22nd—A specimen of milk, analysed for the Guardians of Ardee Union, was of the average quality of pure milk.

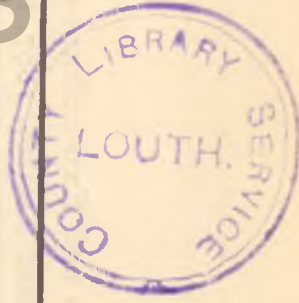

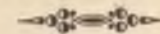

The Repairs shall be commenced immediately after the ensuing Assizes, and shall be proceeded with, without intermission, until the road shall have been put into the specified order.

The road shall have a clear carriage-way as wide as the existing fences or grips will permit, but in no place to be less than.....feet wide with gravel or broken stones: where less the road shall be brought to this width by widening and metalling, unless where fences, trenches, or footpaths interfere greater existing widths in the working surfaces shall be maintained.

The footpaths and paved water tables, except in towns placed under Commissioners appointed under the Towns' Improvement (Ireland) Act, shall be kept clean, gravelled, and maintained in their present state, or as they shall be hereafter reconstructed.

The road shall be kept in repair from water table to water-table, with broken stones or prepared gravel, and shall be brought to a regular convex curvilinear slope from the centre to the sides on the cross sections, comparatively flat at the crown, but steeper on the shoulders; all inequalities shall be reduced by applying new material to the lower parts. The sides and water tables shall be neatly defined by continuous lines, parallel to the centre of the road, free from sudden bends.

Along declivities particular attention will be required in keeping the cross section more convex than elsewhere to pass off the water quickly to the tables. Outlets, pipes, or French drains shall be made to carry off the water where it would otherwise lodge on the water-tables, into the adjacent grips, fields, or water-courses. Inlets shall be made into all cross-drains, pipes, or gulleys; all grips on the field side of the fences and water-drains, if any, shall be kept open to allow a free passage for the water, and keep its surface under the water-tables. The water-tables, shoulders, and sides of the road shall be kept free from nuisance and obstructions. The road shall be kept free from dust and mud by sweeping and scraping; the sweepings, and scrapings, when sufficiently dry, shall be carted off, unless required to fill grips along the road, or to complete the fences and side formation between the water-tables and fences. A sufficient quantity shall always be used for blending with newly spread stones or prepared gravel, especially in dry seasons. These materials shall be applied generally, in wet weather, when the low or concave parts are most visible. They shall be kept in close contact with each other, and when spread, sufficiently blended with sand or road scrapings. In Towns' and villages, the scrapings or sweepings and dust heaps from the road, shall be removed and carted away by the Contractor, but not the cleansing, sweeping, and scavenging in Towns under the Towns' Improvement Act, which must be done by the Town Commissioners.

All detached stones appearing on the road, or between the fences, and all stones appearing on the surface exceeding two-and-a-half inches in diameter, shall be picked up, collected, taken aside, made into heaps broken, and used for darning the surface.

....cubic yards, at least, of broken stone or properly prepared gravel, shall be spread skilfully on the road per perch, on the average in each year, exclusive of fine gravel used in footpaths. The stones shall be broken so as to pass through an inch and three-quarter ring, to be laid down as the Surveyor or his Assistant shall direct. The distribution of the metalling shall be proportionate to the wants of the road as the Assistant shall direct. When "sea beach" or gravel is the material used, it shall be screened from any extra sand, and the larger pebbles preserved and broken to pass through an inch and three-quarter ring. No round pebble to be larger than $1\frac{1}{4}$ inch ring. Any larger quantity of broken stones or prepared gravel which shall be found necessary for the proper repairs and maintenance of the road shall be put out and skilfully spread by the Contractor free of extra expense to the County or Barony. In towns and on streets the Contractor shall arrange with the Surveyor's Assistant to deliver and spread the specified least quantity from carts or depots, at such times and in such quantities as such Assistant shall direct. The most durable materials to be had in the neighbourhood shall be used—the hardest and toughest are best. No soft or brittle stone, shale, or pencil, shall be used in any place for repairs.

After the road shall have been scraped, the weak portions shall be darned with a sufficient quantity of broken stones, and a preparation shall be made by picking the crust, so that the new materials shall combine smoothly with the road and form a regular and smooth surface. In darning, the stones shall be laid close and in contact with each other. The surface shall be kept free from ruts and longitudinal furrows by timely and skilful repairs.

