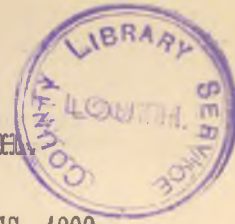

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT.

To the Grand Jury of the County of Louth, assembled at Spring Assizes, 1892.

COLONEL SIR JOHN ROBINSON AND GENTLEMEN,

Many of the County roads have been in much worse order during the last two months than at any time for many years. Most of them were softened down to the clay by alternate frost and rain ; and on many occasions all work was stopped by hard frost for the greater part of a day—rain coming down in the afternoon, again succeeded by frost at night.

The post road from Dundalk to Louth ; three miles of the Dublin road from Dundalk to Fane Bridge ; and three miles of the post road from Drogheda to Collon, were very badly cut up, and shewed clearly that in each case the crust or gravelled surface of the road is worn down so thin as to be unsafe in bad weather. This wearing down is due to the fact that the specified quantity of broken stone is not sufficient, and is not owing to neglect on the part of the Contractors, who have supplied the full specified quantity in each year. Each of these roads has from seven to nine inches depth of crust, which is generally considered sufficient, but it is evident from the way in which they cut up that the lower half is so mixed with clay as to be of little use. It could plainly be seen for the last four years that the Dublin road (from Dundalk to Fane Bridge) was wearing down, as clay shewed through the surface in weak places every Winter. The contract on this road was renewed last Summer, and I succeeded in getting the price and the quantity of materials increased, but the increase was not at all sufficient. This road was in such bad order that if there had been a less number of men at work, or if bad weather had continued a little longer, it would have been necessary to stop traffic and close the road.

To prevent the occurrence of a similar or worse condition of things next Winter, it will be necessary to apply for Presentments at next Special Sessions to supply large quantities of extra materials on these three roads.

Since last Assizes, in cases of urgency, I ordered summonses against eight Contractors and their Sureties. The orders made by the Magistrates were fairly carried out in three cases, and it

would be better, I think, to break the other five contracts instead of proceeding at Petty Sessions for Decrees, as it appears to me to be hopeless to expect any substantial improvement from these Contractors. Annexed is a list of eleven contracts (including the above) which ought to be broken (by prosecution at Quarter Sessions or by consent) on account of continued neglect.

At last Special Sessions for Upper Dundalk Barony I was directed to take legal proceedings against the owner of a house which had been built within thirty feet from the centre of a public road. At Petty Sessions the case was dismissed on the ground that a house means a dwelling-house, and that the penalties described in the Summary Jurisdiction Act do not apply to any other building. If this decision holds good, any person may build a store, stable, mill, shop, or factory, as close as he pleases to a public road, and six months after construction such buildings (with or without alteration) may be used as dwelling-houses. The law on this subject must become a dead letter, and it will be useless to take proceedings in such cases unless you think it desirable to instruct your Solicitor to carry a test case to a higher Court.

As to new works on the Schedule:—No 1 in Drogheda Barony is a Presentment for £160 for repairing a road from Hardman's gardens to Newfoundwell. This road is said to have been repaired by the County about fifty years ago, but as it will require to be re-constructed it comes up for exhibition only, to be considered again at next May Special Sessions. No. 4, Ardee Barony, includes two branches never previously repaired by the County, which ought to be separately presented as new roads. No. 8, Ferrard Barony, is a Presentment for repairing for five years thirty perches of road leading to a Church gate. This road will be of use to only one Parish, and to only one religious denomination in that Parish, it will not be of use to the public at large and therefore, in my opinion, the Presentment is illegal.

My senior Assistant, Mr. Miles, died in December last, after eight years faithful service. I have temporarily filled up the vacancy, and the appointment now comes before you for consideration.

Five Magistrates orders for expenditure in cases of sudden damage by floods and high tides have to be accounted at this Assizes. This is very unusual, as there were, I believe, only three Magistrates' orders applied for in the previous five years.

Such orders generally refer to masonry work in bridges, culverts and sea-walls, and there is greater security in having such works done by day labour, under a Magistrates' order, rather than by contract. As a rule, however, repairs to bridges, &c., are closely looked after at Special Sessions, and the works are set by contract to the lowest tender, a method more satisfactory to the Ceaspayers.

