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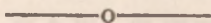

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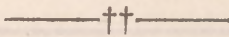

Ordered—That the appointment of Cess Collector for the Baronies of Ferrard and Drogheda, do take place at the ensuing Quarter Sessions, and we recommend the re-appointment of James Simpson under the peculiar circumstances of his case.

Resolved—That the Surveyor in the case of the Presentments under the 20th and 21st Victoria, chapter 15, section 2, shall not draw checks upon the Treasurer, for a smaller sum than £5, or more frequently than once a fortnight.

In the case of expenses to Complainants under the Act, 18 and 19 Victoria, chapter 126, section 14, brought under our notice by the County Treasurer. We approve of the parties entitled to such expenses, applying personally for same at the Office of our Treasurer, as the Law does not contemplate any payment through the Clerks of Petty Sessions for such Complainants.

The Board of Superintendance having reported to the Grand Jury, that the number of Lunatics in the Gaol that have been refused admission into the Richmond Lunatic Asylum, is most destructive to the order and good management of the establishment.

The Grand Jury having taken the subject into consideration.

RESOLVE,

That a memorial be drawn up and forwarded to the Lord Lieutenant, praying that as the County is taxed for the Richmond Lunatic Asylum, and that the County is therefore entitled to

have above 90 inmates in said Asylum, & that it appearing that half the number only have obtained admission That memorialists pray that the full number that the County are entitled to have so allocated should be admitted or that an allowance by reduction in Taxation proportionate to the numbers refused admission should be made to the County.

*Resolutions passed by the Grand Jury, at Summer Assizes, 1849,*

*Ordered to be printed in the Grand Warrant, for the future viz;—*

That it be notified to the Cess Payers, that the Grand Jury will not for the future entertain any Petitions from Contractors, and that all contracts will require to be executed in strict conformity with the Specifications prepared by the County Surveyor

That the County Surveyor refuse a certificate to any Contractor who neglects to keep the water-tables along the Line of road for which he has contracted, clear and free from weeds, and also make suitable outlets to carry off the water.

*“Road Contractors will take Notice, that no certificates will be granted unless their Roads have been kept in repair in accordance with the following Specifications.”*

*“The Roads, Footpaths, and Fences, must be kept free from Weeds.”*

*The repairs to be commenced immediately after the ensuing Assizes and to be proceeded with without intermission until the road is put in specified order*

The road is to have a clear carriage way as wide as the existing fences or grips will permit, but in no place to be less than \_\_\_\_\_ feet wide clear of banks and drains, and \_\_\_\_\_ feet wide with broken stone, where less the road is to be brought to these widths by widening.

In Towns and Villages the road is to be kept in repair from water-table to water-table with broken stone.

The road to be brought to a regular convex curvilinear slope from the centre to the sides on the cross sections, the *whole fall* from the centre or crown to be at the rate of about one in fifty; comparatively flat at the crown but steeper at the shoulders; all inequalities to be reduced by picking the high parts and applying the material to the low parts as may be required. The sides and water-tables are to be neatly defined by continuous lines parallel to the centre of the road and free from sudden bends. The fall at the shoulders not to exceed one in eighteen; the shoulders and water-tables to be kept clean.

Along declivities, particular attention will be required in keeping the cross section perfect.

Outlets or pipes to be made through the fences, to carry off the water, from where it would otherwise lodge on the water-tables, into the adjacent grips, fields or water-courses.

Inlets to be made in like cases to convey the water into the next gullet, sewer or water-way under bridge.

Along declivities outlets are not to be made farther apart than ten perches; inlets are to be made into all cross drains or gullets, all grips on the field side of the fences and water drains, if any, to be kept open to allow a free passage for the water, and keep its surface at least two feet under the crown of the road.

Where paved water-tables are in existence as in streets and declivities they are to be repaired and preserved; the water-table shoulders and sides of the road to be kept constantly free from all nuisances and obstructions.

All stones appearing in or on the road, exceeding two inches in diameter, to be picked up, taken aside made into heaps, and broken.

The road to be kept free from mud by scraping—the scrapings when sufficiently dry, to be carted off unless required to fill grips along the road, or to complete the fences.

In Towns and Villages the scrapings shall be immediately removed in mud or other carts, to be provided by the contractor for that purpose.

\_\_\_\_\_ cubic yards at least of broken stone or prepared gravel, to be used on the road per perch, at an average for \_\_\_\_\_ year the stones to be broken so as to pass an inch and a-half ring, to be laid down as the Surveyor shall direct.

The most durable materials to be had in the neighbourhood to be used; the hardest and toughest are best. No soft or brittle stone, shale, or pencil to be used in any place for repairs.

After the road is scraped the weak portions are to be darned with sufficient quantity of broken stone and a preparation made by picking the crust of the road to be darned that the new materials may combine smoothly with the road and form a regular surface. In darning the stones are to be laid close and in contact with each other.

When the road is gridironed or cut into longitudinal ruts, the contractor will be required to lay on a full coat of material over the portion gridironed, after picking or raking and not merely fill the ruts as is usual.

The Contractor shall put out along the sides of the road or place in depots the whole quantity of material specified before the first day of November in each year for measurement by the Surveyor's Assistant unless otherwise directed in streets or at crossings.

The stones to be arranged in narrow heaps, not exceeding two feet in width, close to the fences, and containing about a cubic yard each. The full quantity to be spread before the first day of February, in each year. The value of two cubic yards will be deducted from the amount of the contract for each cubic yard remaining unspread afterwards. intelligent road labourers shall be employed by the Contractor in keeping the road in addition to the labourers usually required for breaking and spreading or for scraping. These labourers may be employed by the Surveyor and shall be paid by the Contractor wages not exceeding Nine Shillings per week.

All existing gullets, inlets, outlets, drains, water-courses and grips on the field side to be kept in repair and free for the water to pass through, in case of a sudden damage occurring along the line the contractor is to give the Surveyor notice to that effect describing the nature of the damage, within at least one week after it occurs. The fences along the line and slopes of cutting and embankments to be kept in repair, The battlements and parapets of bridges on the road with the wing walls pavements, abutments, &c. to be protected and kept in their present repair or as they may be hereafter repaired. The contractor to cut down and remove all weeds growing along the road on and between the fences, before seed time, sea slopes and pavements to be kept in repair along coast roads, Snow drifts to be removed immediately after a fall of Snow.