The Contractor shall put out along the sides of the road, or place in depots, the whole quantity of materials specified, from time to time before the first day of OCTOBER in each year, for measurement by the Surveyor's Assistant, unless when otherwise directed to be spread from carts for special repairs. A deduction of a yard and a-half will be made from the measured quantity for each yard deficient after the first of OCTOBER. No allowance will be made for stones spread out of any oblongs before measurement.

The stones shall be arranged along the County roads in narrow oblongs, placed on level bed, not exceeding two feet in width close up to fences or grips outside the water-tables, of equal size, and containing about a cubic yard each, and so as not to endanger or inconvenience the public.

The Assistant will measure the smaller heaps, to determine the quantity from, if the Contractor neglect making them of the same size. The full quantity shall be spread before the first day of the SPRING ASSIZES in each year. The value of two cubic yards shall be deducted from the amount of the contract for each cubic yard remaining unspread afterwards. Any extra metalling required between SPRING and SUMMER ASSIZES, in the last year of a contract for surface repairs

shall be supplied and spread free of charge by the Contractor. Any materials required between the spreading of one year's quantity and the measurement of the next year's shall be put out free of charge by the Contractor, by darnings from carts.

All existing gulleys, inlets, outlets, with the tail drains from them, drains, water courses, and grips, on the field side, to be kept in repair and free for the water to pass through. When springs rise through the surface, French drains should be made to drain off the water to the next drain or trench. In case of a sudden damage occurring along the line, the Contractor is at once to give the Surveyor notice to that effect, describing the nature of the damage, and the Contractor shall build temporary fences and take such other precautions as the County Surveyor may judge to be necessary for the safety of the public. The fences along the line and slopes of cuttings and embankments to be kept in repair. The battlements and parapets of bridges on the road, with the wing walls, pavements, abutments, &c., to be protected and kept in their present repair, or as they may be hereafter repaired. The Contractor to cut down and remove all weeds growing along the road on and between the fences before seed time. Sea slopes and pitch pavement along coast roads to be kept in repair; snow drifts shall be removed immediately after a fall of snow.

The Contractor shall keep the road constantly free from all nuisances, and shall not permit any injury to or encroachment on the road, and shall summon and prosecute all offending parties. In case of injury to the road by trees or hedges, the Contractor is to require the owner of the land to prune and lop them—the parties to be summoned before the Justices at Petty Sessions, in case of non-compliance within Ten days. The Contractor will be held accountable for any loss or injury to property or persons from putting out materials of any kind on or alongside the road, digging of holes along the road; or neglecting any necessary precaution to prevent injury to the public during the continuance of his contract.

The Contractor shall deliver up the road at the expiration of his contract, in good repair as above defined, and at any time during the existence of his contract shall attend to and carry into effect, any further instructions the Surveyor may find it necessary to give for the due repair and preservation of the road. Any quantity of broken stones or gravel remaining unspread and found at the termination of the contract along the road shall become the property of the County.

ORDER AND BY-LAWS FOR USE OF LOCOMOTIVES.

SPRING ASSIZES, 1882.

RESOLVED—That we approve of the following By-Laws for the regulation of the use of Locomotives upon the highways of the County, and Order that same be in force from this date, pursuant to the Public Health (Ireland) Amendment Act, 1879.

WHEREAS, by the 6th section of the above-mentioned Act, the Grand Jury of the County of Louth are empowered to make By-Laws as to the hours during which Locomotives are not to pass over any roads or highways situate within the said County of Louth, and being under the control of the said Grand Jury, being the roads within said County, exclusive of the Urban Sanitary Districts of the Borough of Dundalk; and for regulating the use of Locomotives upon any such highways, or preventing such use upon every bridge within the limits of said County, where the said Grand Jury is satisfied that such use would be attended with danger to the public, the Grand Jury hereby make the following By-Laws:—

1.—No Locomotive propelled by steam, or by other than animal power, shall be drawn, conducted, or allowed to pass through or over any road or highway, within the said County (exclusive of the Urban Sanitary District of the Borough of Dundalk), between the hours of 10 o'clock in the afternoon and 6 o'clock in the forenoon of any day, provided that this prohibition shall not apply to Locomotives known as Steam Road Rollers when in use for the purpose of making or repairing roads.