For the last five months two old barges have been lying in Clogher Head Harbour, forming a dangerous obstruction. The Harbour Constable several times called on the owners to remove these barges, and then applied for summonses against them. The Clerk of Petty Sessions, however, declined to issue summonses, stating that the Harbour Constable should remove the barges and proceed against the owners at Quarter Sessions to recover the cost of removal; a course which is not practicable. I beg to suggest that your Solicitor should be instructed to take legal proceedings in this case. When a precedent is once established the Harbour Constables will probably be able to deal with such cases without legal assistance.

MR. FOREMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I beg leave to report that I have made the following analysis during the half-year ended on the 31st December, 1891.

The following articles were analysed for the Guardians of Dundalk Union:—

The teas were analysed with the view of determining which were best for use in the Workhouse. Of the other articles only one, a specimen of milk, was certified to be adulterated, but several of the milk specimens were much below the average quality of that article. The waters were unfavourably reported on.

For Drogheda Union, which is partly situated in the County of Louth, 157 samples of milk and 2 of water were analysed. It seems that the contractors who supply milk to the Guardians of this Union are fined whenever my analysis shews that it falls below the average quality of that article. On the whole the milk was generally above rather than below the average quality, and in only one instance did I certify as to actual adulteration of the milk.

Two specimens of water and one of linseed cake were analysed for private persons at nominal fees.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT.

To the Grand Jury of the County of Louth, assembled at Summer Assizes, 1892.

Col. Sir JOHN S. ROBINSON AND GENTLEMEN,

At last Assizes eleven Road Contractors were recommended for prosecution ; three of these Contractors put their roads into good order before May Quarter Sessions. In one case where the Contractor lives in Armagh County, it was ascertained when too late that the Bonds should have been sent to the Crown Solicitor of Armagh, and the Contractor has since then improved his road considerably. In the remaining seven cases the contracts were broken, and Decrees for costs and for small penalties were made against the Contractors.

The New Works approved of at last Special Sessions include a new road from Newfoundwell to Hardman's gardens (No. 1 in Drogheda Barony), to cost £130. Also, Presentments were passed for extra quantities of broken stones on the main roads referred to in my Report at last Assizes (Nos. 6, 7, and 8 in Upper Dundalk, No. 13 in Ferrard, and No. 7 in Louth Barony). At Adjourned Sessions no tenders were received for any of these works, which were re-advertised (the quantities being reduced) so as, if possible, to have Contractors declared at this Assizes. The remaining new works on the Schedule are all of a useful character, except No. 9 Upper Dundalk Barony, which, in my opinion, will be of no use to the public and ought to be rejected.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT, SUMMER ASSIZES, 1892.

Thirty-five road maintenance contracts are to be renewed at this Assizes. In three cases no tenders were received. Contracts were made in the remaining thirty-two cases at a total annual cost of £1450 7s. 9d., as compared with £1317 2s. 9d. the annual cost of the same thirty-two roads for the last five years. The very unusual increase in cost (nearly 10 per cent.) is due chiefly to the fact that three first class roads and three minor roads near the sea coast (20 miles of road in all) which were formerly repaired with gravel from the sea beach, are now specified to be repaired with broken stone, from which a considerable improvement may be expected. Also, in cases where contracts have been broken, the amounts allowed by the Special Sessions have not been cut down by Contractors in tendering to the same extent as on former occasions.

The Great Northern Railway Company's road diversion at Faughart level crossing is nearly completed and the old road has been closed. The question ought to be settled as to whether the new road (38 perches in length as compared with 40 perches of old road closed up) will be taken over by the County, or whether the Railway Company are bound to maintain it.

HALF-YEARLY REPORT OF PUBLIC ANALYST.

To the Grand Jury of the County of Louth.

MR. FOREMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I beg leave to report for your information that I have made the following analyses during the half-year ended on the 30th June, 1892.

For Drogheda Union, which is partly situated in the County of Louth, 79 analyses of new milk and 32 of buttermilk were made. Many of them were below the average quality of milk, but I only certified in one case actual adulteration. I am informed that the contractors who supply milk to the Drogheda Workhouse are fined so much according as the milk is described as "poor," "very poor," and on the whole the Workhouse milk—formerly of very bad quality as a rule—is now very good.