Contractor to keep the road constantly free from nuisances, and to summon and prosecute all offending parties, under the 6th & 7th Wm 4 chapter 118 Section 159 In case of injury to the road by trees or hedges the contractor is to require the owner of the land to prune and lop them The parties are to be summoned before the Justices at Petty Sessions in case of non-compliance within Ten Days, section 161 same act

The contractor is to deliver up the road at the expiration of his contract in good repair as above defined, and at any time during the existence of his contract, to attend to and carry into effect any further instructions the Surveyor may find it necessary to give for the due repair and preservation of the road,

To the GRAND JURY of the County of Louth, assembled at Spring Assizes, 1858.

The expenditure on the repairs and maintenance of roads alone was £6.311 15s. 3d. which gives an average of nearly Thirteen pence, per perch, for "Repairs and Maintenance"; being about one Penny per perch over that of 1857.

The rate per perch is therefore advancing with the advance of wages; but as the roads lately repaired are amongst those of the greatest traffic, and include some recent turnpike roads, the increase is not as much as should have been expected under all the circumstances

Applications for the repairs of those turnpike roads, which the recent Act for the abolition of Turnpike Trusts, will throw on the County next April, have been made by me, and sanctioned at Road Sessions. As no Tenders have been lodged for some of these roads, nor for some other works, you will probably have to consider how far you will find it necessary to exercise the powers vested in you by the recent Act, 20 and 21 Victoria, chapter 15, secs. 1 and 2, of presenting the sums sanctioned at Road Sessions, and directing the Surveyor to have the necessary repairs made,

There are a few cases in which the contracting parties, particularly for Mason's work, have not given satisfaction in the execution of other contracts. Here also it would be well to consider how far the public may be benefited by making a Presentment under the same Act, irrespective of the contracting parties declared at the Adjourned Road Sessions.

In the event of such Presentments as I have just referred to being made, it will be necessary to allocate a sum of money out of any funds in the Treasurer's hands, for paying the current expenses. I do not think the Surveyor is the proper party to take charge of, and be accountable in the positions of Treasurer and Paymaster for such money, and I hope if any money be allocated, the Treasurer or Secretary only, shall be placed in charge of it, as it is not just in principle, that the Surveyor

should be his own Paymaster, or be called upon to fill three offices at the same time, those of Treasurer, Secretary and Surveyor. Exceptional cases will occasionally occur, as heretofore under the old Act, when money has been handed to the Surveyor, to make good unexecuted contracts, but in carrying out the new Act of Parliament referred to, I hope to be saved from this unpleasant position.

It is almost unnecessary for me to state, that the turnpike roads appearing on the Schedule, will add very considerably to the future amount of the County Cess. The extra labor attendant on these roads and for which Surveyors alone were paid about £130 annually, is now transferred to my Office, without any compensation. On the contrary I loose myself £25 a year, as Surveyor of the Dunleer & Dundalk Trust:

Since the Tolls were fixed for Vessels, frequenting Carlingford Harbour, by the Commissioners of Public Works, I have as Harbour Constable, appointed at Summer Assizes 1857, received a sum of £24 9s 9d. on 4070 registered tons from March to the present month; I have expended out of this £3 17s 5d. on repairs, books and printing, and there remains in hands a sum of £20 12s 4d to cover the salary of the Deputy Harbour Constable and also any car hire and incidental expenses. Under the original resolution appointing the Harbour Constable it appears to me, the proper course to hand over this amount to the Treasurer, and to have in return, the salary allowed by the Act duly presented. The principle of making Piers and Harbours self supporting is a good one, and there can be no doubt, that Carlingford Pier and Harbour will pay for itself. I have devoted much time and attention without any remuneration to the carrying out of the Pier's and Harbour's Act, as applied to Carlingford. I am convinced that the resources of surrounding districts, must become yearly more and more developed in proportion, as the Piers & Harbours are rendered more safe and easy to load & unload at,

An application for £128 to make 64 perches of a new road near Stone House, in the Barony of Ferrard, appears on the Schedule. The

proposed road is very short, and its usefulness very great. I therefore beg to recommend the presentment for your approval; the other applications on the Schedule are of the usual character, and they do not call for any particular report.

The whole of the arches in the walls of the hall vestibule, and both Courts of the County Court-house have been taken down and rebuilt since the last Assizes, and the Courts re-fitted. The arches formerly rested on timber lintels, they now rest on masonry. The galleries have been lowered over three feet, and down to the level of the floors of the Grand Jury and Committee Rooms; and by altering the entrances, the accommodation in the Courts has been increased very considerably. The communication from Court to Court has been made easy and free from those dangerous step traps under the Benches which formerly existed.

The new road between Aclint and the County Meath, will I trust be completed before next October, and also the new Sewers in Dundalk.

The sides and water-tables are to be neatly defined by continuous lines paralel to the centre of the road and free from sudden bends. The fall at the shoulders not to exceed one in eighteen; the shoulders and water-tables to be kept clean.

Along declivities, particular attention will be required in keeping the cross section perfect,

Outlets or pipes to be made through the fences, to carry off the water, from where it would otherwise lodge on the water-tables, into the adjacent grips, fields or water-courses.

Inlets to be made in like cases to convey the water into the next gullet, sewer or water-way under bridge.

Along declivities outlets are not to be made farther apart than ten perches; inlets are to be made into all cross drains or gullets, all grips or the field side of the fences and water drains, if any, to be kept open to allow a free passage for the water, and keep its surface at least two feet under the crown of the road,

Where paved water-tables are in existence as in streets and declivities they are to be repaired and preserved; the water-shoulders and sides of the road to be kept constantly free from all nuisances and obstructions

All stones appearing in or on the road, exceeding two inches in diameter, to be picked up, taken aside, made into heaps and broken.