2.—Every Locomotive traversing any highway within the said County of Louth, but exclusive of the Urban Sanitary District of the Borough of Dundalk, shall have conspicuously affixed thereto two efficient red lights, one on each side in front of the same, so as to be visible from front and rear, and such lights shall be kept so as to show an efficient light during the period between sunset and sunrise, as also during all other periods when darkness may exist from fog or any other cause.

3.—The weight of every Locomotive (and name and address of the owner thereof) shall be painted in legible characters on some conspicuous part thereof.

4.—Every Locomotive while in motion shall be preceded by a person who, during all periods when lights are required to be affixed thereto, shall carry and display an efficient red light, at least 60 yards in advance of the Locomotive, and during all other periods shall at like distance carry and display a red flag.

5.—Where more than two waggons or vehicles of any kind are drawn by a Locomotive, then to the hindmost of them an efficient red light shall be conspicuously affixed and displayed during all such times as lights are required to be shown in front of the Locomotive.

6.—No Locomotive shall be driven upon or pass over the Obelisk Girder Bridge across the River Boyne.

These By-Laws confirmed by the Local Government Board for Ireland this 4th day of May, 1882.

SUMMER ASSIZES, 1898.

HALF-YEARLY REPORT OF COUNTY ANALYST

To the Grand Jury of the County of Louth.

MR. FOREMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

We beg to report that we have made the following analyses during the period which elapsed between the 1st day of January and the 31st day of May, 1898:—

For the Sergeants of the Royal Irish Constabulary, acting as Inspectors of Food, the following articles were analysed:—

January 1st—A specimen of whiskey analysed for Sergeant J. Currin, Westgate, was of good quality.

January 20th—For Sergeant W. G. M'Donough, Castlebellingham, two specimens of whiskey and a specimen of linseed meal were analysed. The whiskey specimens were pure. The linseed meal was not pure linseed meal, but was ground linseed cake, from which nearly all the oil had been abstracted.

February 17th—For Sergeant T. Groves, Dundalk, two specimens of butter, one of milk, and one of buttermilk, were analysed. The butters were of good quality; the milk was above the average quality of pure milk; the buttermilk was adulterated with 60 per cent. of added water, exclusive of 25 per cent. allowed for churning purposes.

March 8th—For Sergeant J. Currin, Westgate, a specimen of whiskey and a specimen of butter were analysed. They were free from adulteration.

April 1st—Two specimens of whiskey were analysed for Sergeant T. Griffin, Ardee. They were of good quality.

April 14th—For Sergeant T. Groves, Dundalk, four specimens of whiskey and a specimen of buttermilk were analysed. The specimens of whiskey were of good quality; the buttermilk was of fairly good quality.

HALF-YEARLY REPORT OF COUNTY ANALYST.

The 56 milks were remarkably good, being, without exception, of average or rich quality. The buttermilks were all of fair or good quality. Two of the butters were adulterated with excess of water of which they contained 18·2 and 18·26 per cent. respectively—16 per cent. being the maximum that should be permitted. The milk supplied to this Union must be of average quality, otherwise a fine is imposed on the contractor.

For the Guardians of Dundalk Union, 17 specimens of tea were analysed, to determine which was best for use in the Workhouse.

A specimen of water analysed for the Guardians of Ardee Union had the following compositions :—

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT.

To the Grand Jury of the County of Louth, assembled at Spring Assizes, 1899.

MR. CHAIRMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

On the Schedule there are two applications for new roads. As to No. 1, Ardee Barony, there is an unusually large area of land without a County road through it, and if this application were to be approved, the occupiers along the proposed line would still have only the average amount of accommodation. The Great Northern Railway Company contribute £200, but disclaim liability for widening the Railway Bridge at Dromin, which work is not included in the contract now set. The new road, No. 1, Upper Dundalk, would be a useful road to make, but the occupiers of land through which it runs are not so badly off as are some others in the Barony.

Under the Local Government (Ireland) Act, 1898, there are no other new works on the Schedule, and maintenance contracts which expire now and at next Summer Assizes are renewed for seven months and for three months, respectively, so as to be continued up to the 30th of September next.