For Dundalk Union there were analysed 13 specimens of tea, 17 of new milk, and 4 of buttermilk. The teas were analysed with the view of selecting the best for use in the Workhouse, and for ascertaining whether or not the supply of the article was equal in quality to the sample accepted on tender. Of the milk samples 5 were above the average quality of milk, 10 were more or less poor, and 2 were adulterated with 10 and 14 per cent. of water respectively. One of the specimens of buttermilk was adulterated with 20 per cent. of water.

For Ardee Union a sample of butter and a specimen of milk were analysed. The former was pure, the latter was adulterated with 20 per cent. of water.

Inspector I. Curran, Dundalk, sent for analysis 3 specimens of butter, 6 of new milk, and one of buttermilk. All were pure, except a specimen of milk which contained 13 per cent. of added water.

MR. CHAIRMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

At Special Sessions two Presentments were passed (for exhibition) for New Roads. No. 1 Upper Dundalk, and No. 1 Lower Dundalk. The Special Works are all of a useful character except No. 5 Upper Dundalk, which was passed for the convenience of a householder injured by a new Hill Cutting, and not directly in the interests of the Public.

repeatedly advertised for contract without effect) were presented in my name. The sum of £457 5s. 6d. has now been expended, to which must be added £97 6s. 0d. (or 22 per cent.) expended on Steam Rolling—total £554 11s. 6d. Against Steam Rolling are charged the hire of Roller (including wages of driver and flag man, cost of coal, oil, &c.), and the hire of a watering cart and horse with driver. I have no doubt that the Roller paid for itself in road metal, at least 22 per cent. of which would have been ground to powder, and wasted, before it could be rolled smooth by public traffic in the ordinary way.

Half-yearly Report of County Analyst.

To the Grand Jury of the County of Louth,

MR. FOREMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I beg leave to report that I have made the following Analyses during the half-year ended on the 31st December, 1892.

Nine specimens of milk, 19 of tea, and 2 of water, were analysed for the Guardians of the Dundalk Union; 7 of the milk samples were of good quality, and 2 were very poor and doubtful. The teas were analysed with the object of determining which were best for use in the Workhouse. One of the specimens of water was of moderately fair quality, but the other was polluted and quite unfit for use.

A specimen of water sent by Mr. A. H. Wynne, J.P.—colour was unfavourably reported upon.

For the Guardians of Ardee Union, there were analysed, specimens of milk and buttermilk, and one of water; the two former were of fair quality, the water was a second class one.

For Drogheda Union, there were analysed 102 specimens of milk and buttermilk, 3 of butter, and 6 of water, many of the samples of milk were below the standard or average quality of that article, but only one was so poor that I could certify that it was adulterated. The Guardians of this Union imposes fines upon the milk Contractors, whose milk is certified to be below the average quality—the natural result of this procedure is, that the milk as a rule, is of good quality; the specimens of butter were pure. Of the six specimens of water sent, not one was up to the standard of the best waters, whilst one was highly polluted and unfit for use.

Total numbers of analyses made 136. Total numbers analysed in 1892, 292.

Of the food samples, 16 were adulterated.

At the present, two important questions are at issue as to the provisions of additional accommodation, owing to the large increase of lunacy in the Metropolitan, as distinct from the County area. This County, in common with Wicklow, is called on to contribute a sum of about £150,000 for an additional Asylum, while the beds to which they are entitled are not fully occupied by patients from them, but by City of Dublin patients. There are also important questions as to the terms of Building Loans, in which a conflict of interest may arise between the City and County contributory areas.

This application has been previously respectfully laid before the Government, and if it should again be disregarded, the Grand Jury may have no option, but to withdraw from making any future representation on the subject.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT.

To the Grand Jury of the County of Louth assembled at Summer Assizes, 1893.

MR. RUXTON AND GENTLEMEN,

As ordered at last Assizes, proceedings were taken at April Quarter Sessions against twelve Road Contractors, and in each case the contracts were broken.

The Schedule includes two new roads—No. 1, Upper Dundalk ; and No. 1, Lower Dundalk, exhibited at last Assizes.

The Presentment No. 16, Upper Dundalk, is for the purpose of diverting water out of its natural course on to a first-class County road. The work would be a permanent injury to the road, and could not be of any use except to the occupier of the adjacent land.