The road to be kept free from mud by scraping—the scapings when sufficiently dry, to be carted off unless required to fill grips along the road, or to complete the fences,

In Towns and Villages the scrapings shall be immediately removed in mud or other carts to be provided by the contractor for that purpose,

cubic yards at least of broken stone or prepared gravel, to be used on the road per perch, at an average for                      year  
the stones to be broken so as to pass an inch and a-half ring, to be laid down as the Surveyor shall direct

The most durable materials to be had in the neighbourhood to be used; the hardest and toughest are best, No soft or brittle stone, shale, or pencil to be used in any place for repairs,

After the road is scraped the weak portions are to be darned with sufficient quantity of broken stone and a preparation made by picking the crust of the road to be darned that the new materials may combine smoothly with the road and form a regular surface, In darning the stones are to be laid close and in contact with each other,

When the road is gridironed or cut into longitudinal ruts, the contractor will be required to lay on a full coat of material over the portion gridironed, after picking or raking and not merely fill the ruts as is usual,

The Contractor shall put out along the sides of the road or place in depots the whole quantity of material specified before the first day of November in each year for measurement by the Surveyor's Assistant unless otherwise directed in streets or at crossings,

The stones to be arranged in narrow heaps, not exceeding two feet in width, close to the fences, and containing about a cubic yard each, The full quantity to be spread before the first day of February, in each year, The value of two cubic yards will be deducted from the amount of the contract for each cubic yard remaining unspread afterwards                      intelligent road labourers shall be employed by

which shows that the sums applied for and sanctioned for Turnpike roads in this County amount to very nearly one half the cost of repairs and maintenance of all the other roads, the whole of the levy for new works in the Barony of Louth at the last Assizes was only £260 4s 8d, while the levy on one Turnpike road was above £238 14s 0d. The cost of repairs and maintenance amount to about one-third of the whole levy for all purposes, and a levy of 100 would amount to

While on the subject of rates I am called on to supply a deficiency in the table of expenditure in this County for the years 1837, 1847 and 1857 published by your Secretary in the County book for last Assizes. The quantities of work performed in these years respectively, are not given in this table. In 1837 there were only 222 miles of roads repaired at a cost of £3764 which gives an average rate per perch of 12 $\frac{3}{4}$  pence. In 1847, the year of the famine, when the traffic was at a minimum and also the value of labour, there were 203 miles repaired and maintained at a cost of £2856, giving an average rate per perch of 10 $\frac{1}{2}$  pence; while in 1857, 368 miles of road were repaired and maintained at a cost of £6311 giving an average rate of nearly 13 pence per perch; in this year however, there was added £383 for turnpike roads, which would reduce the average to about 12 $\frac{1}{2}$  pence or nearly the same as for 1837. I have each year, at the Spring Assizes, given the statistics of the expenditure of County Works; they are printed in the County Books. I now deviate from the usual course of my reports for Spring and Summer in order to draw attention to the necessity for taking into consideration the quantity of work, the value of labour, and the traffic, at different periods, to arrive at sound conclusions.

I am glad to be able to report that a sum of from £7000 to £8000 claimed by the Government of the County for a debt and interest thereon due by the late Trustees of the Dundalk and Dunleer Turnpike Trust, was disallowed by the Commissioners on my evidence.

The roads leading from Dundalk to Newtownhamilton by Falmore and Killen have been lately contracted for at prices under those formerly offered without obtaining a contractor. I am now enabled to return to the Barony out of the sums handed to me for the repairs of these roads £150. I have expended in addition to the sums required for ordinary repairs about £75 in effecting permanent improvements and in the purchase of plant. I have also saved about £40 on the Barleyfield road in the same district.

The Sewers in Dundalk are almost completed as far as the original presentment contemplated with a saving of from £400 to £500 notwithstanding extra works amounting to about £500 rendered necessary during the progress of the building. The lowest tender was £2500, the amount of the Presentment £2000, and the expenditure about £1550 including extras. I beg leave to recommend the expenditure of the saving effected in the continuation of the sewers and in supplying suitable gully-traps, more particularly as the presentment was made as "a rate in aid" to the Town Commissioners of Dundalk.

I beg leave to resign my office of Constable of Carlingford Harbour, and shall hand over to any person whom you shall appoint in my place, the dues received since my last published account.

A presentment of £15 has been made at Ferrard Road Sessions, for cleaning out the Harbour of Dunany. This is the first application of this sort, which appeared before you; a presentment can be passed for the purpose even without an application at Road Sessions.

I wish to submit for your approval at this Assizes, the form of accounts and Pay Sheets, which I have prepared for such works, as you have lately handed over to my charge.

# County Surveyor's Report.

To the GRAND JURY of the County of Louth, assembled at Spring Assizes, 1859.

JOCelyn STREET, DUNDALK,  
MARCH, 1859.

GENTLEMEN,

The amount presented for Public Works in this County, for the past year was £11,439 13s. 1d. of which sum £2,641 8s. 2d. was presented for the repairs of nearly 48 miles of roads previously repaired under four different Turnpike Trusts. This sum deducted from the total, leaves a balance of £8,797 4s. 11d. for the ordinary expenditure; that for 1857 was £9163 8s. 3d. The amount presented for the repairs and maintenance of nearly 365 miles of the ordinary County roads during the past year was £6133 nearly, which gives an average rate of 12<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> pence per perch. The corresponding figures in 1857 were 368 miles, repaired and maintained at a cost of £6,311 nearly, giving an average rate of 13 pence per perch.

The total amount presented during 1858 for repairs and maintenance including the late Turnpike roads was £8,773 13s. 10d. for a length of 411 miles nearly, which gives a new average rate of 16-05 pence per perch, and 10<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> pence per pound on the valuation.

The minimum rate per pound is 7-71 pence on the Ardee Barony, and the maximum 13-05 pence on Upper Dundalk Barony.

The details of the expenditure on each Barony and on the County at Large, are given in the following tables in which it may be useful to remark that the turnpike roads have raised the levy from 6-02 pence to 7-71 pence per pound on the Valuation in Ardee Barony; from 5-16 pence to 8-14 pence in Drogheda Barony; from 7-28 pence to 13-05 pence in Upper Dundalk Barony; from 9-55 pence to 12-76 pence in Lower Dundalk Barony; from 9-04 pence to 11-79 pence in Ferrard Barony; and from 6-94 pence to 10-62 pence in Louth Barony. Upper Dundalk and Louth are therefore the two Baronies most heavily affected by the alteration in the law, transferring the late turnpike roads to your care.

