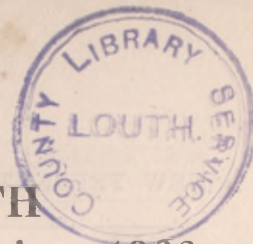

## COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT.

To the Grand Jury of the County of Louth, assembled at Spring Assizes, 1866.

GENTLEMEN,

The new applications on the Schedule, with one exception, are of the usual kind, and do not require any special reference. No. 11 in the Barony of Ferrard is a Presentment to cover damages, and will require explanation when called over.

During the past year there were 580 miles of roads repaired and maintained in this County, showing an increase of 14 miles over the mileage of the preceding year. As the increase of mileage arises from roads not before repaired by County Presentments, or left for a long time without repairs, the average rate per perch, under the head of repairs and maintenance for the time is increased; the cost of this extra mileage for formation and repairs being considerably higher than the cost of maintenance alone. However, notwithstanding this increase, the total cost of all works was less by £677 in the last year than in the previous one, and the rate in the pound on the valuation was thereby reduced by a little more than three-fourths of a penny. There is an increase of 35 miles for the 5 years since 1860; but, a decrease of £865 in the yearly cost of all works. The details of expenditure for each Barony, as well as the total for the County at large, under their respective heads, are given in the Table attached to this Report. In addition to the usual information, I have also now added a brief Summary of the Cost in each Barony for the last five years, that the Grand Jury and Cess-payers may see at a glance the extent and cost of works in each year in their respective Baronies, and be enabled to compare the items. I believe the results will be found satisfactory.

The new road through the bog of Ardee is very nearly completed, and can be opened to the public next Summer. The Glenmore line of road in the Barony of Lower Dundalk, is also gradually progressing. When finished, this will be a very fine and valuable mountain road, and it will open up a district hitherto almost closed.

The new bridge at Annagasson, 42ft. span and 6ft. rise, over the River Glyde, (with the adjacent cuttings and fillings), is now finished. There was some difficulty with the contractor, and some delay in completing this useful work; and, although there are some defects in the

masonry, the structure altogether is a good one, and I would recommend that the penalties for delay be not deducted from the amount of the contract, and that the balance on hands be now discharged.

The contract roads have in general been kept in good order, and although it is not possible to control a large body of contractors scattered over the country—often unskilled, and sometimes inclined to escape their engagements—as effectually as is desirable, I think a great deal has been done. The road contractors as a body are improving, and we have some who always carry out the specifications satisfactorily; there are others who always require pressure, and a few again whom no pressure can improve.

Since the alterations caused by the removal of the old gaol the re-portion of the County Courts and a portion of the old gaol have been brought into view, and as there is a want of accommodation in the public offices, I beg leave to bring the subject before you. A record and crown offices are asked for, and my own office is so crowded once a fortnight that there is scarcely room to enter it. A private office in connexion with the office open to the public would be a great convenience to me. While on this subject, I venture to hope that the Grand Jury will permit me to get a suitable set of instruments for keeping a regular Registry of the fall of rain, temperature and state of the weather, the cost of these would be very little indeed; the registry would cost nothing, and be always open in the most convenient place for reference for the Cess-payers of the County.

On looking with the Secretary over the sums for which the Court-house and Prison are Insured, we think it would be wise to alter the Insurance on the Court-house from £5,000 to £6,000, and that on the Prison from £4,000 to £5,000.

To the Grand Jury of the County of Louth, assembled  
at Summer Assizes, 1866.

GENTLEMEN,

The plans for the extension of the Offices and Grand Jury accommodation in the County Court-house are now ready for your inspection and directions. A presentment was passed unanimously at the County Road Sessions for this purpose.

Applications appear on the Schedule, in the Baronies of Drogheda and Ferrard, for repairing for the first time by County Presentments, an old bye road leading from the south breast of Tullyescar hill to the village of Tullyallen. Any expenditure on this road, unless under the conditions directed at Road Sessions, would, in my judgment, be misapplied.

An application to make 98 perches of Strand Road, between Broghan Bridge and the village of Baltray, in the Barony of Ferrard, appears again on the Schedule. It was passed twice at Road Sessions, and the district would be benefited by the work.

The roads and works of maintenance through the County are generally in a very good state of repair.

## GRAND JURY ORDERS AT SPRING ASSIZES, 1867.

Ordered—That the County Treasurer do pay John Neville, Esq., for making the plans and preparing the estimates for the additions to the County Courthouse, as directed by the Grand Jury at Spring Assizes, 1866, the sum of Twenty-four Pounds Fifteen Shillings and Ninepence stg. out of the balance in hands from the Building of the New County Gaol Funds.