From a recent decision it would appear that it is an indictable offence to set up barbed wire in fences along public roads. There are several such cases in this County, and the practice is rapidly extending. If legal action is to be taken in the matter, it would be advisable to instruct your Solicitor to carry a test case to the higher courts, if necessary.

of roads, ordered to be printed in the Grand Warrant.

County of Louth.—Barony of.....No.....Assizes.—Specification and Instructions to Repair and keep in Repair until.....Assizes,..... with BROKEN STONE or PREPARED GRAVEL,.....Perches of the road from.....to.....between.....and.....

The Repairs shall be commenced immediately after the ensuing Assizes, and shall be proceeded with, without intermission, until the road shall have been put into the specified order.

The road shall have a clear carriage-way as wide as the existing fences or grips will permit, but in no place to be less than.....feet wide with gravel or broken stones: where less the road shall be brought to this width by widening and metalling, unless where fences, trenches, or footpaths interfere greater existing widths in the working surfaces shall be maintained.

The footpaths and paved water tables, except in towns placed under Commissioners appointed under the Towns' Improvement (Ireland) Act, shall be kept clean, gravelled, and maintained in their present state, or as they shall be hereafter reconstructed.

The road shall be kept in repair from water-table to water-table, with broken stones or prepared gravel, and shall be brought to a regular convex curvilinear slope from the centre to the sides on the cross sections, comparatively flat at the crown, but steeper on the shoulders; all inequalities shall be reduced by applying new material to the lower parts. The sides and water-tables shall be neatly defined by continuous lines, parallel to the centre of the road, free from sudden bends.

Along declivities particular attention will be required in keeping the cross section more convex than elsewhere to pass off the water quickly to the tables. Outlets, pipes, or French drains shall be made to carry off the water where it would otherwise lodge on the water-tables, into the adjacent grips, fields, or water-courses. Inlets shall be made into all cross-drains, pipes, or gulleys; all grips on the field side of the fences and water-drains, if any, shall be kept open to allow a free passage for the water, and keep its surface under the water-tables. The water-tables, shoulders, and sides of the road shall be kept free from nuisance and obstructions. The road shall be kept free from dust and mud by sweeping and scraping; the sweepings, and scrapings, when sufficiently dry, shall be carted off, unless required to fill grips along the road, or to complete the fences and side formation between the water-tables and fences. A sufficient quantity shall always be used for blending with newly spread stones or prepared gravel, especially in dry seasons. These materials shall be applied generally, in wet weather, when the low or concave parts are most visible. They shall be kept in close contact with each other, and when spread, sufficiently blended with sand or road scrapings. In Towns' and villages, the scrapings or sweepings and dust heaps from the road, shall be removed and carted away by the Contractor, but not the cleansing, sweeping, and scavenging in Towns under the Towns' Improvement Act, which must be done by the Town Commissioners.

All detached stones appearing on the road, or between the fences, and all stones appearing on the surface exceeding two-and-a-half inches in diameter, shall be picked up, collected, taken aside, made into heaps broken, and used for darning the surface.

.....cubic yards, at least, of broken stone or properly prepared gravel, shall be spread skilfully on the road per perch, on the average in each year, exclusive of fine gravel used in footpaths. The stones shall be broken so as to pass through an inch and three-quarter ring, to be laid down as the Surveyor or his Assistant shall direct. The distribution of the metalling shall be proportionate to the wants of the road as the Assistant shall direct. When "sea beach" or gravel is the material used, it shall be screened from any extra sand, and the larger pebbles preserved and broken to pass through an inch and three-quarter ring. No round pebble to be larger than $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch ring. Any larger quantity of broken stones or prepared gravel which shall be found necessary for the proper repairs and maintenance of the road shall be put out and skilfully spread by the Contractor free of extra expense to the County or Barony. In towns and on streets the Contractor shall arrange with the Surveyor's Assistant to deliver and spread the specified least quantity from carts or depots, at such times and in such quantities as such Assistant shall direct. The most durable materials to be had in the neighbourhood shall be used—the hardest and toughest are best. No soft or brittle stone, shale, or pencil, shall be used in any place for repairs.

After the road shall have been scraped, the weak portions shall be darned with a sufficient quantity of broken stones, and a preparation shall be made by picking the crust, so that the new materials shall combine smoothly with the road and form a regular and smooth surface. In darning, the stones shall be laid close and in contact with each other. The surface shall be kept free from ruts and longitudinal furrows by timely and skilful repairs.