There are about 150 miles of Parish roads without contract ; of these about 100 miles are in middling order, and about 50 miles in bad order requiring repairs

The wet weather which set in immediately after the last road Sessions held in November, and which has continued almost uninterruptedly up to the present month, has not been favourable to road contractors, yet I regret to state that making all allowances for the difficulties of the season, they have not met the call on their exertions with sufficient energy—I have had to summon the contractors for the following leading roads, with others, before the Justices of Petty Sessions under the Act 19 & 20 Victoria, cap 63. sec 17, for neglect and inattention in the performance of their contracts

1—The late Turnpike road from Dundalk to Carrickmacross by Rosslough in the Barony of Ardee at the bounds of the County Monaghan

2—The road from Dundalk to Carrickmacross by Louth, between Louth and Sandfield in the Barony of Louth—Owen Cassidy contractor

3—The late Turnpike road from Dundalk to Carrickmacross by Shannonrock in the Barony of Louth

4—The road from Castlebellingham to Ardee, between Stabannon and Red House in the Barony of Ardee

5—The road from Dundalk to Ardee, between Mapastown bridge and the town of Ardee, in the Barony of Ardee

6—The road leading by Ravensdale

7—The road from Dundalk to Carlingford, between the road leading to Bellurgan Quay and Riverstown in the Barony of Lower Dundalk

8—The road from Carlingford to Ballagan Point

9—The road from Carlingford to Newry, between Ballyonan bridge and the bounds of the County Armagh, in the Barony of Lower Dundalk

The common causes of complaint against road contractors were for neglect in keeping the water-tables & shoulders clear, the misapplication and large size of road materials and the late periods at which the specified quantities were provided, which frequently involved their application in

large quantities. This invariably caused very considerably increased wear and tear and a broken up surface, to the great inconvenience of the public. On the roads placed in my hands by the Grand Jury. I find that although the prices were considered too low to get contractors, a saving to the credit of the County in work and money has been effected in nearly every case. The only contracts entered into by me for the repairs of these roads were for the supply of materials, their application and all other works being executed by day labour; owing however, to the late period at which some of those roads were placed in my hands after the last Summer Assizes, a sufficient quantity of broken stones could only be had with considerable difficulty.

The sewers of Dundalk have been extended beyond the specified lengths, and the sum of about £400 saved in the execution of the specified works has been expended in these extensions. Provisions have been made for turning the Rampart river into the sewers, for the purpose of flushing, and also for the purpose of supplying Fire Engines with water at all parts of the Town through which the sewers pass or are proposed to pass, in case of fire. The proper use of this adjunct to the line of sewers is essential to keep them clear, and I trust the Town Commissioners will turn it to account.

The short line of new road near Stone House in the Barony of Ferrard is now open to the public, and I believe it is every where in the district now perceived that this road should have been made many years ago.

The new line of road in the Barony of Ardee, between Aclint and the County boundary at Tullykeel, is not yet finished. The extra subsidence of a heavy embankment on moory land, and the scarcity of labour have caused considerable delay, but I hope the contractor will open the line to the public before the next Summer Assizes.

My certificate has been again withheld from the contractor for building the bridge at Dunleer, I would be glad if an order were made to enable me to certify for him at the next Road Sessions, on the execution of some works to which I have called his attention.

Of the works on the Schedule now applied for, it is only necessary to refer here to the proposed new stone bridge over the River Fane on the Commons of Dromiskin, for which a sum of £400 was sanctioned at the Road Sessions. The sheet planking constituting the road-way of the present timber bridge, is dangerous, and the money sanctioned

would be judiciously expended in erecting a permanent pass over the river, the other works on the Schedule I shall report on the detail as they come before you.

A sum of about £130 has been saved under the charge of the Assistant of the district in the repairs of the late Newry Turnpike road by Ravensdale, which can now be represented in aid of the Cess. Contracts have been entered into for the repairs of this road in the regular manner at Road Sessions.

A Presentment is again applied for the extension of the sewers in Dundalk, which is only to be certified at this Assize. A Presentment, also to be certified, is applied for to make a new line of road along the coast to the fishing Village of Baltray. The plans lodged with this application are imperfect and badly prepared. The sum applied for appears insufficient. I shall be prepared to report in detail on this road at the next Sessions, where it must again be brought forward, before coming the second time before you.

Some certificates have been issued by one of my Assistants since the last Assizes, which it shall be my duty to bring before you at the proper time.

A sum of about £240 has been expended by me out of £281, in hands after the last Assizes, executing different works neglected or given up by contractors. A sum of about £1,420 has also been expended and paid by me out of £1,719 ordered to be paid on my certificates, under the Act 20 & 21 vic cap. 15. The expenditure to be accounted for on oath Sec. 2. At the last Spring Assizes I made the following observation, with reference to payments under this Act "I do not think the Surveyor is the proper party to take charge of, and be accountable, in the position of Treasurer and Paymaster, for such money." The money advanced to me on certificate for works under this Act, has been heretofore paid by one of my assistants, acting as Paymaster whose receipts I take; I believe that a Paymaster should be appointed specially for this Office, connected directly with the Grand Jury, and proper security taken. The duty, performed now solely in my Office, involves very serious responsibility, and does not properly belong to it; and considering the very heavy increase of work caused by the transfer of the Turnpike roads, I think I should be relieved from the responsibility of making payments under this Act. Heretofore the whole of the work has been done without any extra charge to the County, which has had the benefit of any savings effected, the whole of the incidental expenses being charged to the works; but the office of Paymaster should be held under

the Grand Jury, directly, and the duties of my office should be confined to certifying for works executed, and the sums to be paid for them.

I learnt, accidentally, that the Dundalk and Enniskillen Railway Company applied since the last Assizes, to Parliament for an Act to extend their line to the Dundalk Quays, and on an examination of the plans in the Clerk of the Peace's Office, find that Barrack street is proposed to be crossed once, and that there are three different crossings shown at the Quay road, which road it is also proposed to occupy with a line of rails, I received no notice whatever of their bill from the Company and it is important for the protection of the Town of Dundalk, and the Cess-Payers of the district, that your Solicitor should be instructed to take such steps as you shall see fit in the matter, and that the County and Town Members should be written to.

