COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT.

To the Grand Jury of the County of Louth, assembled at Spring Assizes, 1872.

GENTLEMEN,

The Presentments for road works in the past year amounted to £9,366 Os. 10d., there being 584 miles under contract. The like amount in 1861 was £11,763, the number of miles being then 544, which shows an increase of 40 miles and a reduction of £2,763 in the total expenditure. For repairs and maintenance alone, separated from all other work, the cost in the past year was £8,010; the like cost in 1861 was £9,972, showing an annual reduction of £1,962 in this the most important item of expenditure, notwithstanding the increase of 40 miles in the amount of the work done. The cost and details for the past year are given in the accompanying table No. 1, and a comparison with the two previous years in table No. 2. It will be perceived that the increase in mileage and decrease in expenditure has been gradual, but subject from year to year to those fluctuations inseparable from the system and dependent so much on the temper of local competition. As the value of labour has been going up during the past ten years, I consider an annual saving of about £2,000 has been fairly effected in that special item of expenditure, which must always continue, and be the heaviest on the cesspayers.

The County Works have been generally kept in very good order by your road contractors, notwithstanding the wetness of the winter. At the last road sessions, however, I felt constrained to withhold a much larger number of certificates than was usual for some years past, and the effect has been a pretty general improvement.

The competition for several road contracts at the last adjourned baronial road sessions was more active than usual. No. 8, Ardee, is contracted for at 50 per cent. below the price sanctioned. No. 1, Drogheda, at 30 per cent., and would have been taken at less if the first and second parties had not been, probably, in collusion. No. 5, Upper Dundalk, at 35 per cent. No. 2, Ferrard, 35 per cent.; and Nos. 3 and 4, Louth, at 25 per cent. No tender was received for No. 3, Lower Dundalk, for which the price allowed was proportionately as large as for No. 5 in the same barony, and for which three tenders were lodged, two of them differing by 37 per cent. Most of the Grand Jury are, however, cognisant of the practices at adjourned road sessions, and I refer to these practices now because they are again beginning to assume an unhealthy aspect. I shall, where necessary, as the new presentments are called over, report further.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT.

*To the Grand Jury of the County of Louth assembled at
Summer Assizes, 1872.*

GENTLEMEN,

The contract roads and other County works are in good order generally; and notwithstanding an increase of 40 miles within the last ten years, the yearly cost of maintenance has been reduced by about £2000 in the same time.

The applications for new works on the schedule call for no special report, with the exception of No. 1 in the Barony of Lower Dundalk, for completing the new road from Grange to Narrow-water, through the Carlingford mountains, by the Big Woman's Grave, which was begun as a relief work in 1846. This road has been, as far as opened, of great benefit to the adjoining farmers, and when completed will be a very valuable reproductive work to the district.

The competition for contracts at the Adjourned Road Sessions still continues very irregular. For some contracts no tenders, and for others as many as nine; and its spirit appears not so much guided by the prices allowed, as by a feeling of opposition or support to the applicants or to the former contractors.

Ordered—That William M'Alester, the contractor for Contract No. 19, Barony of Upper Dundalk, at the present Assizes, and his Sureties, be handed over to the Sessional Crown Solicitor for prosecution, as recommended by the County Surveyor in his Report.

Resolved—That owing to the illness of one of his Assistants, we authorise the County Surveyor to engage until Summer Assizes next, an extra Assistant, at a remuneration of £80 per annum, should he consider it necessary for the public service and his own protection to do so.

We direct that the salary of Mr. John Pansing, Second Assistant to the County Surveyor, be increased from £65 to £75 per annum.

We, the Grand Jury of the County of Louth, having taken into consideration the Jurors' Act, 34th and 35th Victoria, chapter 65, hereby beg to express our disapproval of the measure, inasmuch as by lowering the Qualification, it has provided an inferior class of Jurors, at the same time entailing great additional expenses on the County Rates.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT.

To the Grand Jury of the County of Louth, assembled at Spring Assizes, 1873.