The last Winter has been rather a bad season for roads, and there has been unusual neglect on the part of contractors, especially in the Barony of Louth. Seven contractors and their sureties were summoned to Petty Sessions and the orders made by the Magistrates to repair the roads were not in some cases obeyed in a proper manner.

On the 17th ulto., a Magistrates' Order for £40 was granted to repair a sudden damage done to Gyles' Quay. There has been time to expend only £32 1s. 11d. for which sum the Order must now be certified. I beg to recommend a Presentment for the balance £7 18s. 1d., together with £25, damage reported since the 17th ulto.

In August last the "Greenore Granite Quarries' Syndicate, Ltd." informed me that they intended to construct three quarters of a mile of tramway alongside the County road from their Quarry to the Bush

Railway Station. The tramway (which would have cost about £1500) has not been made and instead the Syndicate have adopted the cheaper plan of carrying stones in a pair of wagons, drawn by a road locomotive, making two trips per day over $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles of the County roads from their Quarry to Carlingford Harbour. In about four weeks work previous to December 24th last, when the locomotive stopped running, the roads were damaged to the extent of £400. For more than half-a-mile the six inch deep stone crust of the road was quite broken up and deep trenches were cut in the underlying clay which soon became a mass of puddle. When the road near the Bush became impassable the locomotive was sent round by Grange injuring another $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles of road. When a culvert was broken down on the Grange road the locomotive was sent round by Crossalancy injuring another $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles of the road. In addition to the direct road to Carlingford the Syndicate have at their mercy another 18 miles of roads to Carlingford and to Gyles' Quay.

The road contractors on the $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles of direct road to Carlingford are paid £48 per annum. They delivered the contract quantity of broken stones, value £24, and they kept the roads in good order up to November last, when the supply of stones was exhausted. Applications made in the usual manner for £170 to supply extra stones, were rejected at Special Sessions on the grounds (I think) that the damage already done was out of all reasonable proportion to ordinary wear and tear, and that it was impossible to estimate for future damage by an unknown number of locomotives over $22\frac{1}{2}$ miles of roads.

Your Solicitor took Counsel's opinion to the effect that the Syndicate have a right at Law to run their locomotives over any roads they please, and that the damage done to the roads must be repaired (if it is to be repaired at all) at the expense of the ratepayers. This bad state of the Law was remedied last year in England by an act which does not apply to Ireland. But Counsel also advises, that if persons along the roads have suffered special damage from the condition to which the roads have been reduced, any one of them, or any number of them, jointly, may institute proceedings in the Chancery Division, and Counsel does not see what possible answer there would be to the action.

The Syndicate have served me with notices of Actions at Law because for some weeks the roads were impassable for their locomotives; also they offered to supply stones and labour at their own expense.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT, SPRING ASSIZES, 1899.

It was a reckless thing to run this locomotive in December when the roads were very soft. Now, or during the Summer a locomotive does comparatively little damage. If the Grand Jury wish to encourage a Local Industry at the expense of the ratepayers (partly because the damage must be repaired at the expense of the ratepayers) and if the Syndicate were to put into a favourable shape their vague offer to supply stones, &c., and if they would undertake to use only $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles of direct road,—then, it might be advisable to present a reasonable sum of money for extra stones to keep the roads in repair up to September 30th next.

ORDER AND BYLAWS FOR USE OF LOCOMOTIVES

SPRING ASSIZES, 1882.

RESOLVED—That we approve of the following By-Laws for the regulation of the use of Locomotives upon the highways of the County, and Order that same be in force from this date, pursuant to the Public Health (Ireland) Amendment Act, 1879.

JOHN S. ROBINSON, Foreman of Grand Jury.

WHEREAS, by the 6th section of the above-mentioned Act, the Grand Jury of the County of Louth are empowered to make By-Laws as to the hours during which Locomotives are not to pass over any roads or highways situate within the said County of Louth, and being under the control of the said Grand Jury, being the roads within said County, exclusive of the Urban Sanitary Districts of the Borough of Dundalk; and for regulating the use of Locomotives upon any such highways, or preventing such use upon every bridge within the limits of said County, where the said Grand Jury is satisfied that such use would be attended with danger to the public, the Grand Jury hereby make the following By-Laws:—

1.—No Locomotive propelled by steam, or by other than animal power, shall be drawn, conducted, or allowed to pass through or over any road or highway, within the said County (exclusive of the Urban Sanitary District of the Borough of Dundalk), between the hours of 10 o'clock in the afternoon and 6 o'clock in the forenoon of any day, provided that this prohibition shall not apply to Locomotives known as Steam Road Rollers when in use for the purpose of making or repairing roads.