While on this subject I beg to state that I have some letters on the subject of Railway crossings, generally, through the county, which it is advisable to print in the County Books that there may be a clear understanding of the works which the Companies should at all times be called upon to perform.

Your Secretary has in accordance with the directions of the Grand Jury, given at the last Summer Assizes, advertised for Tenders for works not contracted for at Road Sessions: I shall report on these works and all others, as they come separately before you

The repairs to be commenced immediately after the ensuing Assizes and to be proceeded with without intermission until the road is put in specified order

The road is to have a clear carriage way as wide as the existing fences or grips will permit, but in no place to be less than feet wide clear of banks and drains, and feet wide with broken stone, where less the road is to be brought to these widths by widening

In Towns and Villages the road shall be kept in repair from water-table to water-table with broken stone

The road to be brought to a regular convex curvilineal slope from the centre to the sides on the cross sections, the whole fall from the centre or crown to be at the rate from about one in fifty; comparatively flat at the crown but steeper at the

shoulders ; all inequalities to be reduced by picking the high parts and applying the material to the low parts as may be required. The sides and water-tables shall be neatly defined by continuous lines parallel to the centre of the road and free from sudden bends. The fall at the shoulders not to exceed one in eighteen ; the shoulders and water-tables to be kept clean.

Along declivities, particular attention will be required in keeping the cross section perfect

Outlets or pipes to be made through the fences, to carry off the water, from where it would otherwise lodge on the water-tables, into the adjacent grips, fields or water courses.

Inlets to be made in like cases to convey the water into the next gullet, sewer or water-way under bridge

Along declivities outlets shall not be made farther apart than ten perches ; inlets shall be made into all cross drains or gulleys, all grips on the field side of the fences and water drains, if any, to be kept open to allow a free passage for the water, and keep its surface at least two feet under the crown of the road

Where paved water-tables are in existence as in streets and declivities they are to be repaired and preserved ; the water-table shoulders and sides of the road to be kept constantly free from all nuisances and obstructions

All stones appearing in or on the road, exceeding two inches in diameter, to be picked up, taken aside made into heaps and broken

The road to be kept free from mud by scraping -the scrapings when sufficiently dry to be carted off unless required to fill grips along the road, or to complete the fences

In Towns and Villages the scrapings shall be immediately removed in mud or other carts to be provided by the contractor for that purpose.

cubic yards at least of broken stone or prepared gravel, to be used on the road per perch, at an average for \_\_\_\_\_ year  
the stones to be broken so as to pass an inch and a-half ring, to be laid down as the Surveyor shall direct.

When sea-beach or gravel is the material used, it shall be screened free from extra sand, and the larger pebbles broken to pass an inch and a-half ring

The most durable materials to be had in the neighbourhood to be used ; the hardest and toughest are best. No soft or brittle stone, shale or pencil to be used in any in any place for repairs

After the road is scraped, the weak portions are to be darned with sufficient quantity of broken stone and a preparation made by picking the crust of the road to be

darned, that the new materials may combine smoothly with the road and form a regular surface. In darning the stones are to be laid close and in contact with each other

When the road is gridironed or cut into longitudinal ruts, the contractor will be required to lay on a full coat of material over the portion gridironed, after picking or raking and not merely fill the ruts as is usual

The Contractor shall put out along the sides of the road or place in depots the whole quantity of material specified before the first day of November in each year for measurement by the Surveyor's Assistant unless in streets or at crossings or otherwise directed

The stones to be arranged in narrow heaps, not exceeding two feet in width close to the fences and of equal size and containing about a cubic yard each. The full quantity to be spread before the first day of February in each year. The value of two cubic yards will be deducted from the amount of the contract for each cubic yard remaining unspread afterwards. intelligent road labourers shall be employed by the contractor, in keeping the road in addition to the labourers usually required for breaking and spreading, or for scraping. These labourers may be employed by the Surveyor and shall be paid by the Contractor, wages not exceeding Nine Shillings per week each ; The Assistants will measure the smaller heaps, to determine the quantity from, if the contractor neglect making them of the same size

All existing gulleys, inlets, outlets, drains, water-courses and grips on the field side to be kept in repair and free for the water to pass through. In case of a sudden damage occurring along the line, the contractor is to give the Surveyor notice to that effect describing the nature of the damage, within at least one week after it occurs. The fences along the line and slopes of cutting and embankments, to be kept in repair. The battlements and parapets of bridges on the road with the wing walls, pavements, abutments, &c, to be protected and kept in their present repair or as they may be hereafter repaired. The contractor to cut down and remove all weeds growing along the road on and between the fences before seed time ; sea slopes and pavements to be kept in repair along coast roads, Snow drifts to be removed immediately after a fall of Snow

Contractor to keep the road constantly free from nuisances, and to summon and prosecute all offending parties, under the 6th & 7th William 4 Chapter 116 Section 159. In case of injury to the road by trees or hedges the contractor is to require the owner of the land to prune and lop them. The parties are to be summoned before the Justices at Petty Sessions in case of non-compliance within Ten Days, Section 161 same Act

The contractor is to deliver up the road at the expiration of his contract in good repair as above defined, and at any time during the existence of his contract, to attend and carry into effect any further instructions the Surveyor may find it necessary to give for the due repair and preservation of the road

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE  
ASSISTANT SURVEYORS,  
IN THE COUNTY OF LOUTH.

I—If a contractor neglect to comply with the clauses of his specification, the Assistant shall each month notice such neglect, in detail, in his Report, and make a memorandum thereof in the office book stating the date on which he called the Contractors attention thereto, and the clause or clauses not complied with.

II—When any clause in a specification has not been acted upon by the Contractor, the Assistant shall immediately call his attention to such clause, and require compliance with it. The Assistant shall make himself perfectly acquainted with all the clauses of each specification, from the original in the Secretary's office, for works in his district

III—The Assistant shall inform the Contractor of the day on which his monthly visit shall be made, require his attendance, and point out to him the respective works, necessary for fully complying with the specification.