We appoint Lord Louth a Member of the Board of Superintendence of Charitable Establishments, supported by Presentment within this County, in room of the late Lord Bellew (deceased), pursuant to the Act 2 & 3 Wm. 4, chap. 85.

Resolved—That the following be appointed Commissioners, until next Summer Assizes, for the purpose of taking such steps as they may consider prudent, in order to protect the interests of the County in the matter of the proposed change respecting the providing of a Building as a Lunatic Asylum for this County, viz.:

Colonel John M'Clintock. Laurence Waldron, Esq.

Sir John S. Robinson, Bart. Francis Donagh, Esq.

And that the County Solicitor do attend upon the said Commissioners and take such instructions from them as the said Commissioners may think fit to issue at any time.

We approve of and sanction that the preparing of the Books and Copies of the Valuation, for the use of the County Treasurer, be performed by Alexander Shekleton, the Secretary to the Grand Jury, in addition to the applotting of the County Cess thereon, hitherto approved of, being performed by that officer, pursuant to the Act 19 & 20 Victoria, chapter 63, section 5.

Resolved—That James Johnston, the Keeper of Ardee Bridewell, be appointed Keeper of Ardee Quarter Sessions Courthouse upon the terms of the recommendation of the Gaol Board of Superintendence, dated the 7th September, 1866, and at a remuneration of Four Pounds sterling per annum, pursuant to the Act 6 & 7 Wm. 4, chapter 116, section 79. Such appointment to carry with it the Salary for the Half-year now due.

# COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT.

To the Grand Jury of the County of Louth, assembled  
at Spring Assizes, 1867.

GENTLEMEN,

The expenditure on public works, during the past year, was £11204 4s. 11d., and the amount levied £11067 17s. 9d., including the cost of my office. There is a saving of £314 in the amount presented, and a saving of £420 in amount levied, compared with the previous year. The details for each Barony, and for the County under their respective heads, are given in the accompanying Abstracts of Mileage, Rates, and Expenditure. In order to show the progress effected, they are compared with the same items for 1864 and 1865.

The works on the Schedule, with the exception of an application for the town sewers, and for lowering hills in the Barony of Upper Dundalk, are of the usual kind. I shall report on each application, as it is called over, if considered necessary.

The wooden bridge over the Boyne, at King William's Glen, is not in a very safe state, and it suffered from an accumulation of ice after the late frost. I think it would be well to replace it by a stone bridge, the cost of which would be borne equally by this County and the County Meath.

The dues of the harbour of Carlingford are increasing. The expenditure of any money on hands, arising from those dues, for more mooring posts, another dead-man, replacing some masonry, and perhaps night lamps, would now be advisable.

The roads, bridges, and other works generally through the County are in good order, and bore the winter and severe frost very well.

A bill is at present before Parliament for a Railway to cross the most important road perhaps in the Town of Dundalk on a level. I have petitioned against such a crossing as most injurious to the Ratepayers of the Town and the trade of the Quays, both in my capacity of County Surveyor and Town Surveyor. The Town and Harbour Commissioners have also petitioned against such a crossing, and I beg to submit the matter for your consideration.

Also a small balance, arising from the sale of plant, remains in my hands, which I shall hand over to the Treasurer at this Assizes.

## COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT.

To the Grand Jury of the County of Louth, assembled at Summer Assizes, 1867.

GENTLEMEN,

Only one new work of a large amount appears on the Schedule. It is to make 2,550 feet of drains and sewers in the Town of Dundalk at an expense of £1,100, £800 of which it is proposed to levy off the Barony of Upper Dundalk and £300 from off the County at Large, for conveying the sewage of the County prison into the main Town Sewer.

I referred in my report at last Spring to the unsafe state, at that time, of the wooden bridge between this County and the County Meath over the River Boyne at the Obelisk. Since then the timber work fell in, several of the bearing pieces and struts having become quite rotten. The tar covering those timbers made the decay less apparent than it otherwise would have been. If the cost would be borne I would much prefer, as I stated originally to the cess-payers at road sessions, a stone bridge to any other structure.

The County roads and works are in good order with very few exceptions, but the late dry weather caused the pebbles to rise on several roads that were repaired with gravel. In such cases the contractors have been instructed to remove the larger loose pebbles.

Since last Assizes my first assistant resigned, and I promoted the second Assistant to his place. I have also selected from a large number of candidates Mr. P. J. Dodd to fill, with your approval, the vacancy caused by the promotion of the second assistant.