GENTLEMEN,

The amount presented for all works, during the past year, in this County, was £9336 1s. 10d. The number of miles of roads repaired, and maintained, was 574; and the cost, under this head, £8261 8s. 7d. Comparing this expenditure with that of 1862, ten years ago, there is an annual decrease of £1235 7s. in the cost of repairs, and maintenance, notwithstanding an increase of 23 miles in the mileage. Tables showing the details of expenditure in each Barony, and a comparison of the past three years, are attached as a part of this report.

There are some applications on the Schedule for repairing, and re-modelling old local, or farm, roads. Considering the large increase in the mileage under maintenance for the last thirty-two years, I think those applications should be considered with reference to that increase, and future expense, as well as to the heavy first-cost now necessary to put such roads in anything like good order.

The competition for contracts of maintenance continues irrespective of any fixed scale; a few roads being left without any contractors, and a few more taken at rates which cannot pay. I see but one result—the work badly done, stoppage of payment, and complaints, so far as such contracts apply, on all sides.

Owing to the increase of work, but principally to the increasing age and state of health of one or two of the Assistant Surveyors, I find it necessary to ask for an extra Assistant, for some time at least,

and in doing so I beg to recommend the second Assistant to your consideration for the full amount of salary—£80—allowed by the Act. From time to time the younger, and better qualified Assistants in this County, resigned their appointments, the salary being insufficient to retain them; and I believe it for the interests of the County that for the future the full salary should be paid—even more if the law permitted.

The roads, and road works through the County, are generally in good order, notwithstanding the severity of the past season. The increased price of labour prevented some, I believe, from keeping the necessary men at work; but the better contractors, at the head of whom is Mr. John Coulter, did their contracts very satisfactorily.

I beg to recommend that the contractors and sureties for No. 19 on the Schedule, Barony of Upper Dundalk, shall be sued for breach of contract.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT.

To the Grand Jury of the County of Louth assembled at Summer Assizes, 1873.

GENTLEMEN—There are but two applications on the Schedule to which I now beg especially to call your attention. These are No. 4 in the Barony of Ardee, and No. 18 in the Barony of Ferrard. Only one terminus of each road is on a County road, and their approval, under this circumstance, would, in my judgment, form a precedent injurious to the general interests of the County. The roads in question would be useful to a large number of neighbouring occupiers: to make them so to the public, the termini of each should abut on two County roads. In their present state they are simply farm or townland roads, with only one end open, and if sanctioned, a precedent would be established for repairing any cart-way.

It is true that Presentments for the repairs of roads terminating at graveyards have been sanctioned in this County. Presentments for roads terminating at the sea are common. Also, in the Barony of Ferrard, instances have occurred of presentments for roads terminating at mills. But graveyards have claims on all; the sea is itself a highway; and the mill cases I trust will not be repeated. It is, however, for the Grand Jury alone, under legal advice if necessary, to sanction or reject the application of such instances as these to the general question of the repairs of farm roads, with only one outlet, at the expense of the Baronies.

Competition at Adjourned Road Sessions continues without any due reference to a standard value; there being considerable competition in some cases, and in others, at the same prices, none. At Road Sessions the Justices and Cesspayers have been most considerate in the prices allowed. The population of the County in 1841 was 112,003: in 1871 it had come down, by gradual reduction, to 69,809; and as the difference arises principally from the diminution of the numbers of the labouring classes, the cause for the higher prices of all sorts of labour is manifest.

One of the Assistant Surveyor's continues unable, from illness, to perform his duties. In the meantime I have engaged Mr. Patrick Henry, in accordance with the Grand Jury order of last Assizes, to do his work, but at a lesser salary for the present than sanctioned.

In order to protect the rights of the public in the quaysage of Carlingford pier and roadway, which has been trespassed on, by one party especially, I have found it necessary to summon the offender, and I have to ask your assistance to prevent that which is public property becoming by usage a private right—I am, Gentlemen, your obedient servant,