IV—When any road is neglected, between one inspection and the next the Assistant shall, immediately after, call upon the County Surveyor, to sign the notice required under the 54th Section, 6th and 7th William 4. Chapter 116, and when so signed, serve it without delay, on the Contractor, a copy of such Notice stating the date of service to be kept by the Assistant, and a memorandum thereof to be given in the monthly Report, and inserted in the office book.

V—All returns of dimensions, quantities, widths of roads &c., shall be made by the Assistant from actual measurement, with a measuring tape, or other properly graduated measure, and not from mere guess or valuation; each and every heap or load of stones is to be measured separately. In Towns, Villages or for roads along which broken stones cannot be arranged in oblong heaps, the Assistant shall appoint certain days for spreading, and then take the measurement from the number of Carts and their respective sizes.

VI—The Assistant shall keep a note book and registry of his

measurement with dimensions, and of his inspections; a copy of same shall be kept in some safe place, for reference in the event of the original being lost.

VII—The Grand Jury having made a special order that the waterables and shoulders of contract roads shall be kept clear and free from weeds with suitable outlets, and having the widths neatly defined, the Assistants must pay strict attention to this order, and instruct the contractors that it is not only necessary to define the sides, but that no scrapings or soft stuff shall be left on the surface or shoulders; and that the whole road within the specified widths, shall be kept clear by frequently scaping, sweeping and dressing.

VIII—The Assistant shall Report immediately, and twice a year hereafter on the state of each slope, pavement pipe, gullet, arch, retaining wall, parapet wall, coping and other road works within his district and see that the respective road contractors prevent and make good any jury thereto. When underpinning, repairing or rebuilding is necessary he is to prepare an estimate and application to lay before the Magistrates and Cess-payers at road Sessions; having previously obtained the County Surveyor's consent to the proposed works, and the estimate therefor

IX—The Assistant shall summon all offending parties, under the 159th and 161st Sections of the Grand Jury Act, or cause the contractors to do so. All summonses issued under those Sections to be reported upon separately, with the findings thereon, whether the summonses be issued by the Assistant or Contractor, before the Spring and Summer Assizes of each year.

X—The Assistant shall attend once a fortnight in the County Surveyor's Office, during the hours, and on the days posted up in said Office

XI—The monthly reports upon the state of each contract and surface repairs of roads, shall be lodged with the County Surveyor on the last day of each month, or if it fall upon Sunday, on the preceeding Saturday. The columns for quantities shall be filled in, and the totals repeated for each contract for each month.

## Letters on the subject of Railway Crossings.

Dundalk and Enniskillen Railway,  
Engineer's Office,  
Dundalk, 19th June, 1856.

Dear Sir;—

The Town Commissioners have applied to the Company, to have the fence on the Dublin road near the bridge repaired.

The Directors inform me, the present stone fences were erected at your request, in lieu of the low fence and post and rail which I remember there under an agreement for all their bridges between Mr. Bell and you, that they should then be no longer under the Company's charge, may I beg to call this matter to your recollection, and request that you will manage to have the Commissioners satisfied on the subject in whatever way is right.

You are quite right in assuming that the stone fences erected at the approaches over the Enniskillen Railway, were substituted at my request in place of post and rail fences, but there was no arrangement that any works but the maintenance of the roadway should be under my charge and even this only with the consent of the Trustees or Grand Jury; the same applies to the other bridges on the Enniskillen Railway, and when the works were put in the required state for me, by Mr Bell, I forwarded to him a cheque enclosing the balance of fines obtained by me against the Company

While therefore, the maintenance of the metalled roadway was taken up in the ordinary way after the completion of the works I required. I did not undertake either to make good future subsidence in the embankments, the repairs of fences—which were subject to extra delapidation owing to the proximity of the Railway; nor the repairs or maintenance of bridges. Under these circumstances there can be little question that the Company must make good any injury that shall be done from time to time to fences or bridges or any defects which shall arise from subsidence as, unless directed by the Trustees or Cess-payers, I shall not do so.

Dear Sir;—

I have laid before our Board yours of the 20th Ultimo., and they are of opinion and consider that there is no doubt of the fences having been taken off their hands on the occasion before referred to, they dont for a moment claim that anything but the road was so taken, that is to say, they dont suppose it was ever contemplated, that you should have undertaken any thing connected with the bridge or their other works; but the fact that you required fences to be erected which were not specifically required by the Act, and that these fences were at a very large cost erected in deference to your opinion, on the arrangement that when they were done, the road was henceforth to be kept up at the expense of the Trustees, is of itself presumptive evidence that those fences so erected formed a part of the work so transferred to your charge. I think upon reconsideration of the matter, you will see that in this we do not claim anything from the Trustee which is not reasonable and equitable, and that it would have been an extraordinary arrangement, if you had prevailed on a Company to make permanent stone fences instead of timber, where permanence or non-permanence of the fences was of no consequence to the Trustees on your supposition, that the Company were always to maintain them. The Company do not consider they are liable, and expect you will see with them that they should not be called upon in this matter

I had yours of 7th on my return from town on the 9th I have no hesitation in agreeing that companies for whom I act are fairly called upon to do almost every thing in your letter, namely, to make good at all times the bridges they have constructed over or under the public roads, subsidence in the embankments and defects arising therefrom: and any injury to the fences due to a failure in the Railway works, but not to proximity of the Railway, but I think even on the terms of your letter, the ordinary maintenance of the fences comes within that which you consider to be equitable for the county to bear the expense of, and you will excuse my saying fully within that which I believed you were getting done, as per our old arrangements. I would regret that we should have to dispute again these matters, and so far as the D. & E. R. fence on the Dublin road is concerned, will have it repaired without deciding who should do it, if you consider I have properly defined above our future responsibilities, and that we may thus consider the basis settled, as to what we shall in future be called upon to do

It affords me much pleasure to learn from your letter of the 11th Inst., that there is a probability of our agreeing in every matter connected with the Railway crossings in the county, and I hope very sincerely that you will assent to the extent I seek to the repairs of the fences on the Dublin & Belfast Junction line as well as on the Enniskillen line

It was because I perceived from late conversations with you, that your recollection of facts or rather inferences from them was different from mine, that I considered it right to lay before you the principles upon which my mind was made up, in my letter of the 7th instant, and I hope we shall agree in those as founded on equity, however we may differ as to the extent to which I took up any crossings on the part of the public.