2.—Every Locomotive traversing any highway within the said County of Louth, but exclusive of the Urban Sanitary District of the Borough of Dundalk, shall have conspicuously affixed thereto two efficient red lights, one on each side in front of the same, so as to be visible from front and rear, and such lights shall be kept so as to show an efficient light during the period between sunset and sunrise, as also during all other periods when darkness may exist from fog or any other cause.

3.—The weight of every Locomotive (and name and address of the owner thereof) shall be painted in legible characters on some conspicuous part thereon.

4.—Every Locomotive while in motion shall be preceded by a person who, during all periods when lights are required to be affixed thereto, shall carry and display an efficient red light, at least 60 yards in advance of the Locomotive, and during all other periods shall at like distance carry and display a red flag.

5.—Where more than two waggons or vehicles of any kind are drawn by a Locomotive, then to the hindmost of them an efficient red light shall be conspicuously affixed and displayed during all such times as lights are required to be shown in front of the Locomotive.

6.—No Locomotive shall be driven upon or pass over the Obelisk Girder Bridge across the River Boyne.

These By-Laws confirmed by the Local Government Board for Ireland this 4th day of May, 1882.

Blank copy of COUNTY SURVEYOR'S SPECIFICATION for repairs of roads, ordered to be printed in the Grand Warrant.

The Repairs shall be commenced immediately after the ensuing Assizes, and shall be proceeded with, without intermission, until the road shall have been put into the specified order.

The road shall have a clear carriage-way as wide as the existing fences or grips will permit, but in no place to be less than.....feet wide with gravel or broken stones: where less the road shall be brought to this width by widening and metalling, unless where fences, trenches, or footpaths interfere greater existing widths in the working surfaces shall be maintained.

The footpaths and paved water-tables, except in towns placed under Commissioners appointed under the Towns' Improvement (Ireland) Act, shall be kept clean, gravelled, and maintained in their present state, or as they shall be hereafter reconstructed.

The road shall be kept in repair from water-table to water-table, with broken stones or prepared gravel, and shall be brought to a regular convex curvilinear slope from the centre to the sides on the cross sections, comparatively flat at the crown, but steeper on the shoulders; all inequalities shall be reduced by applying new material to the lower parts. The sides and water-tables shall be neatly defined by continuous lines, parallel to the centre of the road, free from sudden bends.

Along declivities particular attention will be required in keeping the cross section more convex than elsewhere to pass off the water quickly to the tables. Outlets, pipes, or French drains shall be made to carry off the water where it would otherwise lodge on the water-tables, into the adjacent grips, fields, or water-courses. Inlets shall be made into all cross-drains, pipes, or gulleys; all grips on the field side of the fences and water-drains, if any, shall be kept open to allow a free passage for the water, and keep its surface under the water-tables. The water-tables, shoulders, and sides of the road shall be kept free from nuisance and obstructions. The road shall be kept free from dust and mud by sweeping and scraping; the sweepings, and scrapings, when sufficiently dry, shall be carted off, unless required to fill grips along the road, or to complete the fences and side formation between the water-tables and fences. A sufficient quantity shall always be used for blending with newly spread stones or prepared gravel, especially in dry seasons. These materials shall be applied generally, in wet weather, when the low or concave parts are most visible. They shall be kept in close contact with each other, and when spread, sufficiently blended with sand or road scrapings. In Towns' and villages, the scrapings or sweepings and dust heaps from the road, shall be removed and carted away by the Contractor, but not the cleansing, sweeping, and scavenging in Towns under the Towns' Improvement Act, which must be done by the Town Commissioners.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S SPECIFICATION FOR REPAIR OF ROADS

All detached stones appearing on the road, or between the fences, and all stones appearing on the surface exceeding two-and-a-half inches in diameter, shall be picked up, collected, taken aside, made into heaps broken, and used for darning the surface.