The Contractor shall put out along the sides of the road, or place in depots, the whole quantity of materials specified, from time to time before the first day of OCTOBER in each year, for measurement by the Surveyor's Assistant, unless when otherwise directed to be spread from carts for special repairs. A deduction of a yard and a-half will be made from the measured quantity for each yard deficient after the first of OCTOBER. No allowance will be made for stones spread out of any oblongs before measurement.

The stones shall be arranged along the County roads in narrow oblongs, placed on level beds, not exceeding two feet in width close up to fences or grips outside the water-tables, of equal size, and containing about a cubic yard each, and so as not to endanger or inconvenience the public.

The Assistant will measure the smaller heaps, to determine the quantity from, if the Contractor neglect making them of the same size. The full quantity shall be spread before the first day of the SPRING ASSIZES in each year. The value of two cubic yards shall be deducted from the amount of the contract for each cubic yard remaining unspread afterwards. Any extra metalling required between SPRING and SUMMER ASSIZES, in the last year of a contract for surface repairs

shall be supplied and spread free of charge by the Contractor. Any materials required between the spreading of one year's quantity and the measurement of the next year's shall be put out free of charge by the Contractor, by darnings from carts.

All existing gulleets, inlets, outlets, with the tall drains from them, drains, water courses, and grips, on the field side, to be kept in repair and free for the water to pass through. When springs rise through the surface, French drains should be made to drain off the water to the next drain or trench. In case of a sudden damage occurring along the line, the Contractor is at once to give the Surveyor notice to that effect, describing the nature of the damage, and the Contractor shall build temporary fences and take such other precautions as the County Surveyor may judge to be necessary for the safety of the public. The fences along the line and slopes of cuttings and embankments to be kept in repair. The battlements and parapets of bridges on the road, with the wing walls, pavements, abutments, &c., to be protected and kept in their present repair, or as they may be hereafter repaired. The Contractor to cut down and remove all weeds growing along the road on and between the fences before seed time. Sea slopes and pitch pavement along coast roads to be kept in repair; snow drifts shall be removed immediately after a fall of snow.

The Contractor shall keep the road constantly free from all nuisances, and shall not permit any injury to or encroachment on the road, and shall summon and prosecute all offending parties. In case of injury to the road by trees or hedges, the Contractor is to require the owner of the land to prune and lop them—the parties to be summoned before the Justices at Petty Sessions, in case of non-compliance within Ten days. The Contractor will be held accountable for any loss or injury to property or persons from putting out materials of any kind on or alongside the road, digging of holes along the road; or neglecting any necessary precaution to prevent injury to the public during the continuance of his contract.

The Contractor shall deliver up the road at the expiration of his contract, in good repair as above defined, and at any time during the existence of his contract shall attend to and carry into effect, any further instructions the Surveyor may find it necessary to give for the due repair and preservation of the road. Any quantity of broken stones or gravel remaining unspread and found at the termination of the contract along the road shall become the property of the County.

Half-yearly Report of Public Analyst.

To the Grand Jury of the County of Louth.

MR. FOREMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I beg leave to report that I have made the following analyses during the half-year ended on 30th June, 1893.

5th January—A specimen of water was analysed for and favourably reported to Dundalk Board of Guardians.

19th January—For the same Board, 3 specimens of milk were analysed. They were all far below the average quality of that article.

18th February—Two specimens of tea were analysed for the Board of Guardians of Dundalk. They were of good quality.

14th March—A specimen of water was analysed for Mr. Owen J. Kelly, Clanbrassil-street, Dundalk. It was very hard, but otherwise good.

12th April—Nine samples of tea were analysed for Dundalk Union, with the view of determining which was best for use in the Workhouse.

8th May—A specimen of artificial manure was analysed for Mr. Telford McNeill, Dundalk.

19th May—Two specimens of tea were analysed for the Guardians of Dundalk Union, as were also two received on the 29th June.

For Drogheda Union, which is partly in the County of Louth, 96 specimens of milk were analysed. Some were above the average quality, others were of average composition, and some below the average composition of milk. One was adulterated with 15 per cent. of water. The contractors who supply milk to this Union are fined according to scale, when the milk is below the average quality.