I acknowledge there is some difficulty in distinguishing between injury to fences arising from the proximity of the railway works and the ordinary injury which the county would be called upon to make good if there was no such proximity, but I have observed that such injury arises, in general, from persons employed on the Railway or others making a pass near the bridges into the line, and from idlers on or near the bridges, watching the Trains pass. If therefore you think it right to assent so far, there can be no further cause for difference of opinion as to the proper discharge of our respective duties

I was absent all day yesterday, or I would have withdrawn the instructions I gave Mr. Byrne in these matters on Monday, however I shall do so to-day

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**C O U N T Y S U R V E Y O R ' S R E P O R T**


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*To the GRAND JURY of the County of Louth, assembled at Summer Assizes, 1859.*

GENTLEMEN,

An application for £2,000, to extend Sewers in the Town of Dundalk, will be submitted to you. The principle upon which this sum is sought, was sanctioned by a former Grand Jury, when the amount was levied from off the Barony: the present application was sanctioned at the Road Sessions, held for the County at Large.

An application for £100 to repair footpaths in the Town of Ardee, is also made; the principle upon which this sum is sought for, is the same as the last: Dundalk and Ardee being both Towns under the "Town's Improvement Act".

A sum of £65 was sanctioned at the Road Sessions in Ardee, for extra work arising out of extra subsidence in a heavy embankment on the new line of road from Aclint to the County Meath, through Tullykeel, to which the Contractor is fairly entitled.

A sum of £160 for making 80 perches of a new road near Annagasson, is also sought for. This work is necessary in order to protect the public—the old road being in part washed away by the sea, and to maintain the traffic between Annagasson, Dunany and Togher. The other applications are of the usual kind, and I shall report separately on them as they come before you.

The roads under contract through the County, are generally in good order and were never stronger. There are at present 468 miles under repairs and maintenance. Of these 35 miles are being repaired under the Act, 20th and 21st Victoria Chapter 15, about one-half of which were late Turnpike roads; 27 miles out of these 35 are again open for contract at this Assizes, I have received frequent intimations, that these works have, generally, given satisfaction, and I shall always feel obliged for any information when any person has reason to complain of the state of these or any other contract works in the County Works not under contract, should be applied for as the Act directs, but as I mentioned at a former Assizes, persons will sometimes complain of

the state of a work or road who will not take the necessary steps to obtain a Presentment for its improvement.

The following table shows the number of surface-repair contracts sanctioned at the late Road Sessions, and those contracted for at the Adjourned Sessions, with the mileage. The prices were equally

fair, for the repairs of the roads, on which no contracts were taken, as for those on which they were taken, and in every case abundant for the works required; I am however informed that several of the former will now be contracted for.

In my last report I drew attention to the necessity of separating from my office that of Paymaster, for such works as may be given to me in charge, under the late Act, 20th and 21st Vict., chapter 15. Heretofore the Assistants have been engaged very much, in superintending these works, and one of them as Paymaster, in order to keep down the expense of a new staff as much as possible. The system requires inquiry, and I trust you will take the subject generally into consideration at this Assizes, and frame such regulations as shall seem advisable. For the future I would recommend that no surface repairs should be given to me in immediate charge for a longer period than from Assizes to Assizes. The advantages of the new Act are apparent, but its application should be duly limited.

My accounts since the last Assizes will be submitted to you. The expenditure was about £333 under the Act 20th and 21st Victoria, chapter 15, and £103 on neglected contracts.

I entirely agreed in the prudence of the resolutions come to by the Grand Jury at the last Assizes, rescinding a former resolution on the subject of Contractors memorials. The objects of the resolutions generally appear however to be misunderstood. They could not affect the principles under which I have been endeavouring to act, and I believe it was not intended they should.

*The repairs to be commenced immediately after the ensuing Assizes and to be proceeded with without intermission until the road is put in specified order.*

The road shall have a clear carriage way, as wide as the existing fences or grips will permit, but in no place to be less than feet wide with gravel or broken stone, where less the road shall be brought to this width by widening, unless where fences, trenches or footpaths interfere.

The road shall be kept in repair from water-table to water table with broken stones or gravel.

The road shall be brought to a regular convex curvilinear slope, from the centre to the sides on the cross sections, the fall from the centre or crown to be at the rate of about one in fifty; comparatively flat at the crown, but steeper on the shoulders; all inequalities shall be reduced by picking the high parts, and applying the material to the low parts. The sides and water-tables shall be neatly defined by continuous lines parallel to the centre of the road free from sudden bends. The fall at the shoulders shall be about one in eighteen; the shoulders and water-tables shall be kept clean.

Along declivities particular attention will be required in keeping the cross section convex to pass off the water

Outlets or pipes shall be made through the fences to carry off the water from where it would otherwise lodge on the water tables, into the adjacent grips, fields or water courses

Outlets shall be made into all cross drains, pipes or gulleys; all grips on the field side of the fences and water drains if any shall be kept open to allow a free passage for the water, and keep its surface under the water-tables

Where paved water-tables are in existence they shall be repaired and preserved; the water tables, shoulders and sides of the road shall be kept constantly free from all nuisances and obstructions.

All stones appearing in or on the road, or between the fences exceeding two and a-half inches in diameter, shall be picked up or collected taken aside, made into heaps, and broken, for darning the surface.

The road shall be kept free from mud by sweeping and scraping.—The sweepings or scrapings when sufficiently dry, shall be carted off unless required to fill grips along the road or to complete the fences and side formation. A sufficient quantity shall always be used for blending with newly spread stones or gravel.

In Towns and Villages the scrapings shall be immediately removed in carts to be provided by the Contractor cubic yards at least of broken stone or properly prepared gravel shall be spread, skillfully, on the road, per perch, at an average for year The stones shall be broken so as to pass an inch and a-half ring, to be laid down as the Surveyor or Assistant shall direct.