.....cubic yards, at least, of broken stone or properly prepared gravel, shall be spread skilfully on the road per perch, on the average in each year, exclusive of fine gravel used in footpaths. The stones shall be broken so as to pass through an inch and three-quarter ring, to be laid down as the Surveyor or his Assistant shall direct. The distribution of the metalling shall be proportionate to the wants of the road as the Assistant shall direct. When "sea beach" or gravel is the material used, it shall be screened from any extra sand, and the larger pebbles preserved and broken to pass through an inch and three-quarter ring. No round pebble to be larger than $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch ring. Any larger quantity of broken stones or prepared gravel which shall be found necessary for the proper repairs and maintenance of the road shall be put out and skilfully spread by the Contractor free of extra expense to the County or Barony. In towns and on streets the Contractor shall arrange with the Surveyor's Assistant to deliver and spread the specified least quantity from carts or depots, at such times and in such quantities as such Assistant shall direct. The most durable materials to be had in the neighbourhood shall be used—the hardest and toughest are best. No soft or brittle stone, shale, or pencil, shall be used in any place for repairs.

After the road shall have been scraped, the weak portions shall be darned with a sufficient quantity of broken stones, and a preparation shall be made by picking the crust, so that the new materials shall combine smoothly with the road and form a regular and smooth surface. In darning, the stones shall be laid close and in contact with each other. The surface shall be kept free from ruts and longitudinal furrows by timely and skilful repairs.

The Contractor shall put out along the sides of the road, or place in depots, the whole quantity of materials specified, from time to time before the first day of OCTOBER in each year, for measurement by the Surveyor's Assistant, unless when otherwise directed to be spread from carts for special repairs. A deduction of a yard and a-half will be made from the measured quantity for each yard deficient after the first of OCTOBER. No allowance will be made for stones spread out of any oblongs before measurement.

The stones shall be arranged along the County roads in narrow oblongs, placed on level beds, not exceeding two feet in width close up to fences or grips outside the water-tables, of equal size, and containing about a cubic yard each, and so as not to endanger or inconvenience the public.

The Assistant will measure the smaller heaps, to determine the quantity from, if the Contractor neglect making them of the same size. The full quantity shall be spread before the first day of the Spring Assizes in each year. The value of two cubic yards shall be deducted from the amount of the contract for each cubic yard remaining unspread afterwards. Any extra metalling required between Spring and SUMMER ASSIZES, in the last year of a contract for surface repairs

shall be supplied and spread free of charge by the Contractor. Any materials required between the spreading of one year's quantity and the measurement of the next year's shall be put out free of charge by the Contractor, by darnings from carts.

All existing gulleys, inlets, outlets, with the tail drains from them, drains, water courses, and grips, on the field side, to be kept in repair and free for the water to pass through. When springs rise through the surface, French drains should be made to drain off the water to the next drain or trench. In case of a sudden damage occurring along the line, the Contractor is at once to give the Surveyor notice to that effect, describing the nature of the damage, and the Contractor shall build temporary fences and take such other precautions as the County Surveyor may judge to be necessary for the safety of the public. The fences along the line and slopes of cuttings and embankments to be kept in repair. The battlements and parapets of bridges on the road, with the wing walls, pavements, abutments, &c., to be protected and kept in their present repair, or as they may be hereafter repaired. The Contractor to cut down and remove all weeds growing along the road on and between the fences before seed time. Sea slopes and pitch pavement along coast roads to be kept in repair; snow drifts shall be removed immediately after a fall of snow.

The Contractor shall keep the road constantly free from all nuisances, and shall not permit any injury to or encroachment on the road, and shall summon and prosecute all offending parties. In case of injury to the road by trees or hedges, the Contractor is to require the owner of the land to prune and lop them—the parties to be summoned before the Justices at Petty Sessions, in case of non-compliance within Ten days. The Contractor will be held accountable for any loss or injury to property or persons from putting out materials of any kind on or alongside the road, digging of holes along the road; or neglecting any necessary precaution to prevent injury to the public during the continuance of his contract.

The Contractor shall deliver up the road at the expiration of his contract, in good repair as above defined, and at any time during the existence of his contract shall attend to and carry into effect, any further instructions the Surveyor may find it necessary to give for the due repair and preservation of the road. Any quantity of broken stones or gravel remaining unspread and found at the termination of the contract along the road shall become the property of the County.