When "sea beach" or gravel is the material used it shall be screened free from extra sand, and the larger pebbles broken to pass an inch and a-half ring.

The most durable materials to be had in the neighbourhood shall be used, the hardest toughest are best. No soft or brittle stone, shale or pencil, shall be used in any place for repairs.

After the road shall have been scraped the weak portions shall be darned with a sufficient quantity of broken stones and a preparation shall be made by picking the crust so that the new materials shall combine smoothly with the road and form a regular and smooth surface. In darning the stones shall be laid close and in contact with each other. The surface shall be kept free from ruts and longitudinal furrows by timely and skilful repairs

The contractor shall put out along the sides of the road or place in depots the whole quantity of material specified from time to time before the first day of November in each year, for measurement by the Surveyor's Assistant, unless in streets or at crossings, or otherwise directed for occasional repairs, when the Assistant will measure from off the carts

The stones shall be arranged in narrow heaps not exceeding two feet in width close up to fences or grips and of equal size, and containing about a cubic yard each.

The Assistant will measure the smaller heaps, to determine the quantity from, if the contractor neglect making them of the same size.

The full quantity shall be spread before the first day of the Spring Assizes in each year. The value of two cubic yards will be deducted from the amount of the contract for each cubic yard remaining unspread afterwards.

skillful road-labourers shall be employed by the contractor in keeping the road in addition to the labourers usually required for breaking and spreading, or for scraping. These labourers may be employed by the Surveyor and shall be paid by the contractor, wages not exceeding Eight Shillings per week each. A staff and notice will be furnished to all such labourers and shall be paid for by the contractor.

All existing gulleys, inlets, outlets, drains, water-courses and grips, on the field side to be kept in repair, and free for the water to pass through. In case of a sudden damage occurring along the line, the contractor is to give the Surveyor notice to that effect, describing the nature of the damage, within at least one week after it occurs. The fences along the line and slopes of cutting and embankments to be kept in repair. The battlements and parapets of bridges on the road with the wing-walls, pavements, abutments, &c, to be protected and kept in their present repair or as they may be hereafter repaired. The contractor to cut down and remove all weeds growing along the road on and between the fences before seed time. Sea slopes and pavements to be kept in repair along coast roads; snow drifts to be removed immediately after a fall of snow.

Contractor to keep the roads constantly free from all nuisances, and shall summon and prosecute all offending parties under the 6th and 7th Wm 4. Chap 116, Sec, 156. In case of injury to the road by trees or hedges, the contractor is to require the owner of the land to prune and lop them. The parties to be summoned before the Justices at Petty Sessions in case of non-compliance within Ten days Sec 161, same Act.

The contractor shall deliver up the road at the expiration, of his contract in good repair as above defined and at any time during the existence of his contract shall attend to and carry into effect any further instructions the Surveyor may find it necessary to give for the due repair and preservation of the road.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE  
ASSISTANT SURVEYORS,  
IN THE COUNTY OF LOUTH.

I—If a contractor neglect to comply with the clauses of his specification, the Assistant shall each month notice such neglect, in detail, in his report, and make a memorandum thereof in the office book stating the date on which he called the Contractors attention thereto and the clause or clauses not complied with.

II—When any clause in a specification has not been acted upon by the Contractor, the Assistant shall immediately call his attention to such clause, and require compliance with it. The Assistant shall make himself perfectly acquainted with all the clauses of each specification, from the original in the Secretary's office, for works in his district.

III—The Assistant shall inform the Contractor of the day on which his monthly visit shall be made, require his attendance, and point out to him his respective works, necessary for fully complying with the specification.

IV—When any road is neglected, between one inspection and the next the Assistant shall, immediately after call upon the County Surveyor, to sign the notice required under the 54th Section, 6th and 7th William 4, chapter 116, and when so signed, serve it without delay, on the Contractor a copy of such Notice stating the date of service to be kept by the Assistant, and a memorandum thereof to be given in the monthly Report, and inserted in the office book.

V—All returns of demensions, quantities, widths of roads &c., shall be made by the Assistant from actual measurement, with a measuring tape, or other properly graduated measure, and not from mere guess or valuation; each and every heap or load of stones is to be measured separately. In Towns, Villages or for roads along which broken stones cannot be arranged in oblong heaps, the Assistant shall appoint certain days for spreading, and then take the measurement from the number of Carts and their respective sizes.

VI—The Assistant shall keep a note book and registry of his measurement with dimensions, and of his inspections; a copy of same shall be kept in some safe place, for reference in the event of the original being lost.

VII—The Grand Jury having made a special order that the water-ables and shoulders of contract roads shall be kept clear and free from weeds with suitable outlets, and having the widths neatly defined, the Assistants must pay strict attention to this order and instruct the contractors that it is not only necessary to define the sides, but that no scrapings or soft stuff shall be left on the surface or shoulders; and that the whole road within the specified widths, shall be kept clear by frequently scraping, sweeping and dressing.

VIII—The Assistant shall Report immediately, and twice a year hereafter on the state of each slope, pavement pipe, gullet, arch, retaining wall, parapet wall, coping and other road works within his district, and see that the respective road contractors prevent and make good any injury thereto. When underpinning, repairing or rebuilding is necessary he is to prepare an estimate and application to lay before the Magistrates and Cess-Payers at Road Sessions; having previously obtained the County Surveyor's consent to the proposed works, and the estimate therefor.

IX—The Assistant shall summon all offending parties, under the 159th and 161st Sections of the Grand Jury Act, or cause the contractors to do so. All Summonses issued under those Sections to be reported upon separately, with the findings thereon, whether the summonses be issued by the Assistant or Contractor, before the Spring and Summer Assizes of each year.

X—The Assistant shall attend once a fortnight in the County Surveyor's Office, during the hours, and on the days posted up in said Office

XI—The monthly reports upon the state of each contract and surface repairs of roads, shall be lodged with the County Surveyor on the last day of each month, or if it fall upon Sunday, on the preceeding Saturday. The columns for quantities shall be filled in, and the totals repeated for each contract for each month.

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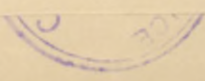
